THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Allenstown in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Fire Station in said Allenstown on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear and act upon the report of the Town Budget Committee.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to give a one percent discount on all 1947 taxes paid on or before July 1, 1947.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote an hourly increase of ten cents per hour for all employees of the Town, except Town officials,
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of constructing a sewer on Turnpike Street,

commencing near the residence of Freddie Martel;—thence southerly to the residence of John Crevier.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$165.92 (1/100th of one per cent of the town's valuation based on the 1946 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in co-operation with the other 37 communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars in 1947;— Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars in 1948 and Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars in 1949, said sums to be set aside each year until the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1500.00) Dollars is raised, for the purpose of constructing a swimming pool in the park in the rear of the Fire Station.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropiate the sum of Seven Hundred (\$700.00) Dollars to finish the sidewalk on School Street.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to pay the regular Firemen the sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars per month.
- 12. By Petition. To see what action the Town will take regarding a narrow strip of land between the sidewalk and land of the abutters on Valley Street.
- 13. By Petition. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars to oil the street from Granite Street to the residence of Aime Beaudoin.
- 14. By Petition. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred (\$800.00) Dol-

lars to build a sidewalk on the east side of South Main Street from Granite Street to the residence of Glenn O. McNamara, or as far as said appropriation will go.

- 15. To hear the reports of auditors, agents, committees or officers heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

PREVENT FIRES - IT PAYS!

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires

in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, eigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not coverel with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this—

- Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
- 2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
- 3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
- 4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
- 5. HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Allenstown:

It is with pleasure that I present to your Board my thirteenth annual report of your school organization and educational activities. Such recommendations as are included in this report are proposed not merely to reduce the advancing cost of your schools, but pimarily that this investment may bring to your youth greater returns in terms of more thorough and complete equipment for life.

The increasing shortage of trained teachers necessitated a complete change of instructors in both the upper and lower grades of the Allenstown School. Since September your primary grades have been taught by substitute teachers. So far this year we have been successful in employing trained and experienced substitutes. In September Mrs. Bessie S. Blake of Candia was elected teacher of the upper grades and principal of the building, succeeding Miss Edith Whittemore whose health necessitated her retirement. Mrs. Blake has taught for some years the seventh and eight grades in elementary schools. Her graduates have shown excellent preparation to meet the requirements of city high schools.

In the primary grades Mrs. Teofilia Nilsson, formerly a teacher in the Concord schools, substituted until the first of November. Since that time Mrs. Ursula O. Jensen, a former teacher and principal in the schools of Manchester, has substituted in these grades.

On Monday afternoons Mrs. Martha F. Gale, of Concord, directs the instruction in Music.

Five Allenstown children, who have difficulty in hearing, receive lip reading instruction for an hour each Tuesday afternoon. The instructor, Mrs. Catherine E. Hammond of Manchester, and her pupils especially enjoy having visitors attend this class.

The report of your enumeration officer indicates that the child population between the ages of five and sixteen years remains approximately the same as that of a year ago. The total is now 285 against a total of 283 last year. Two hundred fifty-nine resident children within these age limits are attending public or private schools in the elementary or secondary grades.

There are 44 children in the Allenstown Grammar school. Nine of these pupils in Grades Seven and Eight go to the Pembroke Grammar School for instruction in Manual Training and Domestic Science.

Thirty-five pupils are enrolled in Pembroke Academy and one in the Concord High School. The cost of tuition is \$123.79 per pupil.

The general attendance record in both rooms of the Allenstown School is excellent. However, the average achievement in the three R's, interpreted for 'the primary and intermediate grades in their Metropolitan Achievement Tests, too frequently falls below the standards attained in many other schools. A comparison of the Grade averages for a peiod of three years expressed in 'Grade and Month', indicates that the pupils' preparation for work in the higher grades is not complete.

Following recent investigation of the relation between handwriting and proficiency in acquiring reading skills, a modified form of manuscript basic handwriting has been adopted in the First Grade. It is intended eventually to extend this system through the Second and Third Grades. In the intermediate and upper grades the Zaner Bloser Correlated Handwriting has replaced the Houston system for which materials are no longer available.

Through the excellent film library now maintained by New Hampshire University and with the Bell and Howell SOUND-ON-FILM projector, purchased by Allenstown in cooperation with four other districts in this Union, visual education is becoming a part of the classroom procedure in teaching geography, history, health, music, safety, and science.

The annual spelling contest, that was discontinued by restricted transportation during the war, has been restored this year. This contest is open to all pupils in grades three through eight. A silver trophy cup is held for a year by the district whose team of three members has the highest total score. Any district, having won the contest three times, holds the cup permanently.

Through the efforts of Mrs. Hamel, Chairman of the Board, and your teachers, Miss Gloria Gardner is now employed to conduct the school lunch service under the recently adopted program of federal aid. Miss Gardner's duties include the planning of menus, ordering supplies, preparing the lunches, and the keeping of state and federal accounts. The hot lunch, consisting of a hearty dish, vegetable, cooked or fresh fruit, milk and bread, costs more than twenty cents. The children pay fifteen cents for the complete lunch, and the government contributes nine cents more for food and labor. Thus, at present prices, school children are able to purchase a complete lunch for less than the cost of a cold lunch brought from home.

During the last year your school nurse, Miss Adonia Douillette, examined 45 pupils in the public school and 382 in the private school. In both schools approximately 10 per cent were found to be underweight. Eleven of the 17 cases of defective vision were corrected. In the private school eight of the fifteen tonsil cases were corrected. Aside from 95 cases of Chicken Pox and 4 of Mumps in the private school, the cases of communicable diseases in both schools were very few. A total of 394 children were given the T. B. Skin Test. Five cases were later X-rayed by Dr. Kerr. A total of 25 children from both schools were given toxoid inoculations by Dr. LeBlanc. Three orthopedic cases were examined by Dr. Jones and two were X-rayed at the Balch Hospital in Manchester. The predominant number of defects in both schools were dental. The serious lack of local dental clinics during and since the war is being realized in all the schools and may be responsible in part for unfavorable school achievement in the lower grades.

The estimated budget for the coming year calls for approximately \$2800 more than the appropriation made in 1946. Of this increase more than \$1000 is absorbed by high school and academy tuitions. The remaining increase is distributed among items of teachers' and janitor's salaries, superintendent's salary, administration, transportation, elementary tuition, insurance and other fixed charges.

The enactment of House Bill No. 12, now in the legislature, or similar legislative bills in prospect, eventually may reduce the local share of school costs by approximately \$1200. However, it is very improbable that these bills will receive final action by the legislature before the date of your annual school district meeting. It appears that the total financial means for the maintenance of public schools during the school year of 1947-48 must be raised and appropriated by the district of Allenstown.

This time is near when, both for economic and for educational reasons, your public school should consider consolidation with a larger school unit. This should be accompanied by early provision by the district for the purchase and operation of its own school transportation bus.

In conclusion, I wish to command most heartily the services being rendered by the teachers and by the school nurse to your schools and community. The spirit of loyalty to the American system of education has been shown by the parents and citizens. The cooperation, extended to the Superintendent and teachers by the members of your Board and by the people of the community, is sincerely appreciated.


