THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Four hundred dollars for the White Pine Blister Rust control.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred fifty-one dollars and twelve cents for the construction of Class V. Roads, T.R.A., so-called; the State to contribute Two thousand two hundred and four dollars and forty-nine cents.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine hundred dollars to pay up the long term note on Fire Truck.
 - 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the

Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

- 8. To see what discount, if any, the Town will allow on all property taxes paid previous to July 1, 1943.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Epsom:

During the past year, the United States Government has called upon the schools many times for special assistance in the war. Besides the elementary work of providing a literate population, the Army and Navy have found the secondary work in science and mathematics indispensable for the highly technical work demanded of the armed forces. Through our courses in history, geography, and current events, even the youngest children are kept informed as to the meaning and progress of the war, and ways in which civilians can help. Suitable posters have been displayed, both furnished by public agencies and made in the schools; metal and rubber have been salvaged, copper and nickel coins put back into circulation, purchase of savings stamps and bonds pushed; contributions made to Red Cross and other war relief agencies; and phonograph records collected. Our high school pupils are being furnished courses in electricity, radio, machines, and principles of aeronautics of definite pre-induction value, as well as a special physical education program for both boys and girls.

Beginning with the sugar rationing and issuance of War Ration Book No. 1 last May, the schoolhouses have served as registration sites for two gasoline rationings and the fuel oil registration, with another "Point Rationing" and issuance of War Ration Book No. 2 soon to come. Several of the teachers and other citizens have served as registrars in various rationing projects. Mrs. Katherine C. Knight, teacher of the Goss-

ville School, has served every time as School Site Administrator. All of the above service has been voluntary.

The health and nutrition of children calls for special attention in war time. The work of the School Nurse is summarized in her report submitted herewith. Some use has been made of federal surplus products in supplementing school lunches.

The Air Age is deeply affecting education, as well the entire life of the world. Air routes disregard natural barriers that have hitherto determined the course of commerce and the boundaries of nations.Flat maps centered around oceans and continents must be largely replaced by increased use of the globe and maps centered around the Pole. A whole new literature has been inspired by flight, from first-grade stories about airplanes to intricate technical treatises and the loftiest poetry. A large proportion of the youth destined to enter the armed forces will perform their service by piloting, manning, or caring for planes. Millions who now walk will fly, thousands who now drive cars will pilot private and commercial airplanes. One of the greatest vocational fields of the future will be in the various branches of the aircraft industry. For the first time, it will be possible to police the world and preserve international law and order by a small, swift, alert, and inexpensive force. Such a revolutionary change in human affairs can only be of the greatest benefit to mankind if the world is guided to its best use by intelligent education.

Epsom has been fortunate in being able to keep its teaching staff intact and maintain adequate transportation facilities in spite of mileage rationing and the attractiveness of "defense" employment. The School Board took advantage of a fortunate opportunity to purchase and install indoor septic toilets at the Center

School before such equipment went off the market for the duration.
