THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Westmoreland in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Westmoreland on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

2A. To bring in your votes for the election of delegates-at-large, alternate delegates-at-large, district delegates, alternate district delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for president and vice-president of the United States.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the budget committee under the authority of the municipal budget act. (This budget may be considered item by item or as a whole but may not be increased more than ten percent in any item as a whole).

4. To hear the reports of agents and auditors, and take any action thereto.

*5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$548.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

6. To see if the Town will vote for snow removal and sanding on either Class V or Class VI roads or take any other action relating thereto to raise and appropriate money for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote for Class IV and Class V roads; construction, reconstruction or betterment aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.10 which is 15% of the State apportionment, and the State contributing \$4,667.32.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to what is required by law for highways and bridges.

*9. To see if the Town will vote to close, subject to gates and bars, the road from above the barn of Alonzo Hudson to the Walpole Town line, known as the Wentworth Road.

10. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the income of the Jotham Lord Fund.

11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the support of the Library.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the upkeep of the cemeteries.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$96.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means of calling attention to the resources and

natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

14. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

TOWN MEETING

MARCH 10, 1959

The meeting was opened by the Moderator, Paul D. King, at 9:17 o'clock A.M. He read the warrant. It was moved, seconded and carried that Article 1 would remain open for the duration of the meeting. The polls were declared closed by the Moderator at 6:05 o'clock P.M.

Under Articles 2 and 3 it was moved by Mr. A. F. Hudson and seconded by Mr. Conrad Adams that the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee be accepted, carried by voice vote.

Owing to the fact, as explained by Selectman A. Paine, that certain items in the budget, if appropriated, would have to be raised by taxation and not by borrowing, and thus increase the tax rate to about \$9.00 or more, Mr. Hudson moved that Articles 2 and 3 be reconsidered and taken up item by item, seconded by Mrs. Gerould and carried by show of hands: 50 yes, 6 no.

Article 4. It was voted to accept the reports of agents and auditors.

Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for snow removal and sanding on either Class V or Class VI roads.

Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$701.94 for Class IV and Class V roads.

Article 8. This article was passed over by voice vote.

Article 9. It was voted to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Jessie N. Ball Joslin Trust Fund for the Lovell G. and Elizabeth Reynolds Keith lot in North Cemetery of Westmoreland, N. H., the income from same to be used for the upkeep and perpetual care of the above lot.

Article 10. This article was not approved by show of hands vote: 24 yes, 30 no.

Article 11. This article was not approved by voice vote.

Article 12. It was voted to use the income from the Jotham Lord Fund for the support of the Library.

Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the Library.

Articles 14 and 15 were considered together. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$275.00 for the two articles.

Article 16. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to buy culvert and to straighten the sharp corner on hill of Olin Clayton's road.

Article 17. This article was not approved.

Article 18. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to buy culvert and to fix the approach to Cooke's road on Route 12, and to get what funds we can from the state for this work.

Article 19. It was moved by Robert Cox that this

article be approved and the sum of \$250.00 allotted from Town Officers' Expenses as an initial sum to be used for this work. Seconded and carried by show of hands vote: 35 yes, 29 no.

Article 20. This article was passed over as Selectman Warren announced he had a good garbage disposal unit he will donate to the town.

Article 21. No action was taken on this article.

Article 22. It was voted to have the road agents and selectmen prepare estimates and recommendations and report at a Special Town Meeting to be held during the summer.

Article 23. Passed over, as no sum of money or vote of amortization was included in the article.

Article 24. This article was approved by voice vote.

Article 25. Under this article it was voted to authorize the selectmen and tax collector to allow the Edgar French Estate to be redeemed by Maurice and Ralph French on payment of all back taxes, costs and fees.

The Champney and Underwood wood lots are to be used by the town or disposed of at the discretion of the selectmen.

Article 26. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$97.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 27. No action was taken on this article.

Article 28. It was voted to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 29. This article was approved by voice vote.

Article 30. It was voted to rescind Article 27 adopted at Town Meeting of March 12, 1957.

Article 31. This article was defeated by a show of hands vote: 10 yes, 27 no.

Article 32. No action was taken on this article.

Article 33. No action was taken on this article.

Article 34. Carl Barrett moved that the selectmen be authorized to negotiate with town employees as to the hourly wage rates to be paid for various types of work to be done. Carried by voice vote.

John H. Terry, Jr. moved that the road agents work with the selectmen to prepare a long range plan for road improvement, to be published in the Town Report for the year ending December 31, 1959. This plan to be tentative only, and each project subject to individual approval of the town as occasion demands. Carried by voice vote.

