NOTES

WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg, in the County of Coos, in the said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Pittsburg, on Tuesday, the 13th. day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget, and raise money for the same.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to distribute blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and raise money for the same.
- To see if the Town will vote to elect a committee to set the date and manage the Old Home Day observance.
- 6. To see what action the Town will take in regard to skating rinks, and raise money for the same.
- 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Colebrook-Conn. Lakes Chamber of Commerce and raise money for the same.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to be laid out on the so-called Beedy road. (to land now owned by William P. Carpenter.)
- To see if the Town will vote to replace with new water pipe the water line that starts at the main line back of Wilbur L. Hilliards and runs to the Jim Curtis place,

on Mill Street, and a branch line that goes to the socalled Bertha Robie house, now owned by Louis Beauchemin, and raise money for the same. (By petition)

- 10. To see if the People of the Town will vote to combine the three road districts into one district with one Road Agent. (By Petition)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to exempt the Church and Parsonage and The Grange from paying water rent.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to sell the old fire truck.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all necessary Town Officers, not listed under Article 14.
- 14. To bring your ballots for the election of one Selectman for three years, one Road Agent for the Lake District, one Road Agent for the middle District, one Road Agent for the Lower District, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, three Auditors, one overseer of Welfare, one Library trustee, and one Trustee of Trust Funds.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Polls shall be opened at 10 a.m. and not closed before 6 p.m.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Pittsburg

FOREWORD

As we continue to be told by professionals and laymen alike how public education should be and can be made more effective, it is interesting to note that about the only point upon which there is agreement to any extent is that of needed change. In respect to subject matter content, its method of presentation, and for what purpose, opinions come from as many quarters as the winds of the sky with shifts in their direction just about as often. One thing is sure, however, they keep us on the move, which calls for more attention being devoted to where we are trying to go, if there is to be any assurance that travel is to be in the right direction.

This direction in turn, is going to be determined largely by the selection of our educational goal. Of the many lines of thought expressed on this choice, two stand out. One holds that with the relatively short time available during the calendar year for formal school training, that the school should subordinate all its other generally accepted functions of today, and concentrate on the job it alone can do of developing the intellectual equipment of every child to its maximum point. In contrast to this stand, deemed by some to be too realistic, the other holds a more idealistic point of view. It maintains that the ultimate goal of our educational effort is wisdom-the ability to make wise independent decisions based upon accurate facts, clear reasoning, and complete understanding. As can readily be seen, although this goal, too, calls for the same universality in education, it is appreciably wider in scope. The implication is that education is more than mere training, more even than adjustment to the world as it is. It points to an educated individual prepared to take part in remaking his world by making sound decisions in whatever situations with which he may be faced. As can be seen, as meritorious as are the concepts embodied in either or both of these goals, the degree to which achievement is accomplished will be determined to the extent the human side is recognized in working toward their attainment.

TEACHERS

Three new teachers have joined the faculty at our school. Mrs. Dorothy P. Parker, an experienced teacher who received her training at Keene Teachers College, teaches Home Economics and General Science and coaches Girls' Athletics. Mrs. JoAnn P. Davis, a Plymouth Teachers College graduate with a number of years of experience within this supervisory union, teaches English, Social Studies, and Mathematics in Grades 7-8. Mrs. Rosalie Hawes, a graduate of Lyndon Teachers College in Vermont, teaches Grades 3-4.

The teachers returning to work with Grades 7-12 with respective subjects taught are: Principal Charles H. Morgan, Social Studies; Mrs. Helen Barclay, English, French; Mrs. Katherine B. von Dohrmann, Commerce; Stephen E. Dehl, Mathematics, Science, Boys' Athletics; Raymond P. Stuart, Shop, Dramatics. The two returning teachers in the first six grades are Mrs. Eva S. Scott, Grades 1-2; and Mrs. Doris J. Chappell, Grades 5-6.

SCHOOL NURSE-HEALTH

The overall general good health exhibited by the pupils in our schools during the past several months, while our school nurse was confined at her home recovering from a major operation, emphatically indicates the importance of the work she has done.

It has been only through the conducting of frequent clinics, the administering of periodic immunizations, the giving of successive complete physical examinations, and the maintenance of constant check-up and continuous supervision procedures of a comprehensive health program operated over a prolonged period of time, that such good fortune could be experienced.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

Although the number of pupils enrolled in the high school is slightly larger than it was a year ago, the number enrolled in the elementary grades is enough less to make the total enrollment smaller. For purposes of comparison, the number of pupils enrolled in Grades 1-8 and 9-12 for the past five years beginning with the current year shows successive counts of 113 and 38, 120 and 36, 113 and 41, 115 and 62, 102

and 67. Ten secondary tuition pupils from Clarksville are enrolled at the present time. The average percentage of atten dance for the past year was 95.39 in Grades 1-6; 95.87 in Grades 7-8; and 96.89 in Grades 9-12. The average number of tardinesses per pupil for the same groups was .02, .67 and .48 respectively. Both the excellent attendance record and the small number of tardinesses for the entire school are commendable.

NOTES ON BUDGET

The School Board's budget for 1962-63 is \$90,160 in comparison to \$86,756 for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$6,000 which leaves \$84,160 to be raised by taxes by the town as compared to \$81,756 for this year. Provision for salary increases, for the most part, explains the increase in the budget.

GROUNDS - BUILDING EQUIPMENT

During the summer vacation period, the play area at the rear of the building was further improved upon and extended by the addition of more loam. A backstop was erected, also, of wire supported upon iron piping in back of the catcher's position on the baseball field.

Building repair work done since a year ago included the resurfacing of deteriorated window ledges; further strengthening of the backboard supports of the basketball basket at the West end of the auditorium-gymnasium; the building of and the fastening to the front wall of the stairwell leading to this same area of a beautiful trophy case; and the installation of bookshelves in the high school study hall. The provision of this much needed storage space for books has both encouraged greater use of available reference material and added to the overall attractive appearance of the room.

New items of equipment added include a ballot box and voting booth for use in the election of the school district officers at annual meetings by the non-partisan balloting system; a guard for the power saw in Shop; two typewriters and a liquid duplicator for Commerce; and a power lawn mower to help care for the school grounds.

MISCELLANEOUS

As has been stated previously, the work done in the var-

ious extra-class and extra-curricular activities contributes much to the overall life of the school. It is through participation in them, oftentimes, that interests are aroused and potentialities discovered which otherwise would never be known.

The continued patronage of the school lunch program over a long period of time by a large percentage of the school membership indicates the popularity of this health and morale building school activity. The operator, Mrs Helen A. Foote, through her hard work, has contributed very materially to the success of this program.

CONCLUSION

May I again express my deep appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the assistance and cooperation received as we have worked together during the past several years in our joint effort to provide and maintain high standards in our schools.
