THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown. in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, 2. and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration

 - (d) Municipal Court.
 (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
 (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 (g) Health Department.

 - (h) Town Dump.
 - (i) Vital Statistics.
 - (i) General Expense of Highway.
 - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (1) Interest on bonds.
 - (m) County Tax.
 - (n) Payment on bonds.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of poor.

- 4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand two hundred (\$1,200.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incure debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of at a public auction any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deed.
- 13. To bring up Article 15 in the March 13th, 1951
 Warrant which was laid on the table indefinitely which reads as follows:
 To raise the sum of \$600.00 for water pump
 and hose for fire protection at Diamond Ponds.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to install a traffic light at the intersection of the Daniel Webster Highway and Main Street in West Stewartstown and to raise money for same.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter,, newspaper and advertising and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages for the Town in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountain Region.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the improvement of the West Stewartstown Memorial Park.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-Partisan ballot.
- 18. To choose by Non-Partisan ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Three Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (g) One or more Sextons.
 - (h) Overseer of Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Stewartstown qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notiled to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 8th day of March, 1952, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against

said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to accept, for playground purposes, a tract of land immediately adjoining the present site of the Hollow School.
- 10. If the preceding article is adopted, to see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate to improve and equip said tract of land for playground use.
- 11. To see what action the district will take relative to the transportation of high school pupils and to see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for this purpose.
- 12. To see if the school district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the school district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20 to defray the school district's share of the cost thereof.
- 13. If the foregoing article is adopted to see if the school district will authorize the School Board to execute on behalf of the school district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the school district will designate the School District Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

Foreword

During this period of extreme uncertainty and concern for the future, a period of continually rising educational costs, it would seem that it might be well for us to consider briefly the over-all responsibility of our schools. It has been long recognized that one very important job is to provide the pupil with those tools of learning which will enable him or her to obtain and comprehend information to the extent that it may be used in subsequent steps in the learning process. For example, the child is taught how to read, write and to work with numbers in the early grades in order that he or she may become proficient in the use of these very necessary tools of learning during the following years. At any one of the sequential steps up the educational ladder, it is possible to determine more or less accurately the degree of understanding and retention of the concepts assimilated. Generally speaking, we are fairly sure of what has been learned academically, as the results can be seen, and of how it was learned insofar as observed activities are concerned, for we set them up

As important as is the function of the school to help pupils to acquire the above mentioned factual information, however, of vastly greater importance

is any assistance that may be given in the development of the attitudes, sound judgment and emotional stability which, in turn, will result in a type of conduct that tends to produce wholesome, happy and welladjusted individuals in society. To say it another way, possibly there is as much evidence about us which seems to indicate that there is perhaps as much likelihood of constructive application being used in a given situation, as a result of learning how to do a certain kind of work well, as there is from the impressions gained by studying and discussing a particular concept at length. In other words, the chances of inculcating principles of good citizenship to the extent that they will be exemplified in action sometimes seem to be even more apt to stem from the proficiency developed in preparing for a chosen occupation or profession than from an exhaustive study of the value of these principles. If this is true, it would seem that there is need for additional emphasis upon supplementing the portraval of our educational concepts by setting in motion, insofar as is possible, practical procedures to accomplish the desired objectives. In the final analysis then, our primary concern is to bridge the gap, if there be one, between the theoretical acceptance of our educational ideals and their actual accomplishment by doing all that we can to provide the required training techniques.

Teachers

We are again very fortunate, when the shortage of elementary teachers continues to be alarmingly critical, to be able to keep our veteran workers. Doris J. Chappell, Grades 5-8, and Harriet O. Gray, Grades 1-4, are at the Cedar Brook and Hollow Schools respectively. At the West Stewartstown School, the staff consists of Velma H. Gray, Principal, Grades 7-8; Junie S. Aldrich, Grades 4-6; and Cleora M. Richardson, Grades 1-3.

