MARCH 2002

The polls will open from 11.00 A.M. to 7.00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Richmond, in the County of Cheshire in said state,
Qualified to vote in Town Affairs;

You are hear by notified to meet at the Veterans Memorial Hall in said Richmond on
Tuesday the 12th of March, next at 11:00 A.M. of the clock in the morning to act upon the
following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2 To vote by ballot to accept the 2002 revision to the Richmond Zoning Ordinance as
proposed by the Richmond Planning Board in accordance with the statutes of the State of New
Hampshire.

Amend the ordinance as follows:

**Proposed Article 7
Aquifer Protection District**

- 701 **Purpose:** The purpose of this section is in the interest of public health, safety, and general
welfare, to protect, preserve and maintain existing groundwater supply and groundwater
recharge areas within the known stratified drift aquifer from adverse development, land use,
practices of depletion of water, and to allow for restoration of degraded groundwater supplies
by establishing an Aquifer Protection District.
- 702 **Location:** 200 feet beyond the area defied by the D.E.S. map of water resources and point
pollution sources (November 23, 1999 NHDES-WSEB).

District Boundaries – when the boundary of the Aquifer Protection District is in dispute by
any owner or abutters actually affected by said boundary, the Planning Board, at the
owners/abutters request and expense, may engage a professional geologist or hydrologist to
determine more accurately the precise boundary of the Aquifer Protection District within the
properties affected.

The Planning Board may, based upon appropriate findings and evidence, adjust the
boundary or area designation of the Aquifer Protection District or reduce or expand the
designation area to more correctly define the location and the extent of the aquifer on a
site-specific, case by case basis.

- 703 Lot Size:** The minimum lot size is six acres and the minimum frontage on a class V road or an approved subdivision road, is 350 feet for a single-family dwelling. All other lot and yard requirements of Article 4 of this ordinance apply. These requirements do not apply to lots of record prior to March 14, 2000. Two family and multiple family dwellings are not permitted after the effective date of this amendment. Cluster development is not permitted after the effective date of this amendment.
- 704 Uses not permitted:** Junk yards; automobile services; salt storage; disposal of snow removed from roads and parking lots; solid waste disposal; hazardous waste or toxic waste disposal; mining; uses such as dry cleaning or machine shops (which use hazardous or toxic materials); storage of chemicals and materials that are greater than required for individual household use; and human burial. Uses that were approved by the Richmond Zoning Board of Adjustment prior to January 8, 2002 are permitted and are subject to semiannual inspection to ensure compliance with applicable State law. Solid waste disposal, hazardous waste disposal, mining, salt storage and disposal of snow removed from roads and parking lots is not permitted regardless of any prior approval.
- 705 Fuel Storage:** Existing steel underground fuel storage tanks, except gaseous fuel tanks, must be removed when they reach an age of ten years. Existing underground tanks over ten years old must be removed within two years of the effective date of this amendment. New or replacement tanks must be indoors or sheltered, visible, and placed on a concrete surface with a berm capable of containing an amount of fuel equal to the capacity of the tank. Above ground outdoor tanks must be placed under shelter within one year of the effective date of this amendment. Existing tanks, indoors or outdoors, on a dirt surface, must be placed on a concrete surface with a berm capable of containing an amount of fuel equal to the capacity of the tank within two years of the effective date of this amendment. Storage of fuels that are gaseous, at a pressure of 15 pounds per square inch, are permitted in underground or exposed tanks.
- 706 Agricultural Use:** Agricultural practices must conform to the State of New Hampshire Best Management Practice for Underground Protection from Pesticides and the State of New Hampshire Best Management Practices for Agriculture in New Hampshire for the Handling of Agricultural Compost, Fertilizer and Manure.
- 707 Gravel:** Removal of gravel is not permitted at a depth no closer than six feet above the water table. Yearly certification (by someone licensed by State of NH to certify location of water table) by the property owner that the six-foot limit has not been exceeded is required.
- 708 Underground Sewage Disposal:** New and replacement leach fields must be located at a depth of no closer than six feet above the water table.
- 709 Recharge Sources:** Rice Brook, its tributaries, and any other body of water not now identified, that feeds the aquifer shall conform to Article 6 (Wetlands Conservation District) except the District shall be 100 feet, as measured horizontally, from the high water mark.