Carl Barrett moved that the details of the road agents' reports be eliminated from the Town Reports as a saving of considerable expense in preparing the reports. Carried by voice vote.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district, on the 12th day of March, 1960 at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary school district officers for the ensuing year.
2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officers, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
5. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$72,000.00 for the purpose of erecting in that part of town known as the South Village a new elementary school and furnish and equip the same, and the grading of the lot, and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; to accept and use such funds of the district as are now available; and gifts which may be received to reduce the amount of the appropriation; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum

so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto.

6. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper and advisable in connection with the construction of the new elementary school and for the purchase and furnishings for same or to take any action thereon.

7. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

8. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to negotiate a tuition contract with the Walpole School District.

11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$605.00 for the purpose of paying the district's share of the salary and expense of a Helping Teacher to be employed by Supervisory Union #60.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SCHOOL MEETING

March 14, 1959

The meeting was called to order by the moderator, John Terry, who read the school warrant. The articles were then acted upon.

Article 1. through Article 4. The moderator declared the polls open until the close of the meeting, 6 p.m., for the election of officers for the ensuing year.

Article 5. Ruth Hatt made the motion, which was seconded and voted, that no action be taken on this article as it was included in the budget.

Article 6. Miss Gerould made the motion, which was seconded and voted, that the reports be accepted as printed in the Town Report. The building committee made a preliminary report under this article, with Carl Barrett speaking for the committee. The building committee consisting of Carl Barrett, Miss Theodora Gerould, Dr. Donald Jenkins, Kenneth Rounds, Mrs. Lawrence Leach and Alonzo Hudson.

Article 7. This article to be held open, if no objection, until the end of the voting.

Article 8. Carl Barrett made the motion, which was seconded and voted, to rescind the action to accept the minority report of the building committee voted at the August 2, 1958 Westmoreland School District Meeting. Carried by a voice vote.

Thomas Barrett made the motion, which was seconded and voted, that the meeting go on record with a rising vote of thanks, to Capt. Farrar and the former committee, for

the work and plans they had submitted.

Article 9. Alonzo Hudson made the motion, which was seconded, that the district vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$82,600.00 for the purpose of erecting in that part of town known as South Village, a six classroom elementary school, either as an addition to the present school or as a new elementary school and furnish and equip the same, and the grading of the lot, and the acquisition of and real property that may be necessary for its location; to use part of the sum raised and appropriated to accomplish alterations and improvements in the present village elementary school; to accept and use such funds of the district as are now available; and gifts which may be received to reduce the amount of the appropriation; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto.

Ballot clerks appointed to assist in counting the votes were Fenn Newell, Carrie Paine, and Mrs. Conrad Adams.

By a ballot vote—82 yes; 79 no. Motion lost.

Alonzo Hudson made the motion which was seconded that the district vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$63,800.00 for the purpose of erecting in that part of town known as the South Village, a four classroom elementary school, either as an addition to the present school or as a new elementary school and furnish and equip the same, and the grading of the lot, and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; to use part of the sum raised and appropriated to accomplish alterations and improvements in the present village elementary school; to accept and use such funds of the district as are now available, and gifts which may be received to re-

duce the amount of the appropriation; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto.

By a ballot vote—76 yes; 77 no. Motion lost.

Carl Barrett made the motion which was seconded that the district vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$38,300.00 for the purpose of erecting in that part of town known as the South Village, additional elementary facilities including two classrooms, as an addition and furnish and equip the same, and grading of the lot, and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary for its location; to use part of the sum raised and appropriated to accomplish alterations and improvements in the present village elementary school; to accept and use such funds of the district as are now available; and gifts which may be received to reduce the amount of the appropriation; and to vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the School Board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and any amendments thereto.

By a ballot vote—39 yes; 104 no. Motion lost.

Article 10. Carl Barrett made the motion which was seconded and voted that no action be taken under this article.

Article 11. Marjorie Hudson made the motion which

was seconded and voted that the district vote to authorize the school board to transfer the sum of \$3,000.00 to the capital reserve fund from the unencumbered surplus funds remaining on hand at the end of the school year 1958-1959.

Article 12. Carl Barrett made the motion which was seconded and voted that the budget items be taken item by item.

Carl Messer made the motion which was seconded and voted that the item for district officers be increased by \$121.50 (making the total \$345.00).

The motion was then made, seconded and voted that the remainder of the budget be taken as a whole.

Robert Moore, Jr. made the motion which was seconded and voted that the district vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58,516.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriations, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 13. The motion was made, seconded and voted that the school board be authorized to negotiate a tuition contract with the Keene School District.

Article 14. The motion was made, seconded and voted that the school board be authorized to negotiate a tuition contract with the Walpole School District.

Article 15. Marjorie Hudson made the motion which was seconded that the detailed financial report of the school district be omitted from the Town Report. Motion was lost by a voice vote.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

The following is my report for the year ending June 30, 1959.

