Warrant for Town Meeting

1. s. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.

4. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.

5. To see if the Town will allow a discount of three per cent. upon all property taxes paid on or before June 1, 1938; of two per cent. upon all property taxes paid on or before July 1, 1938, and of one per cent. upon all property taxes paid on or before August 1, 1938.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of one per cent.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.

9. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of class 2 road, known as the Fourth New Hampshire Turnpike, and raise and appropriate or set

aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,000.00, or will accept State Aid for class 5 roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$622.50.

(Note: No town may receive both class 5 and class 2 aid in the same year.)

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$900.00 plus interest on \$3,600.00 to apply on town debt.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by town through Tax Collector's deeds.

12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway beginning at the William Caswell house on Razor Hill so-called, and leading through the Straw Abutments to State Highway.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42.34 for issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, said appropriation to be disbursed by the Selectmen.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the purpose of filling up and seeding the grave of the first settled Minister of Grafton. The stone also needs repairing and relettering.

15. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00 from the estate of Eulalia I. Martin to be held as a trust fund with so much of the income thereof as may be reasonably necessary to expend for the perpetual care of the burial place of said Eulalia I. Martin and that of her mother, Margaret Powers, with any so unexpended accumulations to be held and applied when necessary to the care of monuments, or markers, and any necessary replacement of the same, or act thereon.

16. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell to the highest bidder old law books now stored at the Town Clerk's office, and use the receipts

therefrom to purchase a safe or build a vault to store valuable town records in.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to paint the Town Hall and reroof the Roller House.

18. To see if the Town will vote to require all school buses to carry liability insurance.

19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to disposing of the hearse and hearse house.


20. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Library has been more fortunate this year, than in years past, in the matter of books. Through the generosity of the Ladies' Benevolent Society fifty-four books were added, for which, the trustees take this op-

portunity of expressing their thanks. Thirty-five books were purchased with our own funds and by fulfilling state requirements we received fifteen State Aid books. At this writing a number of books have just been received which are not included in the above figures.

A large majority of State Aid books and those purchased by the trustees have been non-fiction. This was done for two reasons, first, because the Library was sadly in need of such books, secondly, because books have to be purchased with regards to future value as well as present popularity. The non-fiction books purchased will fulfill the second requirement for some time, so that in the immediate future, more money will be used for popular fiction.

The Trustees plan to have available during the following year, brief forms, by which, readers may be able to list books in which they are interested or would like to have in the library. As far as possible these slips will be used by the trustees as a guide in purchasing new books. We can not guarantee to fill all orders as we have only \$43.00, a third of which must be spent for juvenile books.

Worth while books which have a permanent value will be purchased from time to time with money taken from the Emeline Davis Fund. Such books will bear appropriate markers identifying their donor.

As previously stated, one-third of our appropriation has to be spent for children's books, which at this time, do not constitute one-third of the circulation. In order to vindicate this expenditure, the trustees would like to see more young people making use of the Library.

The Library is a Public institution and its facilities are at the disposal of all townspeople. We would like to see more of them use it.

Inspection in Grafton showed the following defects:

90 pupils were examined.

10 pupils were 10% underweight.

10 pupils showed defective vision, uncorrected.

- 1 pupil showed defective hearing.
- 4 pupils showed a slight degree of anaemia.
- 1 pupil was in a nervous condition.
- 14 pupils were in need of dental care.
- 7 pupils had enlarged or diseased tonsils.
- 4 pupils had enlarged glands.
- 33 visits were made in homes.
- 59 visits were made in schools.

Five eye defects were corrected privately during the school year.

A girl from East Grafton school was taken to Crippled Children's clinic which was held at Memorial Hospital, Concord. Examination and X-ray of affected leg was taken. Taken to Elliott Hospital in Manchester in May for operation; returned in July for treatment.

Girl attending Canaan High school glasses were changed.

Class Room Inspection was held at frequent intervals for symptoms of Communicable diseases.

I wish to express my appreciation to Members of the School Board, Mr. Freese, Local Societies, and to thank the parents and teachers for their daily cooperation in making possible the health program.