Definitions:

Solid Waste Any discarded or abandoned material including refuse, putrescible material, septage, or sludge, as defined by New Hampshire Waste Rules. Solid waste includes solid, semisolid, liquid or gaseous waste material

Aquifer A geological formation or part of a formation that is capable of yielding quantities of groundwater usable for municipal or public water supplies.

Toxic or Hazardous Waste or Materials: Solid, semisolid, liquid or gaseous wastes or any combination of these wastes which, because of either quantity, or concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics, may cause or contribute to an increase in irreversible or incapacitating reversible illness or pose a present or potential threat to human health or the environment when improperly treated, stored disposed of or otherwise mismanaged; or that which has been identified as a "toxic or hazardous waste" under Federal or State law or Administrative Rule. Such wastes include, but are not limited to those which are toxic, corrosive, ignitable, reactive irritants, strong sensitizers or which generate pressure through decomposition, heat or other means.

Proposed Richmond Zoning Ordinance Amendments

- 101i **Add:** To encourage the preservation of agricultural lands and buildings
- 202 **Add:** E. Aquifer Protection District
- 202.1 **Add:** E. Aquifer Protection District (Article 7) 200 feet beyond the area defined by the D.E.S. map of water resources and point pollution sources (Nov. 23, 1999 NHDES-WSEB).
- 309 **Add:** Steeples may exceed the 35-foot height limit provided that a zone with a radius equal to 1.5 times the steeple height shall be free of any buildings other than the one it is attached to and is provided on the lot occupied by the structure. Any floor space within the steeple must not be accessible from inside the building.
- 401.6 **Add:** and Houses of Worship
- 402.2 **Add:** Except septic systems and wells, which must be 37-1/2 feet from an abutter's property line and 83 feet from the centerline of the road.
- 502.2 **Add:** Except septic systems and wells, which must be 37-1/2 feet from an abutter's property line and 83 feet from the centerline of the road.
- 601 **Add:** In addition to areas shown in the Town of Richmond Conservation District Map any other wetlands identified by a surveyor, soil scientist, engineer, the Conservation Commission or the Planning Board are included in the Wetlands Conservation District.
- 605 **Add:** In determining permissible wetlands all uplands must be contiguous and must constitute at least 50% of the minimum lot size area.

- 9031f **Add:** "or variances" after special exceptions.
- 1001.1 **Add:** "or uses for houses of worship" after manufacturing, or commercial use.
- 1001.3(4) **Replace with:** Granting the variance must not be contrary to the public interest.
- 1001.4 **Replace with:** Appeals from administrative decisions – The Board may hear and decide cases where a claim is made that an administrative officer has incorrectly interpreted the terms of this Zoning Ordinance. This authority applies to alleged incorrect interpretation of the Zoning ordinance by the Planning Board. The authority does not apply to decision on whether or not to enforce the ordinance.
- 1001.5 **Add:** Approve equitable waivers of dimensional requirements.
- Add:** Fees – The Zoning Board of Adjustment may impose reasonable fees upon an applicant for the expenses of consultant services or investigative studies, review of documents and other such matters that may be required by a particular application. Any such fees shall be subject to the provisions on RSA673: 1

RICHMOND TOWN MEETING RESULTS

March 13, 2001

The moderator announced that the Richmond Rescue Squad had baked goods for sale. He said that the polls would be kept open for those who have not had a chance to vote. In addition he stated that once articles are acted upon they would not be allowed back on the floor. A recent change in RSAs affects the wording of our articles. It is no longer necessary to use the wording "or take any action thereon" in warrant articles for them to be amendable. In the future the phrase will probably be dropped.

