To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, N. H., in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for Old Home Day and make appropriations for the same.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Highway and Bridges and make appropriations for the same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept Class V Aid and make appropriations for the same.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 to Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and make appropriations for the same.
7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote made at Town Meeting in 1933 Article Nine in regard to selling of property acquired through Tax Collector Deeds, which now reads to sell at Public Auction.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$29.00 for the Newfound Lake Region Association in cooperation with other Towns of this section for the

distribution of printed matter and other advertising and make appropriations for the same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$900.00 and the State to give \$900.00 for the widening and straightening of the Charles Sanborn Bridge on the Dugway road and make appropriations for the same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for Hebron Cemetery for repairs and painting of fence, etc., and make appropriations for the same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire or procure land for a Town dump and make appropriations for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to put the Police on a yearly salary and make appropriations for the same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$50.00 for a new oil heater for the Selectmen's office and make appropriations for the same.

14. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue such sections of the Mayhew Turnpike, so called, are outside of the newly constructed 66 foot State and Federal highway.

15. To hear the report of the committee on the ownership of the Town Hall and Church Building and make any resolutions and transact any business pertaining to the same.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
