THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Winchester in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Winchester on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects; the polls not to close at an earlier hour than six of the clock in the afternoon.

Art. 1. To see if the town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international co-operation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

Art. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 3. To receive reports of the selectmen, town treasurer, and other town officers including agents and committees and act thereon.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,700.00 for Town Officers' Salaries.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,300.00 for Town Officers' Expenses.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Election and Registration Expenses.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Municipal Court.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,950.00 for Expenses of Town Hall.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,155.64 to install a new steam heating system in the Town Hall as recommended by the committee appointed under Article 32 of the Warrant for 1944.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$750.00 for the Police Department.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the Fire Department.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for Expenses of Forest Fires.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to provide for white pine blister rust control in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the Health Department.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 for the purpose of aiding the Winchester District Nursing Association.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$125.00 for Vital Statistics.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Sewer Maintenance.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$13,000.00 for Summer Maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$7,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,442.00 for Street Lighting.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00 for General Expenses of Highway Department.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$798.70 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$3,194.80.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the Winchester Public Library.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$600.00 for Town Poor.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,400.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$659.00 to pay the cost of installing an Honor Roll in tribute to the men and women from Winchester serving in World War II.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Memorial Day and other Celebrations.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Aid to Soldiers and their Families.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to provide Playground facilities and supervision and instruction therefor for the young people of the town; and to authorize the Moderator and Budget Committee to appoint a committee of 5 members to administer this project.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$75.00 for Care of Common.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,800.00 for Cemeteries.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$224.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for 1945.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$180.00 for the payment of Interest on Temporary Loans in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to charge a fee of \$75.00 for the right or privilege of connecting any service line to any present, new or rebuilt sewer and each service line shall be limited to one house only. Any such connection shall not be made without first obtaining permission in writing from the selectmen.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to complete the sewer line from Chapel Street to Michigan Street, raise money therefor or act thereon.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for the purchase of new equipment for the Highway Department.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to amend the by-law relating to depositing refuse material in or upon the bank of the Ashuelot River within the village of Winchester so that the by-law will read as follows: Be it ordered that from and after the adoption of this by-law that any persons who deposit or cause to be deposited any garbage or other refuse material of an unsightly character upon either bank of the Ashuelot River or in midstream thereof within the village of Winchester between a point commencing at the northerly line of the A. C. Lawrence Leather Company land and terminating at the Winchester-Hinsdale line shall forfeit for the use of the town for each and every offence a sum of not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars and cost; the same to be recovered by action in the police court of Winchester and the police officers or any one of them hereby instructed to enforce the provisions of this by-law.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Art. 41. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The weekly Baby Clinics held at the Community Center were attended by mothers and their children under school age, during the year. The monthly Baby Clinics which were conducted in Ashuelot were very well attended during the year. Miss Uehlein was assisted by Miss Vera Fairbanks, Mrs. Gertrude Donovan. At this time I wish to thank Mr. Frank Fairbanks, who so willingly gave us the use of his store without charge. This is truly a public service.

There was no Toxoid Clinic conducted during the year as the number required was not enough to warrant this. However, we do plan to conduct such a clinic this spring.

Jan. 18.—Illustrated lecture and discussion on the prevention of blindness by Miss Louise Sexton, Consultant of Sight Conservation. The meeting was sponsored by one of the regular meetings of the King's Daughter's Circle.

Jan. 20.—Conference and survey with the Doctors, Clergy, Selectmen, Local Health Officer and State Health Representatives regarding conditions of river bank.

Jan. 24.—Attended the Social Welfare and Health Conference in Manchester.

Mar. 8.—State Graduate Nurses conference in Concord. Dr. Newton Browder of Boston gave illustrated lecture of the present method of treating burns on patients who were severely burned in the Coconut Grove disaster.

Mar. 21.—Mrs. Betsy Johnson of Laconia cooperated with the schools and gave individual tests to 11 children.

Mar. 25.—Conference with Miss Elizabeth Murphy R. N., Supervisor of school health regarding plans for improving the health in our schools.

May 1.—Teachers at the Center and Ashuelot schools made a special effort this year to bring out the importance of better health in the community. Programs were directed by each teacher and the plans have worked out very well through the year, as our school health has much improved.

June 5 through June 8.—Dr. Harvey Grimes had charge of the Dental Clinic and treated 66 children during this period.

Oct. 6.—Cheshire County P. H. N. held their fall meeting with Miss Florence Clark, Director of Public Health Nurses, discussing the post war nursing.

Oct. 11.—Dental Health meeting was conducted with Miss Frances Ferri, Dental Hygienist, at the Elliot Community Hospital to nurses and professional women.