Passed

42. The Town was asked to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to add to the Expendable General Fund Trust Fund, Established 1999, Article 42, under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, known as the Municipal Building Fund, for the purpose of building a new municipal building(s). An amendment was made to raise and appropriate \$12,000 with \$7,000 to be withdrawn from the General Fund. Amendment Passed. Article as amended Passed.

Tax Collector's Report for 2001

When reading the financial tax figures for 2001 remember that this is an end of year report (as of December 31, 2001) – which does not include the second Property Tax issue billing for 2001.

The big event of the year has to be the late issue of the second half Property tax bill. This was caused by the sudden "retirement" of our property assessor, making it impossible to set a tax rate for the town properties. The final billing for 2001 was issued February 13, 2002.

Our property taxes increased 5.26 percent in 2001 – this is a result in a 15% increase in school taxes, as both the town and county governments share decreased.

2001 SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year started out very quietly. In January, we met with the Winchester Board of Selectmen to sign the new solid waste contract. February brought the finalization of the budget and preparation for the town report and town meeting.

In March, Ed Campbell, who had served as Selectman for 9 years and was Chairman, chose not to run for re-election, which meant a change in the board as a whole. Art Amato was elected to serve for three years.

The 2000 Census showed an increase in our population to 1077. This meant that there was an increase in our share in the Solid Waste District with Winchester. It also means that there will be increases in other services that are charged by population.

Some maintenance was done to our town buildings. The most significant accomplishment being the installation of the handicap ramp at the Town Hall.

Camp Takodah, and the Cheshire County YMCA, again gave the town two camperships. This year the topic for the essay was "Why I want to go to camp and three ways to keep Richmond beautiful and why that is important." The winners were Jessica Smith and Chad Balcom. They both enjoyed two week at Camp Takodah.

Our Police Department took a lot of time and energy. There were many concerns and issues that we addressed throughout the year. The new cruiser was purchased, outfitted and put into use. The old cruiser was then fixed up and repainted.

Only 42 building permits were issued in 2001. There were 6 additions; 11 garage/barns; 4 new homes; 11 sheds; 7 deck/porches; and 3 other building projects.

With the Planning Board, a settlement was reached in the Blessed Sacrament Subdivision. This was signed on August 27, 2001.

The tragic events of September 11th seemed to have little effect on our quiet country town. If anything, we became more aware of what really matters to us.

Because of a problem in locating the town assessor, year-end taxation was put off until 2002. We were extremely fortunate that no money needed to be borrowed to pay the bills. As a result of many years of responsible fiscal handling of the town's money, we are in good shape.

As we look forward, we see the celebration of the 250th Birthday of our Town. The 250 Commission has worked hard to set up a year full of fun things to do together. We hope that we will all come together in the spirit of friendship to make this year a very special and productive one. Thank you to all of the many volunteers and town employees who make this town what it is.

WINCHESTER SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT REPORT

Total volume of Municipal Solid Waste, (M.S.W./ Household Rubbish), rose significantly again this year and at the same time recyclables declined slightly. The following is a list of categories and weights that were trucked off site.

We also accept compost and untreated or painted wood, brush or slash-less than 5" in diameter, in our Burn Pit area.

Final disposal of the Municipal Solid Waste and Construction and Demolition is Turnkey Land Fill in Rochester, NH. The recyclables go to the Keene Transfer Station.

