

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jackson, in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Jackson on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to secure State Aid Construction of highways.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the reduction of debt.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 3% on taxes paid before June 15th, and a discount of 2% if paid before July 15th.
- To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chap. 99, Sec. 22, Laws of 1933.
- To see what action the Town will take relative to the purchase of snow removal equipment, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a light truck for the highway department, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 for improving turns on Thorn Mountain road, for snow removal and raise and appropriate money for same.

 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.00 for reducing grades on Iron Mountain road, for snow removal,

and raise and appropriate money for same.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$700.00 for reducing grades and widening road between Richard Howard's and John Ballentine's and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To act on any other business that may legally

come before said meeting.

The Library has been open 116 days, from July to October 1. The hours were from 10 a. m. to 1 p. m. daily; and for the remaining months from 2 to 4 every Saturday. In this time the total number of books given out was 3,419.

There has been added to the Library, by gifts, four volumes, and by purchase, 49 volumes, making a total number of volumes in the Library 4,100. To the School Board of Jackson:

We have enjoyed a very successful school year under the direction of the same teachers whom we employed last year. Salaries were reduced ten per cent. this year. These reductions were made from a level already low for the kind of service demanded and expected. Salaries certainly should not be set too low to secure competent teachers.

Five pupils have attended the high school at Bartlett and their tuition is a charge upon the district. Three of these will probably attend next year.

While there is little need of a truant officer, I believe one should be appointed in order to prevent delay in investigating causes of a absence.

The results of medical inspection show many defects which might be remedied. We should have much more remedial work done if we had a school nurse to go into the homes and bring these matters to the attention of the parents.