Oct. 13.—Teachers and School Nurses Conference in Manchester. Dr. Oaks of the Massachusetts General Hospital illustrated talk on testing the new Vision Acuity Chart. The meet-

ing was instructive and informative to both teachers and nurses.

Oct. 24.—Keene High School at the request of State Health Supervisor for discussion and demonstration of hearing acuity by Mr. L. B. Carter, Division Manager for the Maico Audiometer Company.

SUMMER PLAYGROUND REPORT

January 22, 1945

To the Town of Winchester: I hereby submit my report of the summer playground project for the year of 1944.

The playground project, for which \$600 was appropriated at the town meeting last year, was very successful. It was a worthwhile experiment and proved that an organized and supervised program could hold the interest of over a hundred boys and girls during the summer months.

The program started June 26 and ended August 26. The boys attended in the morning and the girls in the afternoon. The girls' attendance averaged seventeen per day, with the highest day being twenty-nine. The boys average attendance being about twenty per day with twenty-six being the highest for any one day. The ages ran from nine to fifteen years.

The girls had opportunity to take part and receive instruction in the following activities: Soft ball, volley ball, basketball, tennis, high and broad jumping, archery, badminton, racing, and swimming.

There were two girls' soft ball teams and the results of the games were kept on a chart.

The fundamentals of tennis were taught and noted improvement could be seen at the end of the season.

Once and some times twice a week the girls were taken to Forrest Lake for swimming. Those who could not swim were taught. Those who could swim were given tests of timing, perfection of strokes and diving. Swimming races were held and several water games were taught.

Vast improvement was made in the girls' ability to play a variety of sports and their sportsmanship and fair play was much improved at the close of the season.

The boys received instructions in a variety of sports which help build the body and mind and make for clean living and good sportsmanship.

The boys activities were like those for the girls and in addition, boxing and baseball.

Several baseball games were scheduled with out of town clubs such as Swanzey, Keene Junior Police and Boys' Camp at Spofford. The boys gained much experience through this outside competition.

Records were kept of most of the activities whereby they could check their improvements from week to week. Play-ground teams in soft ball, baseball, and basketball were in action most of the time.

The boys were very cooperative in working on the baseball field and tennis court. They took much interest in tennis and several of the boys were developed into good players by the end of the season.

Outings were held several times during the summer such as trips to Cass Pond for swimming, games and a roast. Several trips were made to Forrest Lake for swimming.

The last week of the program was devoted to contests in the various sports events for both boys and girls. Many prizes were given for those who placed in these events. A tennis tournament was also held.

During the last week a grand outing was enjoyed by all who could possibly attend. Games were played, swimming and field events, and a big hot dog roast at Cass Pond made up the day's program.

We honestly believe that by having this sort of a program that the boys and girls have something definite to do, a place to go and expend their energy and to do something to build their minds and bodies which are the essentials of good citizenship. They learn sports and become interested in them which helps to take up the idle time which might otherwise be spent in an unwise way.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools and the School Board of the Town of Winchester:

I hereby submit my report of the nursing work for the year 1944.

There were a total of 1,990 visits made to and for the interest of the schools with 288 visits to school, 10 classroom inspections, and 626 individual inspections. Sixty-six students were excluded from school due to communicable diseases or for prophylactic measures. Three hundred twenty-nine students received vision tests and twenty-five were found to have defects. Fifteen have received treatment. Three hundred ninety-four students were weighed and measured at the beginning of the school term. Each child had gained in weight and growth at a normal ratio. Five children were accompanied home from school due to illness; four children were taken to the doctor's office. Twenty children were accompanied to the oculist and the T. B. and orthopedic clinics. There were 170 cases of school follow-up work on children under 16 years of age at the request of teachers or the headmaster.

During May, 1944, 425 children received hearing tests in their respective schools. One hundred twenty-five children received retests at the Community Center as a result of these tests. Twenty-five children were found to have some hearing defect. Parents were immediately notified. Ten children received treatment from family physician or ear specialist while others are still under treatment. Most deafness is preventable. It involves the prevention of contagious diseases and colds; the prompt recognition and treatment of infected tonsils and adenoids and the proper care of the ears.

Miss Louise Sexton, R. N., Consultant of Sight Conservation presented a motion picture on the prevention of blindness. It was attended by the Superintendent of Schools, the headmaster and teachers.

During June, 1944, Dr. Harvey Grimes, D. D., treated 66 children at the dental clinic held in the District Nurse Association office.

Good teeth make for better health and good looks. The body takes care of the building of teeth but we must provide the materials required and arrange for the proper upkeep.

