THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Harrisville in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Wells Memorial School in said Harrisville on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next at five of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls to remain open from 1:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) received from Mrs. Ann Partridge for care of cemetery lot.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$229.50 (six cents per \$1000 of the Town's equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association, an agency to advertise, promote, and preserve the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 towns of the Monadnock Region.
- 6. To see whether the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$356.00 in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year of 1965.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$,000) to be placed in a Sinking Fund for the replacement of Highway Equipment under provisions of the Capital Reserve Act of 1943 Chapter 160 as amended.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) to be placed in a Sinking Fund for the replacement of Fire Trucks under provisions of the Capital Reserve Act of 1943 Chapter 160 as amended.

- 9. To determine and appoint salaries of Town Officers and fix compensation of any other agent of the Town.
- 10. To hear reports of agents, committees, or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH 10, 1964

With a blizzard going on outside, Moderator Ralph B. Bemis called the Meeting to order at 1:03 P.M. The Warrants were read, the ballots counted and found to be correct.

Ballot Clerks: John F. Priest, Mary Gilman, Jennie J. Main, Rita Rathburn, Arthur Wikman, Mary B. Upton and Marjorie Williams.

Polls opened for balloting by Australian Ballot

Business meeting called to order at 5:00 P.M. Flag salute followed by prayer by Rev. Mary B. Upton.

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Police: Leo P. Dion, (qualified), Frederick D. Davis (qualified).

Trustee of Trust Funds for 3 years, William P. House, (quali-

fied).

(qualified).

Fire Wards: Robert Walker (qualified). Ralph Clark, Justin Chamberlain, Alton Chamberlain (qualified). David Schmitt, William F. Bemis.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber: John F. Priest (qualified),

William P. House (qualified).

Fence Viewers: John F. Priest (qualified), Ralph B. Bemis

Library Trustee for 3 years: Corrine Trudelle.

A motion giving the Selectmen authority to appoint any officers not elected at this meeting passed.

- Art. 2. A motion o ake up Art. 2 after Art. 12 passed.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes. A motion to accept as printed passed.
- Art. 4. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention. This was done by Australian Ballot. Lawrance W. Rathburn had 120 votes and declared elected, Casper C. Bemis, Jr., 7; John N. Clark, 2; Warren Thayer, 1; Paul Brown, 1.
- Art. 5. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in the Town." This was done by Australian Ballot. Yes 106; No 47.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$229.50 (six cents per \$1,000 of the Town's equalized valuation) to the Monadnock Regional Association, an agency to advertise, promote, and preserve the natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 Towns of the Monadnock Region. A motion to accept as printed passed.

- Art. 7. To see whether the Town will Raise and appropriate the sum of \$336.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital. A motion to accept as printed passed.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept Road and Street signs from the Monadnock Lions Club and agree to install the same. A motion to accept as printed passed.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred and Thirty Nine Dollars and Sixty-one Cents (\$539.61) if the State will contribute Three Thousand Five Hundred Ninety Seven Dollars and Thirty-eight Cents (\$3,597.38) for T.R.A. work. A motion to accept as printed passed.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$8,300.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads withing the Town. Rd. No. 61, Bemis Hill Road; Rd. No. 85 Meadow Road, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 41, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Harrisville. A motion to accept as printed passed.
- Art. 11. Tto see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$4,500.00) to replace the bridge at Russell Reservoir and authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town. Amount to be raised by raising \$2,500.00 in 1964 by taxes and \$2,000.00 to be borrowed and repaid in 1965. To further authorize the Selectmen to use any and all funds in the Russell Reservoir account (\$2,403.42) necessary to complete said bridge. A motion to accept as printed passed.

Recessed for lunch at 5:30 P.M. Called to order at 6:18 P.M.

- Art. 12. To vote shall the Zoning Ordinance as Proposed by the Planning Board be adopted by the Town. Vote to be by ballot. Result, Yes 78; No 71.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. A motion to accept the budget as printed on pages 12 & 13 of the Town Report passed.
- Art. 13. To hear reports of agents, Committees or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto. A motion to accept the various reports as printed in the Town Report passed.

Art. 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting. A motion to accept \$150.00 from Reginold and Archibald Mason for perpetual care of Cemetery Lot passed.

Discussion of a Capital Reserve Fund for a Fire Truck to start

in 1965.

