TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Meredith qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on the thirteenth day of March, 1928, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, two Auditors, Collector of Taxes, Police Officer, Traffic Officer, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, two Library Trustees for three years and Prosecuting Agent.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges, and specific the same shall be laid out.
 - 4. To see what sums of money the town will raise toward the maintenance of highways under state aid.
 - 5. To see what sums of money the town will raise for Trunk Line maintenance.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept State.
Aid or set aside a permanent improvement fund of \$1,826.25.

.7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for sidewalks.

8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town charges.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward eradicating the White Pine Blister Rust, the State Forester requesting the sum of \$400.00.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray the expenses of Memorial Day, and specify how the same shall be expended.

11. To see how much money the town will raise toward defraying the expenses of the Town Library.

12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of firemen, and the purchase of uniform coats therefor, and the protection of property in Meredith Village Fire District.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1300.00 toward defraying the expenses of a District Nurse. (By request)

14. To see what action the town will take toward completing the park on Winnipesaukee street.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for the benefit of the Laconia Hospital. (By request)

- 16. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day observance.
- To see what sum of money the town will raise for permanent improvement on the Devil's Den road, so called, leading from New Hampton village to North Sanbornton, (By request)
- To see if the town will vote to appropriate the \$500.00 voted last year to meet a like sum from the Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of advertising our agricultural, industrial and recreational advantages.
 - 19. To see if the town will vote to construct a sidewalk next the new fence and entrances to be erected at Plymouth Street Cemetery. (By request)
 - To see if the town will vote that the Selectmen shall appoint the Police and Traffic Officers after March 1929. (By request)
 - 21. To see if the town will vote to purchase a tractor or tractors for use on the highways for breaking and other purposes, and raise money therefor.
 - 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise for permanent improvement on the Meredith Neck road.
 - To see what action the town will take relative to renting or leasing the Town Hall.

24. To see if the town will vote to accept and raise \$200.00 to improve and fence a piece of land given the Meredith Center School for a playground. (By request of the Meredith Center School and Community Organization.)



Auditors' Report

We, the undersigned Auditors of Meredith, have examined the foregoing accounts of the Selectmen and found them well cast and properly vouched.

F. L. HAWKINS, RALPH N. PIPER.

AN EXPLANATION

The laws of our State make it imperative that we guard the public safety on our highways, regardless of expense. To this end we have made some extensive changes and improvements.

At the instigation of our state authorities, who cooperated with us, and believing it to be the opportune time, we took up land at and in the vicinity of the junction of Main, Plymouth and Winnipesaukee streets, and widened the highways in that locality, at a cost to the town of about \$3,750.

On the highways throughout the town, partly by reason of flood washouts, an additional expense of approximately \$3,000. was made.

The absolute necessity for the extra outlay of the above, amounting to nearly \$7,000. is now done away with and the savings that may be made the coming year and the years following, should largely reduce the burden of taxation.

By reason of the curbing at the Library lawn and sidewalk tipping toward the street, and the brick on the sidewalk broken, worn and out of position, we felt it more economical to adjust the stone work and lay the walk in concrete, than to allow it to become more and more dangerous and in need of repair.

One of the greatest savings of money has been made by the purchase of a Compressor at a cost of \$1,239. This Compressor has the facility for drilling that is surprising. On the state highways one half of the drilling is paid for by the State and already its earning capacity has made quite a start toward paying the cost.

We laid a new sidewalk on Lang Street, the old one being partly under water in wet weather, and aside from the general public traveling over it, we had in mind the children who attend school in the new building thereon, and laid a crossing from the sidewalk to the school entrance.

And so we might enumerate many other necessities of minor importance that made extra expense.

We trust the criticisms that have come to us were not born of party politics, which should not be allowed to enter town affairs, rather than from sound investigation and the honest judgment of those who have the public interests at heart, by guarding and protecting life and property first, and against the expense attending the loss of either or both.

Be that as it may we welcome the truth and stand ready to defend ourselves in the course we have taken.

Report of Librarian, Meredith Public Library

To the Trustees of the Library and Citizens of Meredith:

The passing years have demonstrated without a doubt that our library has justified its existence by its usefulness to the public. Much more remains to be done and there are still residents of our town who do not realize how many interesting books of non-fiction may be found on our shelves and how great an opportunity is presented for adults to continue their education thru the use of the library. Our summer residents often express surprise to find such a good collection of books in so small a town.