The annual physical examinations of all school children were conducted soon after school opened in September. The examining physicians were Dr. Louvane A. Fox and Dr. Ludwig H. Mendelson, assisted by Lena Uehlein, R. N. Four hundred fourteen children were examined by the doctors. All defects were checked and notices sent to parents.

On November 8, 1944, arrangements were made to serve milk at recess and an average of 30 bottles were distributed daily to children in the Center School.

With the interest growing among the parents of school children and public in general for the need of serving hot lunches in the school for children who carry their lunches has also found its place. Mrs. Guy Johnson, member of the School Board, has worked untiringly to promote such a project as it took months of planning. Through her effort, the Women's Club is the sponsoring agency and members of the club are giving their time in preparing the food and serving while students from the high school assist. Food gives you energy for work and today your health is both a personal and a national asset.

During the year, conferences and meetings were attended in the interest of better school health.

At this time, I wish to express my thanks for the financial assistance from the Local Branch of the Salvation Army for needy corrective work; to the Local Branch of the Red Cross in their help with children of service men; to Mrs. Adalieta Eaton, Mrs. Gladys Thacher and Miss Marion V. Fairbanks for their cooperation throughout the year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the Superintendent of Schools, members of the School Board and the teachers for their help and cooperation in making this year a success.

There were two changes in the high school faculty last fall. Miss Elizabeth McKenna resigned in August to accept a much better position. We were very fortunate in securing Mrs. Geraldine Dickinson of this town to fill the vacancy. Mrs. Dickinson was one of our former teachers. Mrs. Minnie Sealey terminated her services at the end of the last school year and there seemed to be no available replacement. Mrs. Beryl Thyng acted as substitute for one month. Mrs. Howard Little then took over until the holidays. Finally, Mrs. Nettie Dunbar of West Rindge, a graduate of New Hampshire University, was secured to continue with this social study work in the junior high school. It was found impossible to find any one for the work in Agriculture so that course has been dropped from our schedule and a woodworking course for freshmen boys was substituted. Mr. Fred Gately is the instructor in this course.

The response of local qualified teachers to help the school in this time of critical teacher shortage is very gratifying; without them we could not have continued a complete program. The services of Mr. Frank Snow of Brattleboro were again secured for the orchestra and Mrs. Beryl Thyng is coaching the girls' chorus.

Eleven of last year's class of twenty and one member of the Class of 1943 are continuing their studies in college. The colleges are: University of New Hampshire, Keene Teachers College, University of Vermont, Cornell, Harvard, and Becker. The reports from these students to date as to the grade of work they are doing are very satisfactory.

The junior-senior class in Home Management refinished and decorated trays which were donated for use in the school lunch project at the Center School. Members of this class are assisting in serving the lunches.

One hundred ninety-eight of the former members of the senior high school are now serving in the various branches of the armed forces. It is gratifying to know that many of these who had not finished their high school course are now taking courses offered by the Army and Navy in order to complete their credits. We can be very proud of the services being rendered by our former students. They are a credit to any community.

Commencement exercises of the Class of 1944 were received with unusual commendation from local as well as out of town listeners. The class did an outstanding piece of work in this program which portrayed the progressive historical development of our United States.

As a matter of record, a copy of part of the program follows. Appropriate chorus selections were under the direction of Miss Evelyn Brinton who willingly took on this work in addition to her regular job in Claremont.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Winchester:

I have the honor to submit my seventh annual report.

Teachers: Several changes took place among the teachers during the past year. In the Center School, Miss Josephine Finn, second grade teacher, resigned to accept a position in another state. Her position was filled by the appointment of Mrs. Katherine Urgielewicz of South Vernon, Massachusetts, a graduate of North Adams Teachers College and a teacher of successful experience in Massachusetts schools.

Mrs. Daisy Thompson resigned in June after a teaching career of more than 40 years in the Winchester schools, most of which were in lower elementary grades. I am sure that all her former pupils, as well as her co-workers, wish her the best of health and happiness in her retirement after so many years of successful school teaching.

Miss Martha Paul, a 1943 graduate of Wheelock School, was appointed to teach the first grade at the Center School.

At the Ashuelot School, it was found advisable to transport the seventh grade to the Thayer High School as in previous years due to the smaller enrollment in this school. This necessitated the abolishment of the position held by Mrs. Howard Little during the past year as teacher in grades six and seven. Mrs. Little was given a temporary assignment in the Junior High School as teacher of Social subjects until the Christmas vacation. In January, she was transferred to the Center School to assist the regular teachers in the intermediate grades with those pupils who are having difficulty in reading, spelling and arithmetic.

For changes in the Thayer High School faculty, you are referred to Headmaster Grupe's report.

