## Town Warrant

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 11th, to act upon the subjects herein after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of town officers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the matter of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consederation and action.

- 1. To choose by ballot the following town officers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for three years; and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two constables, two sextons and one trustee for the cemetery trust funds.
- 2. To see if the town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other town officers required by law.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Election and Registration expenses.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Insurance.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100 for Police Department expenses.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300 for Fire Expenses of the Town.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will

vote to raise for:

(a) General Expenses of the Highway Department

(b) Snow Removal

- (c) Town Maintenance
- (d) Maintaining Tarred Roads
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to tar the road built last year in Stark with T. R. A. funds and raise \$1,800 for the same.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$355.67 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$2,371.15.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library purposes.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Interest charges for the ensuing year.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of Cemeteries.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$550 for Street Lights for the ensuing year.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote for a discount of Three Per Cent for payment of taxes, if paid within ten days after tax bill has been presented.

19. The following article has been inserted by

petition:

"To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$41.82 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in co-operation with the other 45 towns in the region."

20. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

#### SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

Since taking over the School Health Program in early October it has been my aim to give the fiftytwo children in Stark Village and Crystal schools the same advantages as the children of Groveton have.

During these months all children have been brought into Groveton for a dental check. Parents have been notified of defects and those whose parents desired the corrections have had the opportunity at the subsequent clinics. This work has been completed, thus closing the Dental Program for 1957-58 except for some emergency.

Early December all who needed more shots to complete their polio immunization were brought in

to the State Clinic.

Vision and hearing tests have been done and

some vision corrections procured.

Thanks and praise are deserved by Mr. Gallant and numerous parents and teachers for their willing

generosity in transportation.

During the remainder of the school year the same privileges as have been extended, will be offered, such as TB patch test with X-ray following, if needed, and the triple-shot immunization for whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus.

Teachers and pupils have been very co-operative and the school as a whole very free from contagious

and skin diseases.

Remembering vividly, in my previous days of working in these schools, their inconveniences, I have been most agreeably impressed with the modern equipment which has been installed and which adds so much to the comfort and health of the children.

## Report of Public Health Nurse

December 26, 1957

To the Citizens of Stark:

During the year 1957, 3 Salk vaccine clinics were held in Groveton, sponsored by the N. H. State Department of Health in cooperation with the local School Nurse, and the Supt. of Schools. 95 children from Stark and Crystal attended these clinics, 20 children received first injections, 21 received second injections, and 54 received third injections.

In the spring, we held Triple Toxoid Clinics for the immunization of whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus, and the response from Stark and Crystal was very poor. We intend to hold these clinics again in 1958, and hope that more children will take ad-

vantage of this opportunity afforded them.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Stark and Crystal, and at this time I would like to thank them for their cooperation, and at any time I hope they will feel free to call on me if I can be of any service to them.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1957-1958

To the School Board and Citizens of Stark:

Once again it is time for the annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Stark. In addition to the statistical and financial data included in the report several specific items of information should be noted.

With money provided in the budget a new source of water supply was found at the Crystal schoolhouse and toilet facilities and drainage system installed. This has proven much more satisfactory both in the quality of the water and the service provided.

At a very slight increase in cost and with the cooperation of the Groveton school bus it has been possible to arrange high school conveyance for Stark young people attending Groveton High School. This has made it possible for a larger number to attend and to make attendance more regular. The Board

plans to continue this service.

With money that was available the Board repaired the woodshed at the Stark School building and converted it into a kitchen for hot lunch. The program has been under the direction of Mrs. Althea Lunn who has served as cook as well as director. She has provided excellent meals which have been greatly enjoyed by the pupils. When first planned expected enrollment at the school was 44. Of this number almost all would participate in the lunch program. When school opened in September actual enrollment was 36. An average of 25 have been benefitted by the service. Even with generous contribution from Government surplus commodities the program is not quite self-supporting. The School Board has inserted an article in the Warrant, first, to see if the district wishes to continue the lunches. and second, to raise and appropriate necessary money to be used if needed.

The Dental Clinic has had its second successful year. Details are covered in the Nurse's report. This service meets such a felt need in the community that the Board plans to make it a regular part of the

school program.

Although the grade school enrollment has de-

creased as shown by the grade placement chart included elsewhere in this report high school enrollment has increased. Fifteen are now attending and there will be twenty-three eligible for next year. Since tuition is a legal commitment on the district the Board is forced to recommend an amount to cover this many in the budget. The increase from \$22,357.00 in 1957-58 to \$26,026.00 for next year is almost exactly the difference in the amount to be raised for tuition.

The Board was sorry to lose the services of Mr. Philip Stearns by resignation. It will be necessary to elect a member for two years to complete the term as well as the regular three year member.

Comparative testing has again been carried on in our schools during the year. We compare well with state and local averages and a few of our children are doing remarkably well in high school. The Board members have attended a number of professional meetings to keep in touch with what is going on in education. They are to be complimented on their interest and activity. There is a close cooperation between the Board, the teachers, and the parents and children.

Thank you for this opportunity to report.