Winchester and Richmond Selectmen have executed a new three (3) year contract with Waste Management Inc. The old five (5) year agreement that expired on September 30, 2001, was a great deal for the taxpayers. But now we face the real world. Significant increases will be seen because of higher labor costs, transportation costs and tipping fees at the final disposal site. The last five (5) years have seen final disposal costs of M.S.W. go from \$45 to \$50 per ton to \$95 to \$100 per ton. In the new contract all parties shall meet in July of each year to review costs and determine if an increase or decrease is appropriate for the ensuing year. **Decrease???** Language in the new agreement includes implementation of program(s) by the district, which will result in a decrease in the amount of waste to be disposed of by Waste Management. What does this mean to you the taxpayer? More costs if we continue as we are right now. One way to reduce costs would be to "Pay as you throw", pay per bag. This would force more recycling and reduce the amount of M.S.W. by 20% to 30%. **Your input is welcome.**

Winchester and Richmond share the cost of the operating budget based on the population of their towns. The population figures are supplied by the NH Office Of State Planning. This year Winchester pays 81% and Richmond 19%.

SAMARITANS

Dear Friends,

The Samaritans is a local nonprofit organization, whose mission is to reduce the incidence and impact of suicide within the Monadnock Region. We currently have offices in Keene and Peterborough. We achieve this mission through the operation of a 24-hour hotline, a teen hotline, community education programs and support groups.

In spite of the fact that suicide is the eighth leading cause of death in the United States, there is no state or federal funding for suicide prevention centers. We are an agency supported by the Monadnock United Way, but continue to rely on other funding sources. Due to the anonymous and confidential nature of our services, we do not charge a fee for the work that we do.

In 2000, we served almost 10,000 individuals. Our callers are not required to provide specific demographic information, but it is clear that 90% of our calls are from towns in the Monadnock Region. We are aware that town finances are limited, but it is our belief that our programs provide the opportunity to reduce town costs for emergency services. Our hotline reduces potential crisis situations by breaking through barriers of suicide risk factors. Those may include reducing isolation and loneliness, increasing support systems and providing referrals for treatment of depression.

We would greatly appreciate being considered for a funding amount of \$250 to continue our life saving efforts. This amount would be applied toward direct care services, specifically telephone costs, as well as rent to house our hotline. Please feel free to contact me with any further questions, or to allow me the opportunity to present our request at an appropriate town meeting.

We would also like to offer our services to speak to any town organizations such as police, fire and rescue to discuss "first responder" issues related to suicidal situations. Please contact me at the business office if you are interested. Thank you for your time and consideration.

2001 Trustees of Trust Funds Town Report

Last year we realized an overall 6.8% return on invested funds. This was due to two factors. The first being that most of the Town Trust Funds were transferred into the New Hampshire Public Deposit Investment Pool from various CD's and Savings Bank accounts where they were lodged and accruing interest at between 2% and 4%. The other factor was that overall interest rates were relatively good last year. This year however as everyone knows the interest rates across the board have plummeted and investments in general are not doing so well. It is possible to invest town funds in places where the State RSA allows but these are areas with a higher risk factor. We have decided not to do this and "ride out the storm" of low interest rates. Consequently, the return overall this year averaged only 2.8% as opposed to 6.8% last year.

Last year at town meeting we were instructed to transfer the balance of the funds from the Vet's Hall Furnace Fund and the Town Hall Insulation Fund into the general town fund. Seven thousand dollars of that money was to go into the Municipal building fund. That was not done as of the close of the calendar year but has been done before the Town meeting. Those two funds are no longer in existence, but they still appear in this report because the State requires us to file as of December 31 of the calendar year.

The board welcomed a new member this year to replace Bill Hatch who resigned after he moved out of Richmond. Bill had served the town very well for many years. His departure from the board was sudden and he is missed. Dick Webber graciously offered to serve as a trustee and now the three of us, Shirley Heisse, myself, and Dick wish to thank the Town for placing their confidence in us, and we hope that we will be able to continue to be of assistance in this capacity.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT 2001

This past year was very active for Emergency Management. Emergency Management had two graded exercises for the Vermont Yankee nuclear power plant in 2001. The first exercise in late spring was a preliminary for the federally graded exercise in September. The Town scored very well on both exercise with very few deficiencies being found. It is a tribute to the preparation, cooperation, and professionalism of the Town departments (Fire, Rescue, Police, Selectmen, and Emergency Management) that the tests run so smoothly.

