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## NH CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION REMAINS POPULAR IN STATE

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DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen remains the most popular member of the state's congressional delegation and her colleague Senator Maggie Hassan is also popular in the state. Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who recently announced she will retire at the end of her term, and Congresswoman Ann Kuster, are viewed somewhat favorably in the First and Second Districts respectively.

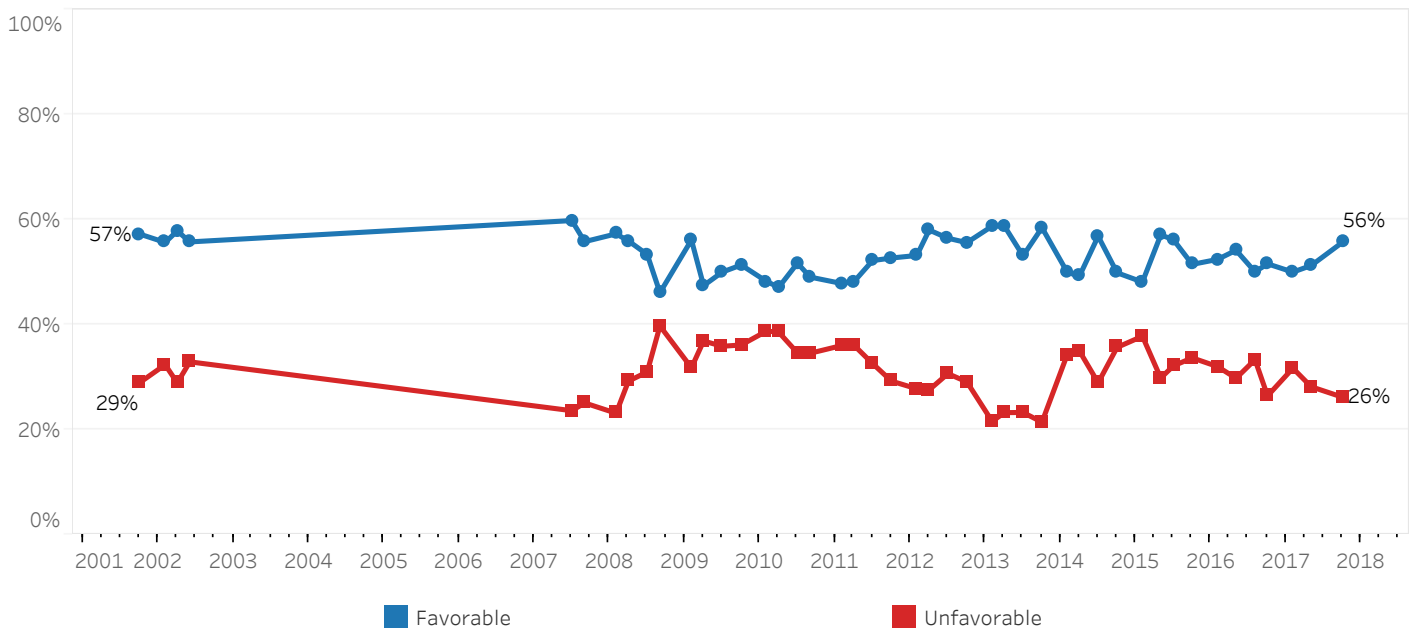
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll\***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seventy-three (573) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 3 and October 15, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included were 274 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.0%) and 299 from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.7%).

### Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior Senator and former Governor Jeanne Shaheen continues to be popular in the state. Currently, 56% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 26% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 9% don't know enough about her to say.

