School Report.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 1, 1906.

It is a great pleasure to be able to report a successful school year of thirty weeks. We feel that we have been fortunate in the selection of teachers. With very few exceptions, they have been devoted to their work, and possessed the important attributes necessary for competent and suitable teachers, viz: moral character, scholarship and capacity for government.

The closing exercises in several of the schools were made very pleasing by songs, recitations, and dialogues. The scholars seemed interested in their work and delighted with their teachers. We have received some very creditable specimens of composition and penmanship, the work of the pupils of the Shaker School.

It is always a pleasure to visit this school. The zeal and intelligence with which the teachers perform their duties and make a complete demonstration of the great interest they take in the welfare of children.

The school at the Kezer Seminary has been under the efficient instruction of Miss Gertrude E. Phillips and the Town scholars in that vicinity have enjoyed the benefits of the institution.

During the year we have introduced the Blaisdell series of Physiologies, the Heath Primer and have purchased for all the school-rooms a supply of United States, State and County outline maps. We believe it will be advisable to make other changes in text books, when the books now in use become worn and destroyed.

We have made few repairs to our school-houses. The Shaker school-house chimney has been rebuilt and other repairs made. This house should be shingled the coming year and the Blanchard and Upland houses should be painted. The report of the treasurer will show what disposition has been made of the funds at our disposal. It has been our intention to expend it economically and impartially.

In closing these brief remarks let us bespeak for our schools your earnest active interest. Our schools must keep pace with civilization. We need, we must have, better schools than ever before. They have educated us in youth and now it becomes us to sustain them.
