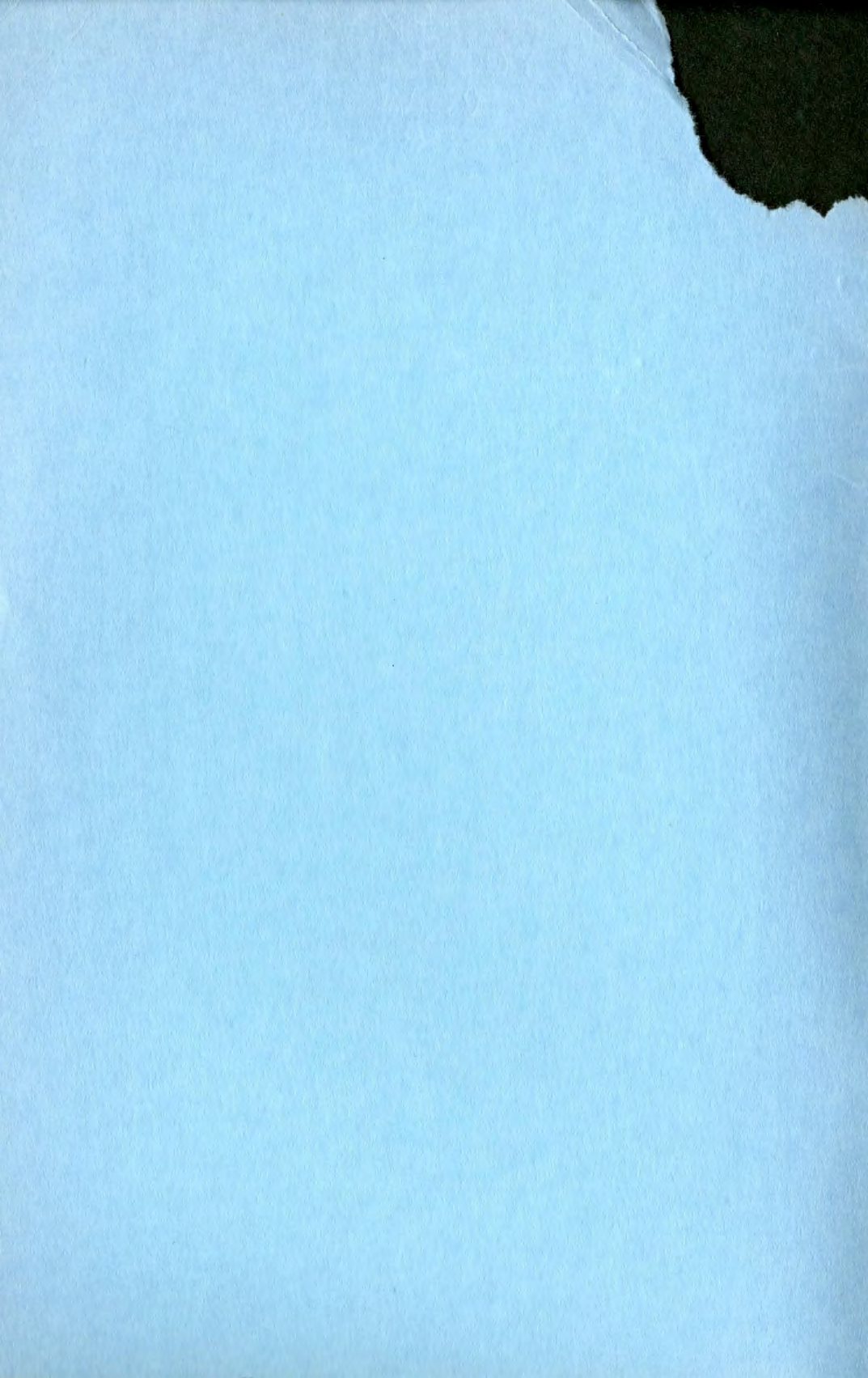

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the county of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The polls shall open for voting after the reading of the last article and shall not close before six o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club and all church organizations, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old road from the Tedesco driveway to the so-called Bronson Road.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for Child Recreation, to be directed by a committee appointed by the Selectmen.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for advertising to be apportioned as follows: \$400 to the White Mountains Region Association and \$350 to the Chamber of Commerce. (Recommended by the Budget Committee.)

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to remove the trees in front of the Allard Block, said trees being in a dangerous condition.

10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the sidewalk on Middle Street, allowing the Highway Department to widen said street.

