TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear the reports of Selectmen and other Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for highways and bridges.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for winter roads.
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for general expense of the highway department.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of town poor.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for old age assistance.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the white pine blister rust.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 for participation in the promotional activity of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Regional Association.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$185.04 for T.R.A. road work, the State will contribute \$1,233.57.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$5,600.00 for the purpose of making improvement to the Province Road, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provision of Chapter 241, N. H. Rev. Statutes Annotated 1955 and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bond or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Goshen.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Dept.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town dump.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,239.96 for the purchase of the Town loader.

20. To take up any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District #5, I herewith submit my fifth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

All four teachers returned in September to continue their teaching in each of the four one-room schools. Mrs. Myrtie Starkey is at the Goshen Village School, Mr. Elmore Kathan at Goshen Four Corners, Mrs. Doris Newman at East Lempster, and Mrs. Frances Wirkkala at Lempster Street. Each teacher has four grades, and the East Lempster School enrollment has increased to a total of thirty-nine pupils. This makes a nearly impossible situation in terms of seating, heating and time to give each grade attention, not to mention individual pupil assistance.

Teachers and pupils are extremely anxious to move into the new school. It is my hope and expectation that by the time you read this report the change will have been made.

Mr. Kathan resigned in October due to a business adventure but continued to teach until the end of January, until a replacement could be obtained. Mrs. Ettabelle Lewis has substituted for a short time prior to the employment of Mrs. Elizabeth Barrett of Newport. Mrs. Barrett has had eleven years of teaching in Unity, Newport and Sunapee. Mrs. Barrett and Mrs. Wirkkala are working with grades five to eight and exchanging assignments in the different subjects. Mrs. Wirkkala is acting principal of the new school.

Mrs. Rae Hodgman and Mrs. Helen Tenney have prepared the hot lunches for the Goshen pupils under most adverse conditions. They will be extremely pleased with the kitchen and equipment of the new school. Increased federal government surplus foods have been most welcome this year.

Cold weather caused the closing of schools and will necessitate making up time during the planned vacations or on Saturdays.

The new building has progressed nicely and, with the cooperation and gifts of many organizations and individuals, will be well equipped. Perhaps the most timely and generous gift was received from Harriet Spaulding Charitable Trust Fund. This has been used to purchase classroom wardrobes and art easels, teacher files, classroom tables, folding tables and chairs for the all-purpose room, kitchen refrigerator, dishes and tableware, and it is expected that some of it will be available for grading. It has enabled the painting of the interior by the contractor.

The Lempster Parents Club has contributed toward floor tile and kitchen equipment, and the Goshen Parents Club toward a freezer. The Grange has made plans to assist with these projects and others. The Legion and Auxiliary are providing outside and classroom flags. These

same organizations and individuals have pledged themselves to work or contribute toward grading and installation of walks or black-topping of the road entering the school grounds. All of these acts are indeed an indication of the support of the citizens in providing better educational facilities for their children.

Miss Florence MacIver, school nurse, has had an exceptionally busy year with the polio and other clinics in addition to the routine testing program. The supervisory union purchased an orthorater which has aided in the identification of eye defects more quickly and accurately.

Miss MacIver, the teachers and I are most appreciative of the support and cooperation of the school board and citizens in assisting us to try to educate and maintain good health among your boys and girls.

SCHOOL WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District No. 5 qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School, Lempster, on the twenty-third day of March, 1957, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing five years.
3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of School Board, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district, officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as

are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

7. To see if the district will authorize the school board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1957-58, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.

8. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or state agencies.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board as agents to dispose of existing school buildings and lots to which the district has clear titles, and use the funds received toward equipping a new school or for development of the site for recreational purposes.

10. To see if the district will vote to name the school site "Cragin Memorial Playground."

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

This past year has been a very busy one in our school health program. The Salk vaccine clinics continued during the summer and on into the fall and winter. Salk vaccine has been made available to all of our school as well as pre-school children through the many clinics which were held. Nearly all of the children have had two inoculations of the vaccine and will receive their third in the very near future. Response to the Salk vaccine program has been excellent.

The yearly inspections of the school children have been carried out. These inspections include the following:

1. Examinations for the detection of scalp ring worm.
2. Vision tests.
3. Height, weight and general observation.
4. Hearing tests.

Notices of defects observed were sent to parents for their consideration. Follow-up home visits were made by the school nurse. Response from the parents was very good. Assistance in the correction of defects, in some instances, was provided by local service organizations as well as by state agencies.

Among the local organizations providing financial assistance are the P. T. A. groups, the Lions Clubs and the Rotary Clubs.

The state agencies offering financial assistance include the Crippled Children's Services, the Sight Conservation Program, the Child Guidance Clinics and the State Public Welfare.

The assistance of these various agencies and organizations makes possible, in many cases, the future health and happiness of our children. Their assistance is greatly appreciated.

It has been a great pleasure and privilege to have spent another year in the school health program. I would like to say "Thank You" for your great interest and cooperation in the work.