School Nurse

Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, R. N., employed to fill the

vacancy in the school nurse's position in this supervisory union created by the resignation of Phoebe H. Stevens, is well known in this area for the stellar work she has done during the past several years. A graduate of the Massachusetts General Hospital School of Nursing, Mrs. Sturgis is a veteran nurse with extensive experience in private, community, and institutional work in Washington, D. C., as well as in this and other states.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget and requested appropriation for 1952-53 is \$38,743 as compared to \$33,992 for this year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$4004 which leaves a balance of \$34,739 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$30,514 for the current year. For the most part, the substantial increase in this year's budget is explained, as will be noted in the budget breakdown found on subsequent pages in this report, by provision for the transportation of high school pupils, cost of grading a playground area at the Hollow School, and for increases in tuition rates and salaries.

Buildings and Equipment

In continuing the policy of keeping the buildings in a good state of repair and maintenance, considerable work has been done during the past year. At the Cedar Brook School the heating and comfort of the building has been helped materially by the insulation of the ceiling. Both sides of the roof were shingled, and the interior was redecorated at the Hollow School. Work at the West Stewartstown Building included painting both the room presently occupied by Grades 4-6 and the girl's basement, and the construction of a platform for use in the presentation of the different school programs. Also, such minor repairs as were necessary were made in each building which included the varnishing of all desk tops.

Playgrounds

New combination steel swing and see-saw units have been purchased and installed on the playgrounds at all schools, and basketball backboards have been built and put up for use by the upper grades at the Cedar Brook and West Stewartstown Schools. The availability and use of this equipment, for play activities during the recess and noon periods, as well as before the opening and closing time of the school day, contributes greatly to the over-all life of the school.

The playground equipment at the West Stewarts-town School has been supplemented by the addition of a new metal slide unit for use, particularly, by the primary grades. This was made possible through the interest and all the time given and work done by the parents and friends of the pupils, especially Mr. and Mrs. Woodrow W. Gamsby, in raising the necessary funds for its purchase.

Through the generosity of Darwin M. Brooks in giving a piece of land immediately adjoining the site on which the building sets, the playground facilities at the Cedar Brook School have been greatly increased. The preparation of this land for school use was made by the district. An area approximately 90 feet by 175 feet was dug out of the hillside with a bulldozer, after which ditches were made for drainage and the surface was graded with sand. Due to the embankment on two sides of the excavation, it was necessary to enclose two sides only with fence.

The many advantages provided by the new Cedar Brook playground show the need of a similar one at the Hollow School. Leonard E. Owen has generously offered an area immediately adjoining the south side of the lot on which the building now sits for this purpose. The necessary articles for consideration of its acceptance and for the cost of grading are included in the warrant printed on preceding pages in this report.

Enrollment and Attendance

The number of pupils enrolled in our schools has decreased slightly since last year, as indicated by a total enrollment of 98 at the time of this writing in contrast to 102 a year ago. A breakdown of this present number shows that there are 58 at the West Stewartstown School, 22 at the Hollow School and 18 at the Cedar Brook School. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year in the same order as listed was 97.10, 91.18, and 93.36 while the average number of tardinesses per pupils for the same period was 1.01, .28 and .00.

Tuition Pupils

As was anticipated a year ago at this time, the number of pupils taking secondary work outside the district has continued to increase. At the time of this writing there are 25 at Canaan High School and 18 at Colebrook Academy to make a total of 43 as compared to 41 last year.

In addition to these high school pupils 2 elementary pupils, also, are attending school outside the district. Since they live on the Diamond Pond Farm, it is more economical to assign them to the Kidderville School in East Colebrook rather than to send them to the East Stewartstown Schools

Legislation

Generally speaking, little change occurred in the state aid picture as a result of any action taken by the State Legislature at the last session. The district will receive, however, opproximately \$700 more each year during the present two year period than it did during each of the previous two years, which will be of material help.

Conclusion

May I again express my sincere appreciation to

the members of the School Board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help and cooperation received in our work together to maintain high standards in our schools.