Self-identified liberals (83%), Boston Globe readers (77%), those who have completed postgraduate work (75%), those aged 65 and older (73%), frequent NHPR listeners (72%), those who read local newspapers (70%), and those who attend religious services once or twice a month (67%) are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Those aged 18 to 34 (44%), self-identified Independents (42%), those who attend religious services once a week or more often (40%), those who did not vote in 2016 (39%), registered Republicans (37%), self-described conservatives (34%), self-identified Republicans (30%), those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 (28%), and frequent conservative radio listeners (24%) are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

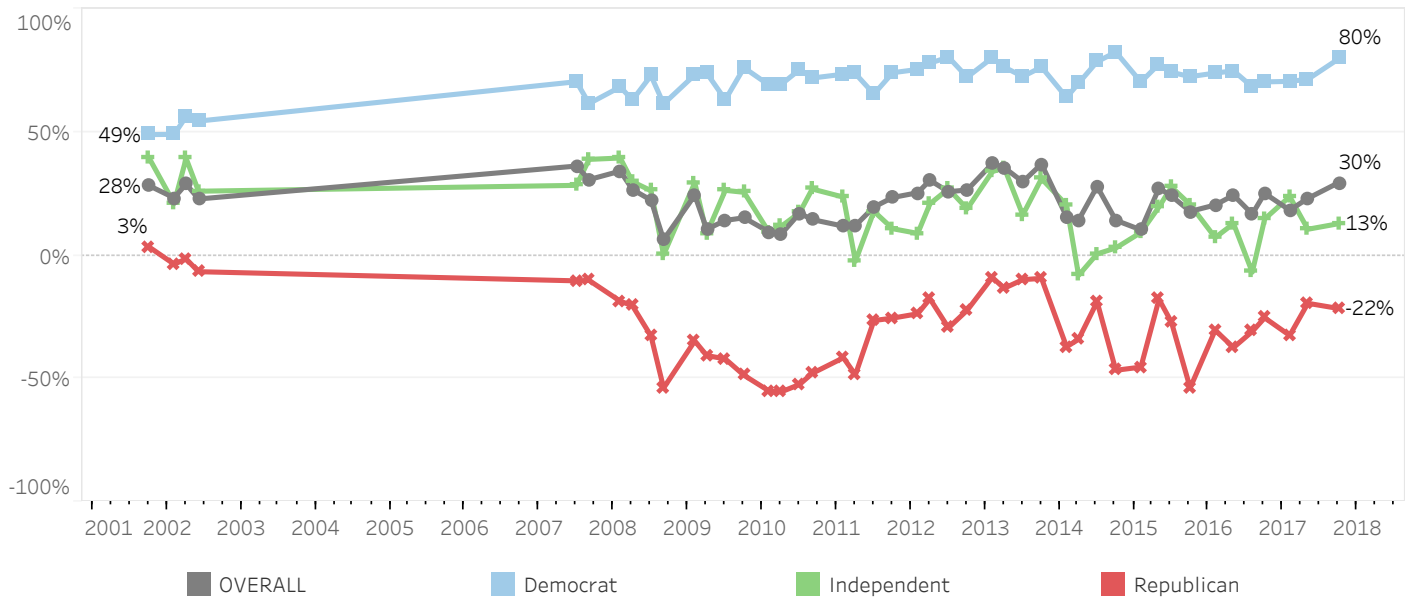
Shaheen Favorability Rating

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have a unfavorable opinion) is +30%, a slight increase since May (+23%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +80%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+13%), but unpopular among Republicans (-22%). Shaheen's overall net favorability rating is at its highest point since October 2013 (+37%).