- 94 pupils had vision tests given by the school nurse.
- 8 pupils received vision notices.
- 53 pupils had hearing tests given by the school nurse.
- 94 pupils were weighed and measured by the school nurse.
- 92 pupils were inspected by the school nurse.
- 39 pupils were found in need of dental care.
- 12 pupils attended pre-registration clinic.
- 19 pupils attended polio clinics.
- 24 pupils were checked for smallpox vaccination and necessary follow-up done.
- 89 pupils participated in tests for albumin and sugar.
- 93 pupils were instructed in dental health.

In studying the aims of the school health program one finds that health education is becoming another added aim to the list.

The aims of health education :

1. To instruct children and young people so that they may conserve and improve their own health.
2. To promote satisfactory understandings, attitudes and ways of behavior among parents and other adults so that they may maintain and improve the health of home and community.
3. To improve the individual and community life of the future: to work toward a better second generation and still better third generation.

Perhaps in this area we can integrate more health education into our daily living.

My sincere thanks to all who gave their time and effort to make this year a success.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Westmoreland :

I herewith submit my annual report as your Superintendent of Schools :

As I pointed out in my report last year discussion and thorough study of the necessity of having a new school is good procedure, however, continued disagreement will mean that Westmoreland will continue spending money on buildings that are no longer giving the service that should be given and not giving Westmoreland children the start in life that they should have.

A desire for economy is commendable, however, one should be certain that what appears to be economy is not false economy. A new school built now will probably serve the community for fifty years and a difference of \$10,000 in the cost which may well be the difference between a good and poor building amounts to about \$200 a year on a fifty year basis.

The Written Language Arts Syllabus developed by the teachers of Supervisory Union #60 has been placed in the hands of teachers to be used as a guide in their teaching of Language Arts.

Westmoreland teachers took part with other elementary teachers of the supervisory union at Walpole on January 7th in studying how to improve the mechanics of giving achievement tests and also how to use test results to better advantage. Two educational consultants from the California Test Bureau were in charge of this study.

Approval of the state plan under Title III of the National Defense Education Act was made in November.

Directions of procedure for school districts followed shortly and we are nearly ready to submit our local plan for the use of the federal funds available under this act. As soon as our plan is approved orders will be placed for the equipment to strengthen and improve the areas of mathematics and science.

School board members from Acworth, Alstead, Langdon, Marlow, Walpole and Westmoreland have met several times during the past year to study the possibilities of forming a cooperative district. The greatest interest appeared to be in a cooperative for grades 7-12 and it is hoped that each district meeting will indicate the extent of their interest in the accumulation of more information.

An article in the school warrant in regard to a Helping Teacher should be given serious consideration. It is presented with the view of giving citizens the opportunity to accept or reject what is considered to be a step toward improvement of our educational program.

It was decided at the December Supervisory Union meeting to request each school board to include an article in the school district warrant that would give the district's citizens an opportunity to consider the advisability of adding a helping teacher to the administrative staff of the supervisory union. This article is included in the warrant.

A Helping Teacher is an assistant to the Superintendent who usually spends the most of his or her time working to improve education at the elementary level. The guiding purpose of a Helping Teacher is the improvement of children's learning in school and the realization of this purpose is by helping the classroom teacher help the children. The classroom teacher is helped to develop her best potentialities. The Helping Teacher passes on to the classroom teacher the best of what is being done in other schools in the supervisory union and helps teachers keep abreast of the advances being made in curriculum and methods of teaching.

A helping teacher is an especially qualified teacher who has had a number of years of successful experience and

usually has a master's degree in education covering administration, supervision, child growth and development, curriculum study, guidance, special education, tests and measurements.

The work of the superintendent and helping teacher is closely integrated. They work cooperatively to promote the best possible educational program without duplication of effort.

Mrs. Sandra Whippie replaced Mrs. Theresa Taylor as teacher of grades three and four at the Village School. Mrs. Whippie taught in Munsonville in 1958. Mrs. Arena Damon replaced Mrs. Ellen Pearce as school nurse on January 4, 1960. Mrs. Damon has had several years of experience as a school nurse in Bellows Falls, Vt. Mrs. Elizabeth Chickering was replaced by Mrs. Helen Wyman on January 18, 1960. Mrs. Wyman has completed the requirements for a degree from Keene Teachers College which will be conferred in June. She did her practice teaching in Swanzey.

The reduction in receipts is due for the most part to the reduction in state aid which is caused by the increase in equalized valuation as determined by the State Tax Commission. The equalized valuation for Westmoreland has increased from \$1,971,079 to \$2,342,935.

An enrollment increase from 18 to 22 in grade three and from 15 to 17 in grade four made it necessary to change six third graders from the Village to the East School. The

present classrooms should have no more than twenty five pupils. There are 18, 26, 33 and 33 pupils in our respective classrooms at this time.