The library is a popular place with high school students and every evening a goodly number are found seated at the tables. Little children too are among our constant readers and several new ones are always added after they come to the "Story Hour," held every November. For a number of years we have observed Children's Book Week, with a special display of juvenile books and story hours for the grades. We have been fortunate in securing the services of such skillful story tellers as Mrs. Beede, Mrs. Lovett and Mrs. Ward. These occasions might come oftener, but as we have no children's room they have to be held outside library hours. Last fall the Woman's Club was invited to meet at the library during Children's Book Week and at that time boys and girls from the 6th grade gave a little play on the care of books.

In August, a Benefit was given for the library by Camp Wotanda at Grange Hall. This was a most pleasing entertainment and netted the library the sum of \$39.00.

Your librarian endeavors to keep in touch with modern library work and so visits larger libraries whenever possible, attends state and neighborhood meetings and in 1926 attended the summer library school at Durham.

The chief event of the past year has been the completion of the card catalog, which has been a long task owing to the fact that the work must largely be done out of library hours. For the past two years the librarian has spent the equivalent of one extra day a week on this work. It was found necessary to buy a new case for the cards and this is large enough to last several years. Gifts from friends aided in the purchase of this cabinet.

Fifteen magazines and papers have been regularly contributed the past year. Local donors thus remembering us are Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Hewitt, Mrs. Eva Blake, Mr. Ernest Small, Mr. Edwin Cox, and the Meredith News. In addition to these periodicals the library subscribes for 18 magazines, so our tables are well supplied with reading matter and these magazines are also loaned to the public.

Gifts of money have been received from Mrs. Leonard Tufts, Camp Wotanda and Mrs. Mary Ward. Books have been donated by Mr. and Mrs. John Ide, Mrs. Ernest Wilkins, Mrs. Eva Blake, Frederick Maguire, Mrs. M. L. Read of Quincy, Mr. Geo. McCrillis and Mrs. D. W. Coe of Center Harbor.

I herewith submit a report of the work done by your District Nurse during the year 1927:

Nine patients were taken to the hospital and one patient brought back from hospital.

Throughout the year Meredith has been remarkably free from contagious diseases. Measles cases were well cleared up by the end of January. During the summer and fall there were a few scattering cases of whooping cough.

There have been frequent examinations for pediculosis, but only two cases have been found.

Two health talks have been given in the lower grades and a talk on "Nursing as a Vocation" to the Juniors and Seniors in High School.

In preparation for a State Board toxin antitoxin clinic, the district nurse made home calls with Miss Sanderson. Notice of the clinic was spread as widely as possible through the local paper, the pulpits and posters. Thirty-nine children were given the series of innoculations by Dr. Weaver on March 22, 29, April 5 and 12. Miss Sanderson and the district nurse assisted Dr. Weaver. On December 12, the 39 children thus immunized against diphtheria were given the Schiek test. The readings of December 19 showed all tests negative.

On July 22nd was held a health conference for examination of babies and children of pre-school age. Thirty-six were weighed, measured and examined by Dr. Alice Normandin, assisted by Miss Sanderson, Miss Garland and the district nurse.

During September all school children were weighed and measured. Miss Garland and the nurse visited homes of all who were 10 percent or more underweight and advised the parents to send the underweight children to the tuberculosis and underweight clinic to be held at the Lang street school October 11. At this clinic Dr. Kerr examined 83 of these children and found seven in need of further attention. Several adults availed themselves of the opportunity to be examined at this time.

One hundred fifty-five pupils of the four lower grades have been given a full physical examination by Dr. F. L. Hawkins and the nurse. The following defects have been found and parents notified of same

FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND SCHOOL BUDGET

To the Voters in the Meredith School District:

A statement relative to the financial condition of the district may be in order.

There was raised by taxation at the March meeting in 1926, the amount of \$30,913.57. Of this amount a part was advanced by the selectmen and expended before the beginning of the school year July 1st, 1926. There was left practically \$25,000.00 for the school year 1926-27, plus rent, tuitions, etc., which amounted to \$2,880.92.

There was appropriated at the March meeting 1927. \$34.114.27. Of this amount \$6,255.00 had been paid over to the school treasurer prior to July 1st, 1927, which amount included the special appropriation of \$3.000.00 for deficit, and \$2.755.00 for notes and interest, due in Boston, July 1st. This left for the school year 1927-28 \$27,859.27. The selectmen have up to this time turned over to the treasurer the amount of \$20,-325.50. This leaves \$7.533.77 still to be received. This amount plus about \$550.00 now in the treasury, and upwards of \$2,000.00 in tuitions, (impossible to state exactly now), and a small amount of rent, constitutes that which will be available to finish the year. June 30, 1928. This is doubtless ample to meet all obligations except notes and interest. The amount of \$2.692.50 comes due July 1st, but needs actually to be in the hands of the treasurer just before that date in order to be in Boston by July 1st.

