To the School Board and Citizens of New Durham:

I herewith submit my annual report of the work of the public schools.

Statistics for the school year ending June 30, 1924, are as follows: Number of pupils, 73; boys, 35; girls, 38. Grade I, 19; grade II, 11; grade III, 8; grade IV, 8; grade V, 7; grade VI, 6; grade VII, 8; grade VIII, 6. Visits by school board members, 11; by superintendent, 42; by citizens, 116; school board meetings, 6. Number of children registered this school year: Miss Neal's

room, 25; Miss Wilson's room, 30; Mrs. Fuhrman's room, 18; Mrs. Dealand's room, 7; total, 80. About 15 moved away before the end of the fall term.

REPAIRS

The buildings at the Ridge and South were painted during the summer and other necessary repairs made. A new flagpole was erected at the Plains school-house.

PROGRESS

Teachers are the same as last year, with one exception, and all are doing well. We are fortunate again.

Pay entertainments have been conducted by all of the schools with exceptional interest on the part of the people. The funds have been given to noon lunches or other improvements in the schools.

Presumably the \$5 tax may about carry us through next year unless state aid is materially lowered.

My appreciation increases from year to year for the increase in interest on the part of New Durham toward her public schools.
