#### WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 7 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for old age assistance.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for civil defense and appropriate money for the same.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.

- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the health department.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town dump and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the town sidewalk and appropriate money for the same.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Akers Pond Road.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to spray the town for insects and appropriate money for the same.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountain Region Association.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to deem it necessary to require security for the payment of all Yield Taxes which will be incurred in the Town of Errol, New Hampshire, in the County of Coos.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1959-60

To the Members of the School Board and Citizens of Errol:

I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools in the Errol School District. Statistical data including the Grade Placement Chart is corrected and brought up to date but financial data is based on the closing of the fiscal year on June 30. You will note that the actual expenditures of the school year, July 1, 1958 - June 30, 1959, are listed measured against actual income during that period; the budget for the current year ending June 30, 1960, as voted at the last annual meeting; and a recommended budget for the school year 1960-61. The recommended budget for the coming year is slightly less than that set up for the current year.

With addition of one teacher and the subject offering thus made possible State Department approval of the high school was very nearly automatic. We have been assured, orally, that we may expect yearly approval as long as our present program is maintained or improved.

Late in the fall term we were pleased to welcome nine children from Upton as tuition students. Since our present enrollment is small we can work the young people into the classes without crowding; in fact, the few extra will mean a little added competition and the overall per pupil cost will be lessened. First reports are very favorable and indicate that the arrangement may be continued on a year to year basis.

There have been during the year the usual problems of administration, arranging curriculum, finding teachers, etc. The alert interest of your school board members have kept these to a minimum.

A Grade Placement Chart follows this verbal report. It shows that our enrollment is still low and, other than the additional tuition students, there are no immediate prospects for it to increase. However, as noted in my report of last year, I believe the quality of our school work has continued to improve.

Thank you for this opportunity to report.
