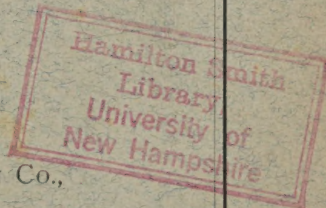

SCHOOL REPORT.

We take pleasure in again announcing to the people of the district, that the schools are, as a whole, in a prosperous condition, that the school work has been carried on without special hindrance, and all the teachers have been in a measure successful. Some have merited particular mention for securing good order, diligence and thoroughness in study. We find, however, that not every one, armed with a diploma from some Normal school or other celebrated institution of learning, is qualified to discipline and teach a school successfully. There can be no greater error than to suppose that our schools can be benefited by a frequent change of teachers. It can only be so when a poor one has been employed.

Good teachers are hard to obtain, and when a teacher is found to be successful, she should be retained so long as possible. One great trouble with teachers is that they do not fit themselves for work as they should. Many attend the common schools until about sixteen years of age, and then think they are able to enter the field in competition with those who have spent years and a considerable amount of money in preparation for their work.

Many people think these young, inexperienced girls should have the same pay as experienced teachers, and think that they can do as good work in the school room. If parents would have their girls spend more time in preparation, they would make more money in the end and we would have better schools as a result.

Teachers should avail themselves of every opportunity for improvement, and if possible attend some good training school. Especially the younger teachers, and those who intend to teach, see to this. It is true that some have attained a high degree of success by their own exertions, but this does not prove that all can do so, or that special training is of no advantage. A normal school cannot supply the requisite faculty to teach or govern, but a knowledge of normal methods and the science of teaching is likely to make even a good teacher a better one. 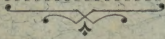