Usage of the CD building by Town organizations continues to grow. It is truly a great space for Town committees to meet and conduct their business. This year, the CD building finally had a working restroom facility completed. The Selectmen are to be thanked for seeing that job through. Parking is now becoming an issue with the increased usage of the building and the proposed carport for the Police cruiser. Overlapping usage of the parking facilities when there is a need for Fire or Rescue to respond to an incident has become an issue. Though this is rare, it is still an issue with some. Additional paving adjacent to the Fire/Police station may be necessary to alleviate some of these problems.

We project that in 2002 we will have to repaint the CD building and do some roof repair.

I would like to thank and recognize all the people that worked so hard on behalf of the Town to make the Vermont Yankee exercises run so smoothly. I am confident that the Town has a workable Radiological Response Plan in place to deal with incidents that may occur at the power plant.

Road Agent Report Year Ending 2001

Despite the amount of snow there was still activity on the roads early this the year. A new house was scheduled to arrive February 24th on Lang Road. We were out on the roads on March 3rd with 4 feet of snow. On March 19th the roads were closed for Mud Season. A storm of rain and snow on the 22nd had us out turning water and cutting trees. A new house for Bullock Road arrived on March 28th. As April arrived we were turning water and hauling gravel to fill potholes. On April 30th we were finally able to begin grading roads. Our 6 Ton delivery of calcium for dust control arrived on May 21st. By June 7th it was put out on Whipple, Bullock, Fay Martin, Tully, Morgan and Pond Woods Road. Near the end of June we were widening Whipple Hill Road in preparation for paving. In July 1196 cubic yards of gravel was put out on Lang, Whipple Hill and Morgan Road. Paving on Whipple Hill Road extending the existing pavement was done on July 30th by Lane Construction Company using 500 tons of asphalt. In August the bridge stringers were scraped and painted on the Fay Martin Road Bridge. September brought still more problems with Beavers on Turnpike and Tully Brook Road. Winter Bids for the 2002 season were opened on October 1st. Dan Firmin was awarded the East side of Rt#32 for a bid of \$23,000.00. Buddy Blood was awarded the West side of Rt#32 for a bid of \$24,000.00. Brush was cut on most roads throughout the year.

2001 CONSERVATION COMMISSION ANNUAL REPORT

The Commission held its regular, special and fieldwork sessions throughout the year.

Progress has continued on the development of a Conservation Easement for the Bennett Town Forest. Deed research on the various parcels that make up the 300 +/- acre forest and a change of personnel within the Monadnock Conservancy whom will administer the easement, temporarily delayed the anticipated completion of the process. We remain committed however, to complete this important initiative in the near future.

Jeff Porter, Senior planner with Southwest Region Planning Commission, made a presentation to the Commission regarding the benefits of creating a Municipal Natural Resources Inventory. Such an inventory would assist the Commission in identifying natural or cultural resources that may require some form of protection from future, potential, careless land use activities. The Commission will be reviewing the procedure and requirements to implement an inventory during future work sessions.

Per invitation of the Planning Board, the Conservation Commission met jointly to discuss updating the Town's Master Plan including establishing an Aquifer Protection District. Notwithstanding the importance of protecting Richmond's groundwater, the Commission felt there were too many technical and scientific issues that must be thoroughly studied before land use restrictions could be supported by the Commission as an article on the 2002 Town Meeting Warrant.

We remain committed to protecting Richmond's Natural Resources and welcome input and opportunities to work with individual town residents and agencies regarding our resources.

The Conservation Commission meets at 7pm the first Thursday of every month at the Civil Defense Building unless otherwise posted.