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

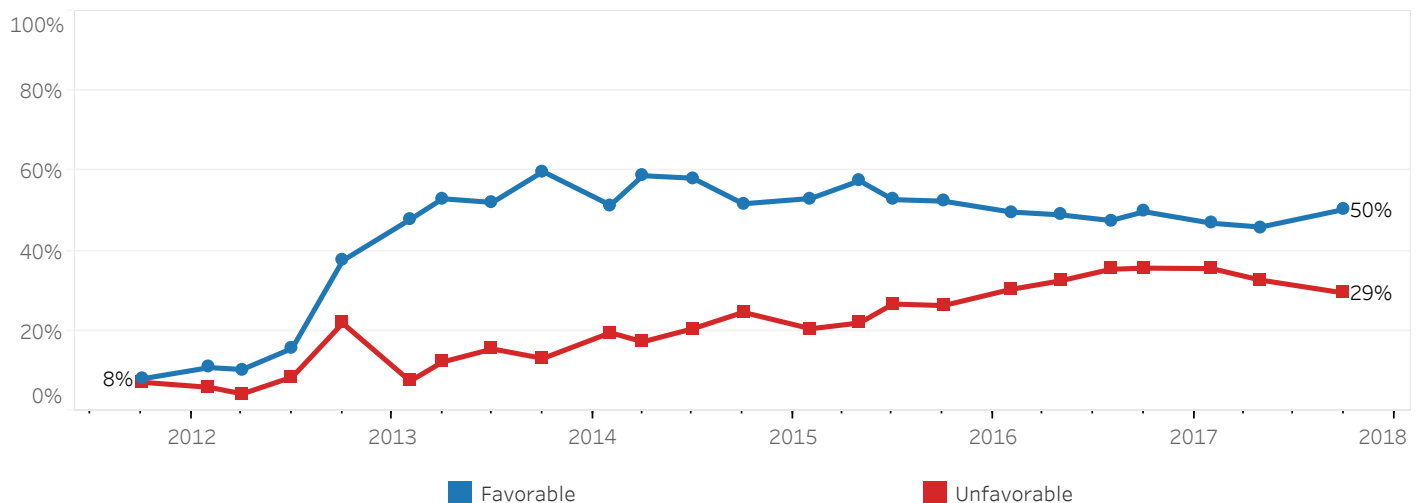


**Favorability - Maggie Hassan**

New Hampshire's junior Senator Maggie Hassan is slightly less popular than her colleague Jeanne Shaheen. Currently, half of New Hampshire adults (50%) have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 9% don't know enough about her to say.

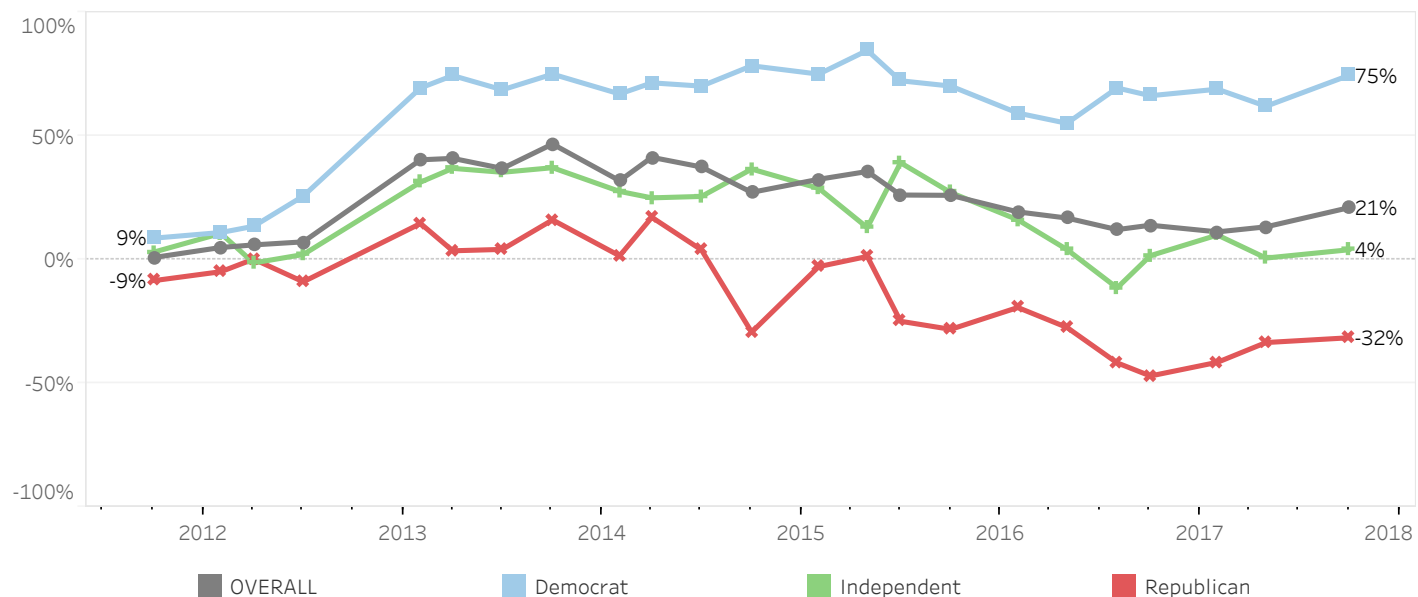
Those who voted for Hillary Clinton for President (85% favorable), registered Democrats (82%), self-described liberals (80%), self-identified Democrats (80%), Boston Globe readers (70%), those who attend religious services once or twice a month (69%), those who have completed postgraduate work (68%), frequent NHPR listeners (66%), those aged 65 and older (65%), those who do not own a gun (62%), and women (60%) are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Men (40%), those who attend religious services once a week or more often (40%), gun owners (38%), self-identified Independents (37%), those who did not vote in 2016 (31%), registered Republicans (30%), self-described conservatives (27%), self-identified Republicans (25%), those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 (22%), and frequent conservative radio listeners (22%) are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