11. To see if the Town will vote to keep the remainder of the so-called Legion Field for recreational purposes.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$10,000 to replace worn-out highway equipment, namely the 1946 F.W.D. Truck, the 1952 Chevrolet Truck, and the Ford Tractor; said sum to be amortized over a period of three years. The proceeds from the sale of the old to be applied on the purchase price of the new equipment.

13. If the preceding article is not accepted, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an additional sum of \$3,000 for the maintenance of the present highway equipment.

14. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the March Town Meeting, 1957, adopting a non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting in 1960. (By Petition.)

15. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Financial Statements

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1957-
December 31, 1958: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1957 and December 31, 1958, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Net Debt of \$5,432.99, to a Surplus of \$3,482.31 during 1958.

**Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit
A-2)**

An analysis of the change in financial condition of

the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,095.38, plus a revenue surplus of \$3,422.85, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$5,518.23.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:

(Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1958, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1958, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public

funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

General Comments

Current Surplus:

The current financial condition of the Town changed from a current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) of \$2,099.65, to a current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) of \$3,482.31, in 1958, as shown herewith:

It is noted that for the first time in a great many years the Town ended the year in a surplus position.

Treasurer's Surety Bond:

The surety bond of the Town Treasurer should be increased from \$10,000.00 to \$18,000.00, in order that the amount of the bond may be commensurate with the amount of funds over which the Treasurer has custody.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and

recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

HEALTH REPORT

To the Citizens of Whitefield:

During the year 1958, 54 visits were made to the town. In February a Cardiac Clinic was held at the Morrison Hospital, at which 23 children were examined. At the Salk Vaccine Clinics 115 children received immunization. In the Spring, the Triple Toxoid Clinics were held, and 218 children were immunized, 59 children started the series of 3 injections, and finished, 28 received Booster injections, and 34 were Vaccinated. In May a Child Health Conference was held, attended by 36 children.

We have had many problems in the community arising from unemployment, and from an influx of new families. With the cooperation of the School Nurse, the selectmen, and the Chief of Police, we have attempted to help these families with their problems and the surplus food commodities and the generosity of the community have helped us immeasurably.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Whitefield, and I would like to thank them for their cooperation.

You Can Help Prevent Forest Fires

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning—brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

Save yourself much possible difficulty.

REPORT FROM THE WHITE MOUNTAINS REGION ASSOCIATION

1958 was a busy year for the White Mountains Region office, particularly in the information and transportation fields.

In view of foreseen drastic consequences, the Region took a very active part in representing our towns in fighting transport curtailment, particularly with regard to the railroads. We appeared at hearings in Concord, North Conway, and Littleton, and engaged in a considerable amount of travel and correspondence in the effort to prevent the Boston and Maine and the Maine Central railroads from cutting out their passenger service. While only limited success resulted, it should be pointed out that such curtailments will go through without even a delay if they are not strongly contested. We have also taken an active part in proceedings before the Civil Aeronautics Board in attempting to secure better air service for northern New Hampshire; the final decision on this is not yet in. In the meantime, we have worked with bus companies to publicize their service in the hope that bus travel may take up some of the slack.

Demands for White Mountains literature of all types continue to increase, and we have been considerably crowded to satisfy them. The new N. H. Montreal office, turnpike information booths, and new sources contacted while out of state have all upped the quantity of literature we need to distribute. As satisfying the requests for folders about our region means dollars to our towns, it is extremely important that we receive enough funds to supply the need.

We have continued our customary and tested programs of 4-H awards, Youth Awards in science, and of liaison with all types of organizations and departments who in one way or another are working for the benefit of our area and our state. We have confidence that 21 years has proved them worthwhile. We have continued to travel to areas outside our state to carry the White Mountains message, and have cooperated with attractions operators and others who are doing the same job in different ways.

We'd like to remind every town again in this legislative year that holding the line in taxes in New Hampshire will be possible to a large extent only as much as we continue to bring in out-of-state visitors to help finance our main sources of revenue (Ex: they pay over 40% of the gas tax and others). To do this, we have to continue to reach out and bring them in, and put up the small sums (which return many times over) that publicity costs. It's for our own benefit, and it **does** pay off. At a small outlay to any one town, an area publicity program operates that benefits all our towns. Our surveys in four consecutive years have shown consistently 2½ to 3 times the town monies coming back to the area out of just a few inquirers surveyed.

Your town's part in this work is important, and is appreciated. This is one way where we in New Hampshire can still do things for ourselves.
