

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

I submit herewith my fifth annual report as Superintendent of Schools of Stoddard.

A good school gives not only mental training, physical development and righteous morals, but also good habits.

Statistics generally afford dry reading, but they are often suggestive and illuminating if carefully studied. Consulting the table of statistics for the year 1926-1927, you will see that your school maintained a fairly good record in average attendance, but the tardy marks were a little excessive considering the number of registered pupils. Let us aim for improvement the present year. Too many absentees and too many cases of tardiness ought to compel every parent to ask himself, "Am I responsible?" Regularity and punctuality are business virtues and are essential to a good school.

Some questions of discipline necessarily arose during the year which demanded careful attention, prompt and decisive action, but were usually treated by the teachers in a spirit of sincerity for the child's good. Indeed, that is the best condition in a school where difficulties are not permitted to arise. However, when necessary, we believe in a strict and impartial school government, such as a wise, judicious and faithful parent would exercise in the family and which will unfold in every child the best qualities and stimulate the highest principles and purposes. Your schools are created for the pupil and their aim is to educate the young for fitness in life and its realities, and to do this, thorough discipline must be maintained.

Judging from visits of inspection, from teachers' exami-

nations and from results of a few standard tests given, the school maintained an average progress.