Hassan's net favorability rating is +21%, slightly higher than in May (+13%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +75%) and unpopular among Republicans (-32%) while Independents are neutral (+4%). Hassan's net favorability has increased most among Democrats (+62% in May, +75% in October), while her favorability among Independents and Republicans has remained stable since then.

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

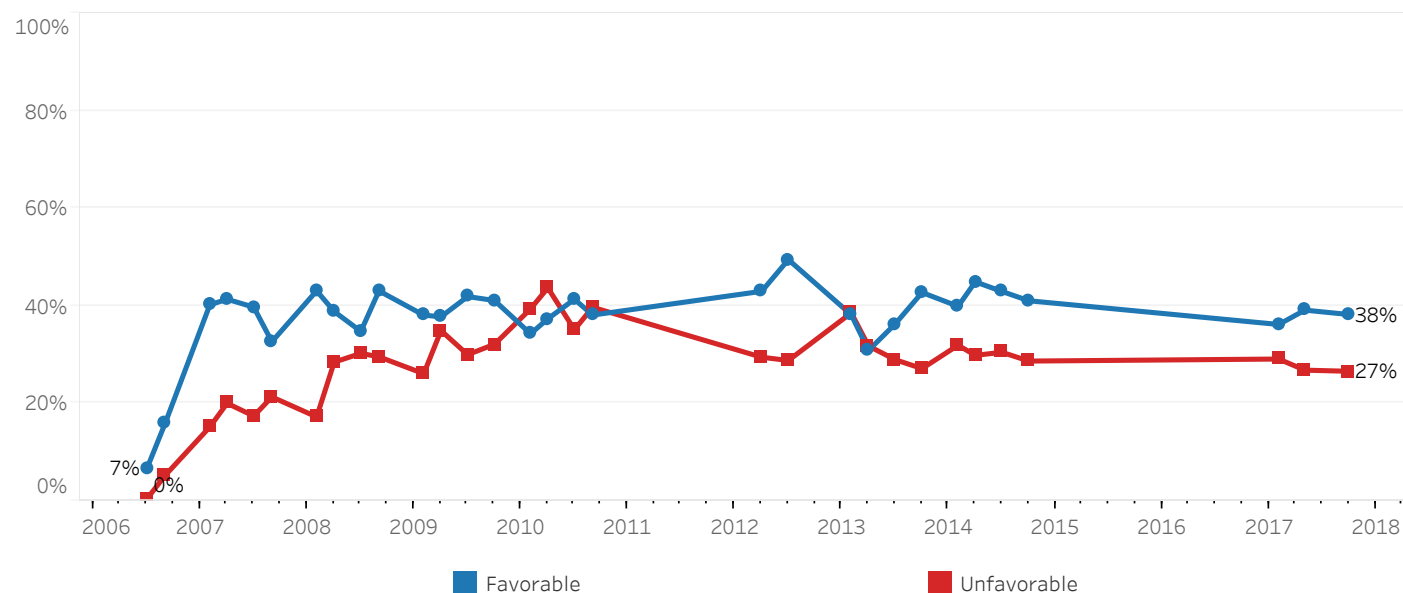


**Favorability - Carol Shea-Porter**

Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who recently announced she will be retiring from Congress at the end of her current term, remains somewhat popular in the New Hampshire's First District. Currently, 38% of residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District have a favorable view of Shea-Porter, 27% have an unfavorable view of her, 18% are neutral, and 18% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +11%, largely unchanged since May (+12%).