Transportation: No essential changes were made in the transportation routes with the exception of the Rabbit Hollow route, Mr. George Whippie, conveyer. It was found necessary to have a second trip made in order to accommodate all pupils in this section.

All conveyors are still subject to the rules and regulations set up by the Office of Defense Transportation concerning unnecessary mileage and stops. These rules have carried the rejection of some requests for transportation for children outside the limitations set up by the O. D. T. and the rules and regulations set up by the Winchester School Board.

Health Education: According to an editorial in the Concord Daily Monitor on January 26, 1945, the selective service survey of rejections does not flatter New Hampshire where 38.9 per cent of those called for induction were not accepted. This compares with a national average of 36 per cent with the lowest rate of rejections being in the newer states of the Union, all west of the Mississippi River and in the central or northern tier of these states. In New England, Vermont has the worst showing though the other states in this region are only slightly better than New Hampshire. An analysis by occupations revealed the fact that the greatest percentage of rejections were among farmers and domestic workers as a group.

Also, the State Board of Health has revealed the fact that the people of New Hampshire have about the poorest teeth in the nation and that poor teeth can and do cause other troubles.

The children of Winchester are examined once a year by doctors appointed by the School Board. They are assisted by the District Nurse who is also responsible for follow-up work and visiting the homes in order to advise parents concerning the correction of defects.

The audiometer test for hearing has been given under the supervision of the District Nurse for the last three years. Several cases of deafness have been found which would warrant clinical treatment.

Also, sporadic attempts have been made to better the condition of the teeth of the children by securing the services of a dentist. For instance, in May, 1942, Dr. Harvey Grimes of Keene treated 115 children at the clinic held in Winchester.

A study of the Health Reports for the last fifteen years reveals that the percentage of children afflicted with cardiac or heart disease in Winchester is one of the highest in the state of New Hampshire. The Health Report for 1942 listed 69 pupils out of 421 examined, or 16%, as having a weakness along this line. These children constitute a problem in school as they easily become tired, listless and discouraged and over-exert themselves in trying to do the work assigned them in school.

Like most other good things in life, good health can only come through continuous, constructive and cooperative action. Poor teeth, no doubt, can be corrected by visiting the dentist once every three years but a more satisfactory plan would be to visit him more often and, in the meantime, brush the teeth at least daily. Poor vision may be corrected to some degree by the oculist but many cases, no doubt, could be prevented if adequate artificial lighting was provided in the homes and schools of the children. Food dietary conditions can be remedied in part through the use of vitamin pills but a more satisfactory solution in the case of children, at least, would be to provide balanced meals. This year, for the first time, hot noon lunches have been provided at the Center School with gratifying results. This has been a cooperative enterprise with the Women's Club, School Board and teachers, all cooperating to make it a success. A brief summary is given below by Mrs. Guy Johnson who had general supervision of this project.

School Lunches: Well planned hot lunches are recognized throughout the nation as a valuable aid to school children's nutritive needs. Many parents had felt the need for these in our schools and, after looking into the possibilities, the Winchester School Board voted to start hot lunches at the Center School beginning on January 8. The Clerk of the Board was appointed supervisor of the project.

The Winchester Women's Club sponsored this project. Their members and other interested women, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Edward Costello, are cooking and serving these lunches in an excellent way to from 83 to 96 children who previously brought cold packed lunches.

Mr. Hyde renovated a corner of the school basement which the women made into a kitchen with loaned and donated equipment. Each day, the tables are set up in the large first floor hall. The School Board installed a small sink with running water where each child washes his hands before meals.

Each lunch consists of a main hot dish, whole wheat bread and butter, one-half pint of milk, and a dessert. It contains required amounts of vegetables, fruits, proteins, etc., to meet requirements of a "Type A" lunch and provides from one-third to one-half of a child's daily nutritive requirements. Each child pays 10 cents and the Federal War Foods Administration pays 9 cents. All of this money is spent for food only. The teachers and School Nurse report an improvement in school attendance and health.

The cooperation in the project and supervision of the children by Mrs. Gracia Toof, the principal, and all of the teachers has made possible the success of the project. It has also added to the work of Mr. Hyde who has cheerfully attended to the many extra details that have made the project run smoothly.

We appreciate the interest and help of members of Thayer High School faculty and girls of Junior and Senior classes.

There have been many donations of supplies and food from parents and citizens. This has enabled us to serve more substantial meals and is greatly appreciated.

It seems that the results of this project justify a more convenient kitchen and permanent lunch room.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the pupils and teachers, to the School Board and to the parents and patrons of our schools for their loyalty and cooperation.

ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.