A motion to give William F. Bemis a rising vote of appreciation for his 18 years of service on the School Committee was unanimous.

A report of progress in regards to Town History was given by Warren Thayer. No report from Frank Eastman, situation explained by Warren Thayer.

Chesham Beach Committee: Robert Lake, William Sawyer, Roy Williams. John Oja made an Honorary member.

A motion to give Ralph B. Bemis a standing ovation for his 30 years of service as Moderator was unanimous.

Lawrence W. Rathburn spoke about the Constitutional Convention and called attention to his questionnaire.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Harrisville for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1963-December 31, 1964: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1963 and December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Surplus decreased \$1,994.25 during 1964.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$886.74, plus a net unexpected balance of appropriations of \$3,694.01, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,580.75.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1964, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1964, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$3,805.75, from \$19,713.50 to \$23,519.25 during 1964, as shown herewith:

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second year, we experienced a rain fall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong. dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational — is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area — 4.350 000 acres — is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- 1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
 - 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts for the school year 1965-66 with the Union School District of Keene at the rate of five hundred thirty-five dollars (\$535.00) per pupil for high school and junior high school instruction, and with Marlboro School District at the

rate of four hundred eighty-nine dollars (\$489.00) per pupil for high school instruction and four hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$438.00) per pupil for junior high school instruction and with other approved schools.

- 7. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.
- 8. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to cover pupil cost expenses for grades five and six at Camp Union for the school year 1965-66.

HARRISVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

The School District Meeting opened March 5, 1964 at 3:00 P.M. Mr. William House, moderator, read the warrant and declared the polls opened for voting.

Article 1. Voting for school District Officers by Australian ballot.

Article 2. Motion was made and seconded that the salaries of School Board members and other officers to remain the same as last year with an amendment to pay the Truant Officer an additional Twenty (\$20) dollars a year.

Article 3. It was voted to accept reports as read,

Article 4. Motion was made and seconded to leave the choice of agents, auditors, committees and officers to the School Board.

Article 5. Motion was made that the School District raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,902.00 for the support of school, for the salaries of school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town. It was so voted.

Article 6. It was voted to authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts for the school year 1964-65 with the Union School District of Keene at the rate of five hundred twenty three (\$523.00) per pupil for high school instruction and five hundred five dollars (\$505.00) per pupil for junior high school instruction, and with Marlboro School District at the rate of four hundred sixty-seven dollars (\$467.00) per pupil for high school instruction and three hundred eleven dollars (\$311.00) per pupil for junior high school instruction and with other approved schools.

Article 7. It was moved that the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the state of New Hampshire.

Article 8. Motion was made and seconded to create according to the provisions of RSA 195-A:3 an area school planning committee consisting of three qualified voters of whom at least one shall be a member of the school board. The members of the committee shall serve without pay for a term ending at the third annual meeting of the district following the creation of the committee. An amendment was made to have the Moderator appoint the three member committee.

The business meeting closed at 8:00 with a motion to recess and close polls to voting at 8:45. It was so carried.

The current enrollment shows a total of 110 enrolled in grades one through twelve. This represents a decrease of five over a year ago. The elementary enrollment decreased by seven whereas the secondary enrollment increased by two. These statistics confirm the statement in the last annual report regarding possible enrollments this year.

Concerning future enrollments, it must be remembered that the statistics do not take into account possible repeaters, dropouts, or transfers. The figures are the result of projecting current information which is subject to change at any time. Although projecting enrollments has limitations, it does appear that the trend in Harrisville shows a fairly stable school population. Next year's enrollments may show a slight increase in the high school area. However, this appears to be so slight as to be insignificant.

SCHOOL FACILITIES: The Wells Memorial School continues to accommodate our elementary school children most satisfactorily. Besides the regular program of building maintenance, a new roof was put on last summer.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: Our elementary children are being taught in a modern, healthy environment by capable teachers using up to date tools of learning. This is basic and should be maintained. Specialized instruction by the Massachusetts Audubon Society as well as the Camp Union Program enriches the Science curriculum.

An Area School Planning Board together with administrators in the area have been studying the feasibility of an arrangement whereby increased educational benefits may be guaranteed our secondary school young people. This group has put in many hours studying all possibilities and, it is hoped, will ultimately recommend a proposal which will best meet the needs of our youth at the most reasonable cost.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils and pare nts, the School Board, and the patrons of our school for their understanding and cooperation.