Shea-Porter is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +62%), somewhat unpopular among Independents (-15%), and unpopular among Republicans (-44%).

**Shea-Porter Favorability Rating - First District**

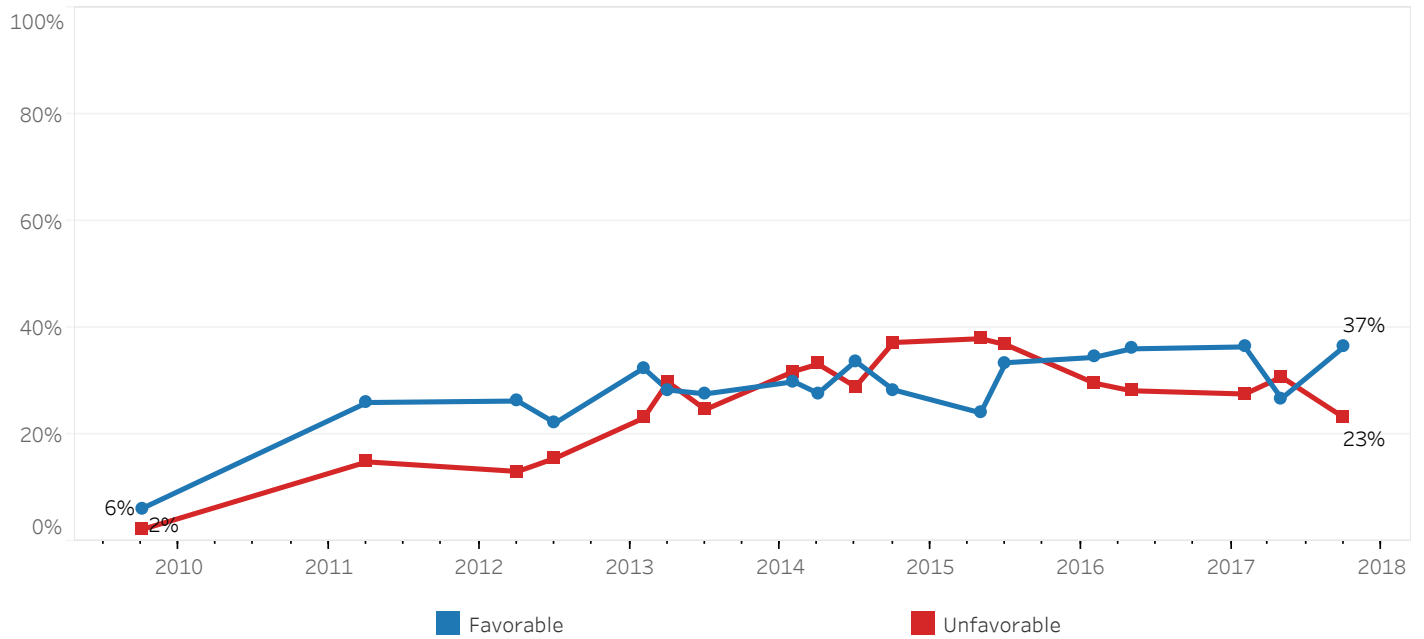


### Favorability - Ann Kuster

Second Congressional District residents remain divided in their opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster. Currently, 37% of residents of New Hampshire's Second Congressional District have a favorable view of Kuster, 23% have an unfavorable view of her, 18% are neutral, and 22% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +14%, up from -4% in May.

Kuster is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +58%) and unpopular among Republicans (-23%) while Independents are neutral (-4%).

### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seventy-three (573) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 3 and October 15, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included were 274 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.0%) and 299 from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.7%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
