## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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TO THE SCHOOL BOARD AND CITIZENS OF MADBURY:—

Changes in teachers in the Madbury schools have been necessary, and new teachers have been secured. Miss Langly, who has served in the North Madbury school decided that it would be best for her to change, and Miss Madeline Waegeneere was secured to take her place. Miss Waegeneere is a graduate of Keene Normal School, and has entered into the work with all her heart, and the school is doing its work faithfully.

Mrs. Carter lost her son by an unfortunate accident, and owing to the shock, decided that she could not go on with the work, and Miss Minnie E. Gerry was chosen to take charge of the school. Miss Gerry is a graduate of the Portsmouth Training School, and had one year's successful experience prior to taking this school.

Both of the school houses have been painted, and a new ceiling has been put on the Center School.

There were 9 days lost in North Madbury, and 8 days in Madbury Center by reason of holidays, bad weather and other causes. This is much better than the report for three years ago. But this is too much time lost. There were 96 cases of tardiness in the Center School, and 6 in North Madbury. I again urge the parents to cooperate in teaching their children to cultivate this most important habit of punctuality.

But one pupil, Madelena Viola, had a perfect attendance for the year. Good for you, Madelena, you have shown

one of the important habits necessary for success in life, being enough interested in your job to be on hand when you are expected. I hope others in Madbury may get this habit.

The school nurse reports that all of the children have been examined, as required by law. Miss Marden has also made a number of visits to the homes of the children, to consult with the parents and help to get the children into proper shape to attend school.

# HISTORICAL MEMORANDA

## Madbury Town Officers

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The following copy of list of town officers of Madbury, is a part of the Historical Memoranda published in Book form, compiled by Alonzo H. Quint, D. D., and edited by John Scales, Vol. 1, 1890. It was republished in the "Dover Enquirer" several years ago from which this clipping found its way to the Office of the present Town Clerk who passes it on to the inhabitants of the town. It shows the names of the people residing in "the westerly side of Dover," so called. At the time Dover was set off as a Parish in 1755, many of those houses built even prior to this time, are still standing, and occupied by descendants.

Several of the men who filled these offices for the first time in the Parish of Madbury, had already held and were still holding office of Selectmen, etc., in the town of Dover. Madbury was fully made a township by an Act passed May 26, 1768.
