5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$287.00 for printing the Town Reports.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money for the Strafford County Tax.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money to install and operate street lights on the road at Sunrise Lake Town Beach.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for increases in Town Officers Salaries.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00—\$500.00 to be paid in 1960, and a like amount to be paid in 1961—to have the State Tax Commission revalue the property assessments in the town.

11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town bills in anticipation of taxes.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
