THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affiairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court.
 - (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Town Dump.
 - (i) Vital Statistics.
 - (j) General Expense Highway Department.
 - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (l) Interest on bonds.
 - (m) County Tax.
 - (n) Payment on bonds.
 - (o) Payment on Long Term Note.

- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand one hundred ninety dollars (\$1,190.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police department.
 - (b) Fire department.
 - (c) Sewer department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of at a public auction any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to

the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and advertising and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages for the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountain Region.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to soil the bulldozer blade.
- 15. To raise the sum of \$600.00 for water pump and hose for fire protection at Diamond Ponds.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to exempt the property of the North Star Grange from taxation, said property having been reclaimed from the State Grange and incorporated.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan ballot.

To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following Town Officers:

- (a) Town Clerk.
- (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
- (c) Town treasurer.
- (d) Three road agents
- (e) One or more Auditors.
- (f) Collector of Diamond Pond rent.
- (g) One or more Sextons.
- (h) Overseer of poor.
- (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
- (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to place fire insurance on the North Hill and Bear Rock Schools and raise and appropriate money necessary for payment of the same.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to accept, for playground purposes, a tract of land immediately adjoining the present site of the Cedar Brook School
- 12. If the preceding article is adopted, to see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate to improve and equip said tract of land for playground use.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

Foreword

If we stop for a moment to look into the future, during these days of increasing uncertainty, we have reason for grave concern. At first we may be a bit prone to think of expenses. With the cost of living steadily rising, accompanied with the parallel raises in salaries in all types of work generally, overall increases in school operational costs can be expected. Add to this general contributing factor those in our schools of even larger enrollments, still higher tuition rates, an alarming scarcity of elementary teachers, continued expansion and improvement to provide more adequate facilities and equipment, and no state aid in some cases, the necessity of increases in the school budget becomes apparent.

As has been pointed out in previous reports, however, the matter of primary concern to us is the extent to which we are providing a training which will help our boys and girls to meet the perplexing situations, and solve more adequately the difficult problems in future life. This means that as the boy or girl progresses through the work in the successive grades in his or her school life, it is highly important that opportunities be provided for him or her to apply the acute yearly, to be able to keep all of our veteran facts, and concepts leraned. In this way only can that understanding, self reliance and basically sound judgment be developed, which will ultimately result in a philosophy of life of thought and action which will help to make this a better world in which to live.

Teachers

We are extremely fortunate, at this time when the

shortage of elementary teachers is becoming more acute yearly, to be able to keep all of our veteran workers. Doris J. Chappell and Harriet O. Gray are again at the Cedar Brook and Hollow Schools respectively. The staff at the West Stewartstown School consists of Velma H. Gray, Principal, Mae T. Drew, Junie S. Aldrich, and Cleora M. Richardson.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget and requested appropriation for 1951-52 is \$33,722.00 as compared to \$33.458.00 for this year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$3,278.00 which leaves a balance of \$30,444.00 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$30,405.00 for the current year. An examination of the budget breakdown found on subsequent pages in this report will indicate that, although it has been necessary to increase the amounts for transportation, tuition, and retirement in particular, the decrease in the total for teachers' salaries is substantially less and offsets these increases.

Buildings and **Equipment**

The policy of keeping the buildings in a good state of maintenance has been continued this past year. During the summer vacation work at the Cedar Brook School included the shingling of the front side of the roof and the redecorating of the classroom. The 7th and 8th grade room at West Stewartstown, also, was redecorated, and minor repairs including the varnishing of all desk tops were made in all school buildings presently used.

Extensive damage caused by the wind storm of this last fall to the North Hill School Building will make it necessary to do considerable repair work on it this summer to keep it in a good state of preservation.

Enrollment and Attendance

At the present time a total of 102 pupils are en-

rolled in our schools. Of this number 64 are at West Stewartstown while 15 and 23 are at Cedar Brook and the Hollow Schools respectively. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year in the same order as listed was 95.06, 96.05, and 93.39 while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the same period was .84, .17, and .09.

Tuition Pupils

At the time of this writing 41 pupils are attending schools outside the district. Of this number 22 are at Canaan High School and 19 at Colebrook Academy. This is a total increase of 7 tuition pupils over last year's 34 taking secondary work. In keeping with this present day trend, it is anticipated that an even larger number may be enrolled in high schools next year.

Legislation

To date the main educational bills have not come up for consideration by our legislative body presently in session. On the basis of the proposed formula for the distribution of state aid, if any is voted, and the equalized valuation of our school district, the indications are that there will be little change in the amount now received.

Conclusion

In light of the present world situations, and of what may be found over the horizon just ahead, the obligation of our schools to do everything possible to help our boys and girls to effectively meet these conditions becomes paramount.

Again I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the cooperation received in our work together to maintain high standards in our schools.