AGENCY NAME: The Community Kitchen, Inc

DATE: October 15, 2001

1. Briefly describe the role of the agency:

The Community Kitchen, Inc., is a not-for-profit, direct service agency, which provides hot meals, take home boxes containing food and personal care items, information and advocacy to low and moderate income men, women and families with children in the Cheshire County, NH area. Since it's founding in 1983, the Kitchen has served and/or distributed over 5,250,000 meals, at no charge, but with donations welcome, to people in need.

2. Identify the services that Town funding will provide.

The Pantry Box Program operates out of a space in our building on Mechanic Street. Each box provides approximately three days' worth of meals for each family member. Computerized and handwritten records are kept of family names, number of people, street addresses, dates of receiving each box, income and age. Each family or individual coming in for the first time must fill out a form required by the USDA, and provide back-up documentation for all of the above information. Many referrals have been made to this program from Town and City Welfare offices, school nurses and other agencies. Almost 80% of the food for this program is donated, and over 1,000 volunteer hours each month are worked by community members to ensure the success of the program. Take-home boxes of food are available on Wednesdays from 12:30 pm to 5:30 pm and on Thursdays from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, or by special arrangement.

Hot meals are served Monday through Friday from 5:00 to 6:30 pm at our Mechanic Street location. Meals are prepared by a volunteer staff under the supervision of the Hot Meals Coordinator. Menus are planned after donated food is picked up at bakeries, delicatessens, supermarkets and restaurants. Meals consist of two or more entrees, salads, vegetables, fruit, bread, soup, desserts and beverages, and are served by volunteers. Guests/participants make up over 35% of our volunteer crew and help primarily with set-up and clean up. We are not requesting any funding from your town for our Hot Meal program, but thought you might want to know about it.

Traditionally, The Community Kitchen experiences a tremendous increase in both the number of families served and the number of meals distributed in November and December, due to Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, cold weather and fuel bills. It is anticipated that at the end of the year over 28,000 pantry boxes will have been distributed in total.

The amount of reimbursement we have requested is based on the actual number for the first three quarters of the year and an estimate of the fourth quarter added together.

Additionally, please note that the Richmond Food Pantry receives approximately 30 - 60 complete Thanksgiving and Christmas boxes from the Monadnock Food Coalition, which is coordinated by The Community Kitchen.

Richmond Police Department

The Richmond Police Department is dedicated to providing fair and professional law enforcement service to the citizens of Richmond and its visitors. The officers covered 1281 calls for service up from 885 for the year 2000. There were 121 cases drawn which include investigations, arrests and accidents up from 80 in the year 2000. In 2001 there were 44 accidents up from 27 the previous year. There were 124 warnings and 74 summonses issued in 2001 compared to 92 warnings and 70 summonses in 2000. Many hours were put into case investigations and court prosecutions hoping to decrease criminal activity within the town. We attempted to schedule hours of patrol that would best suit the needs of the town. Our 2001 Chevrolet Tahoe 4x4 was ordered after the town meeting in March. The Tahoe was equipped and put into full service at the end of August. This piece of equipment has already become a valuable asset to the department, assisting in searching for a stolen vehicle off the Royalston Falls Road as well as providing a safer vehicle during adverse weather conditions.

As incidents in our great nation and around the world change the way that all of us view security, I urge all of you to make sure you lock your homes and vehicles. Be conscious of your surroundings and never hesitate to report suspicious activities and people to law enforcement. Many times these incidents go unreported because you may feel that you are wasting our time with trivial information but your small piece of information may be just what is needed.

We would like to take a time to thank the citizens of Richmond and its dedicated employees for all their assistance this year. The New Hampshire State Police, the Swanzey Police, the Fitzwilliam Police, the Winchester Police and the Keene Police have been very helpful with assisting on incidents, motor vehicle accidents and case investigations. It is a relief to know that we have so many dedicated professionals willing to go above and beyond to assist us. Most importantly, I want to thank Margaret Wyman, our Green Thumb grant employee and Officer Mark LaBelle for all their hard work.
