## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Rumney Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its high-ways and bridges.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common and the daily raising and lowering of the flag.
8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.
9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the LaMott-Kenneson Post No. 76, American Legion for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.
10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.



11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$288.81 to secure from the State \$1,925.41 to be expended for Town Road Aid.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow a sum of money sufficient for the purchase of a new truck for the Town Highway Department and to authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade in the Dodge Truck.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow a sum of money sufficient for the purchase of a new Road Grader for the Town Highway Department and to authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade in the F. W. D. Truck.

14. To see if the Town will vote to paint the West Rumney River Bridge and to raise and appropriate or borrow money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to paint and repair the interior of the Town Hall and raise and appropriate money for the same.

16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in co-operation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards the operation of the Sceva Speare Memorial Hospital in Plymouth, N. H.

18. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to Civil Defense and raise and appropriate money for the same.

19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Legal Advice.

20. To see if the Town will vote to convey the property described in warranty deed of O. E. Simpson and Georgia A. Simpson to the town of Rumney dated September 9, 1893, recorded in Grafton County Registry of Deeds book 417, page 474 to the Rumney School District and authorize the Selectmen to execute a deed to said property.

21. To see what disposition the Town will make of the six hundred dollars (\$600.00) raised at the 1956 March meeting for tarring on the T. R. A. road at Stinson Lake which remains unexpended, or raise and appropriate an additional amount of money for the same purpose.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its tax collector's sales.

23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

24. To see if the Town will vote to allow a two per cent discount on all taxes paid within fifteen days after presentation of bills.

25. Shall the provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to the playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.

26. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The most successful town dumps are supervised — regular days provided for their use and inflammable material consistently burned. The town dump which receives no attention, where waste material is scattered about without supervision of any description, soon becomes a community menace and a liability rather than an asset.

Many people still burn debris around their homes. A large number of such fires get out of control causing unnecessary damage and expense to the burner. Why burn at home? Make use of your town dump and eliminate the hazard of burning. It will be easier for you — personally and financially.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OF RUMNEY

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Hereby submitted is my report as your Superintendent of Schools.

As this report is being written preparations are being made to move into your new school. It seemingly has been a long time in construction but conditions brought about by shortages and situations beyond the control of anyone generally slowed construction more than anticipated. You are to be congratulated upon the completion of a modern educational plant where your children can grow and learn.

The teaching staff in Rumney did not change this past year and Mrs. Fisher, the school nurse, is continuing her duties in that capacity. However, Mr. Malfa, the music supervisor, resigned to accept a position nearer Boston and Mrs. Arlene Wilson accepted the position. Mrs. Wilson has wide experience as music supervisor in New Jersey and is, in my opinion, one of the best qualified and capable people in the field of music education with whom it has been my pleasure to work.

From the standpoint of curriculum the Rumney Schools are now in excellent condition. New supplementary reading materials have been installed in grades 1 through 6 and with the addition of a newer social studies book that more nearly meets the needs prescribed in the recently released New Hampshire Social Studies Guide, textbooks will no longer be any problem.

This year for the first time a folder where the test records and other pupil data is maintained, is being kept on each pupil which should greatly aid present

and future teachers of your children in better understanding them. Our present testing schedule, which appears to be adequate, allows for two batteries of achievement tests yearly (in the fall and spring) to all pupils; a readiness test early in the first grade plus mental ability tests in grades 1, 3, 5, and 7. Thus by the end of the eighth grade we have a rather comprehensive pattern of each child's achievement and mental ability.

It has been a pleasure to serve you this past year. Do not hesitate to contact me if problems of an educational nature arise with which I can be of assistance.

## EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent as per the following quotation:

“REPORTS. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report showing the total salary paid to the superintendent, which report shall show in detail the amount derived from the per capita tax and the amount paid directly by each school district in the union.”

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30th. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union No. 48 during 1955-1956 received a salary of \$6050 which was made up as follows: \$2500 paid from the per capita tax and \$3500 pro-rated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$850 for travel within the union was also pro-rated as stated above.

The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district.

This, plus \$850 travel allowance allocated as indicated above, totals \$6900—amount received from State Treasurer for salary and travel of the Superintendent of Schools.

## THE MUSIC PROGRAM IN RUMNEY

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This program is planned with two major purposes in mind: first, to have each child enjoy music and second, to have children increase their knowledge in order to develop a better understanding and appreciation of good music.

Songs are selected from traditional, classic, and modern folk and art songs. Through this material we develop good tone quality, better sense of rhythm, ability to read music, and knowledge of composers. Wherever possible, music is integrated with other subjects.

In developing better rhythm, the lower grades start with rhythm band, singing games and simple steps such as marching, skipping, sliding and galloping. As the children progress these simple steps become more intricate and are combined to make a dance. The dancing is limited to square and folk dances of this and other countries which are a part of our musical heritage.

The listening program at the present time is limited because of the lack of good recordings. The children learn to listen for enjoyment of the entire selection, themes, rhythmic patterns, instruments, harmonies and mood.