The final payment on the gymnasium has been made during the year. The outstanding obligations of the district are as follows: Loan of 1914, High School, \$7,000.00, payable \$1,000.00 annually, Jan. first, interest at 4 percent.

Loan of 1925, Lang Street School, \$26,000.00, payable \$2,000.00 annually, July 1st, interest at $4\frac{1}{4}$ percent.

The following is the budget recommended for the school year 1928-29:

For support of elementary schools, \$5.00 per \$1,000.00 of equalized valuation.

To the Board of Education and Citizens of Meredith:

A comparison of this 1928 report with the similar report of last year will disclose few if any radical changes in our high school. Nevertheless we believe that substantial progress has been made, and it is our hope that within the following pages you will see the results of healthy growth.

Registration of Pupils

The total registration of pupils at this date is 166 which is an increase of 10 over that of a year ago. The following table shows the distribution according to classes.

Attendance

The selection for this honor is left to the teaching staff, but the winner must have high qualifications in scholarship, ideals, and loyalty to M. H. S. as laid down by definite written guides.

School Organization

The list of active school organizations is like that of last year. It includes the Athletic Association, boys' basketball team, girls' basketball team, baseball team, The Pinnacle, student council, girls' glee club, boys' glee club, and orchestra. Each organization is active and making definite and successful progress.

Miscellaneous

For the fourth consecutive winter the Domestic Arts Department is serving hot lunches during the noon hour. One of the Domestic Arts classes is also selling at cost milk and apples during the forenoon recess.

National Educational Week in November was appropriately observed by an evening session of the 5th and 6th grades. Over a hundred guests were present to see the classes in action. On other days during the week daily chapel exercises were conducted and special exhibits were held.

The winner of the second annual Lincoln essay contest was Ruth Lloyd '29. She was presented the famous Volk medallion of Abraham Lincoln, at a chapel exer-

cise held on Monday, February 13. The winner of the first contest in 1927 was Dorothy Batchelder, who was presented with the Volk medalion at the commencement exercises last June.

Through the efforts of the English department two events new to Meredith High School will be conducted. "College Week" will be a time when undergraduates can become better acquainted with the colleges and universities in New England. Exhibits from these institutions will be shown.

The Prize Speaking Contest will come later. At this time representatives from the various classes will compete in a contest open to the public.

For the fourth year the Athletic Association is conducting an entertainment course of five numbers. The organization takes this orportunity of giving its thanks and appreciation for the splendid support of the town's citizens.

We take pride in mentioning the following state honors won by M. H. S. pupils during the past year.

Emily Perkins '28 gained the distinction of being the leading girl in New Hampshire in Boys' and Girls' Club Work. As an award she was New Hampshire's representative at the Club Congress held in connection with the last National Livestock Show at Chicago.

The three pupils from M. H. S., who submitted papers in the 1927 State W. C. T. U. Essay Contest, carried away honors.

Beatrice Howland '29 was winner of the first award in the Sophomore-Freshman group, Byron Stickles, ex '31 was winner of first award in the 7th and 8th grade group, and Mary Mansfield '28 won honorable mention in the Senior-Junior group.

Conclusion:

Someone has truly said: "The school is the foundation of the nation. If the American school fails, America will fail. Education is the mother of civilization. Where there has been no education there has been no civilization. Civilization has come down thru the ages in a chariot built by the forces of education."

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Meredith:

In these reports I have given great prominence to attendance records. This is because I know that we cannot be secured without the cheerful and intelligent cooperation of parents. It certainly has been very gratifying to sense the very much improved attitude in this respect. Almost never now do we meet with a parent who thinks that we are distatorial, or impertinent, or fussy, when we insist on regular attendance.

The record at the Meredith Neck School is very commendable. The average attendance of 97.8 p. c. was the highest in the town and it was the only school with no case of tardiness.

It is of course much better to be tardy than absent, but it is also true that there is generally a high attendance where there are few cases of tardiness.

At Meredith Center the attendance was poor, though there was a considerable improvement over the previous year. The outlook is much more promising this year for there is an aroused community spirit which is actively seeking better conditions.

It is certainly to be hoped that the District will aid liberally toward making the Center School a model in attractiveness, equipment and safety.

Lang St. School is well repaying the investment. I wish that more of the townspeople would visit there. You need not be afraid of taking your company for you will see work, teaching and equipment of which you may well be proud.

Headmaster Nelson in his admirable report tells of the work of the High School.

When we consider the high standing which the school has attained and then know that it has been reached at the lowest per pupil cost of any high school in the state, we may well congratulate ourselves.
