To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs. 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club and all church organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

6. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Whitefield Lions Club to develop a portion of the so-called Legion Field for Pee-Wee League baseball, under jurisdiction of the above named Club, all expenses of said development to be borne by the Whitefield Lions Club.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$453.62 for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of Advertising.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the Chamber of Commerce.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$4,000 for the repairs and painting of the interior of the Town Hall. This includes complete repainting of interior, removing and replacing section of floor, removing and replacing section of ceiling, installing new lighting fixtures, replacing front door, and installing crash hardware on all exits.

10. To see if the Town will vote to dispose of the so-called Red Acre property. This building is in a very poor state of repair and is a menace to public health. To repair same would cost from \$5,000 to \$6000 including new plumbing and sewer facilities.

11. To see if the Town will vote to turn back to the Whitefield Village Fire District any equity and expense of the Fire Department now holding for the Town. This would include the Firemen's payroll; cost, maintenance, and supervision of equipment.

12. To see if the Town will take advantage of Unemployment Compensation for all help employed by the Town. Retroactive from January 1st, 1960. (By Petition)

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for a band on Memorial Day under supervision of the Ingerson-Smith Post No. 41. (By Petition)

14. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the March Town Meeting, 1957, adopting a non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting in 1961. (By Petition)

15. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

Financial Statements

***Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1958-
December 31, 1959: (Exhibit A-1)***

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1958 and December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Surplus increased by \$5,024.10 during 1959.

***Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit
A-2)***

An analysis of the change in financial condition of

the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$2,201.20, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,510.90, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,712.10.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1959, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with the supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and

expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

General Comments

Serial Notes Issued and Paid:

The Town Meeting of March 1959 voted an appropriation of \$10,000.00 for the purchase of highway equipment. It further voted to authorize the issuance of serial notes, out of the proceeds of which payment for the equipment was to be made.

When the 1959 tax rate was approved, this appropriation of \$10,000.00 was included in the total appropriations. Inasmuch as it was not offset on the revenue side by a similar amount, (i.e.—revenue item "Proceeds of Note and Bond Issues") it was consequently raised by taxation.

This eliminated the necessity of the long term note issue. Therefore the notes which had been already issued were paid within the fiscal year.

Uncollected Taxes—Prior Years:

It is noted that there were still uncollected personal property, yield, poll and head taxes, on the tax warrants of 1957 and prior years amounting in total to \$2,172.30. It was also noted that there were collections of only very small amounts on these warrants during 1959. As of December 31, 1959, the uncollected taxes on these warrants were as follows:

Inasmuch as many of these taxes are presumably uncollectible, it is recommended that the Selectmen go over the lists with the Tax Collector and abate such taxes as appear to be in this category. Inclusion of substantial amounts of uncollectible prior years taxes each year in the balance sheet as assets tends to distort the true financial condition of the Town.

Conclusion

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

In the Spring, 4 Triple Toxoid and Salk Vaccine Clinics were held: Boosters 201, Preschool 44, School 157; Triple—8 Infants started and finished series, plus 5 started elsewhere; 8 Preschool started and finished series, plus 4 started elsewhere; and 13 School started and finished series.

There were 31 Vaccinations (Preschool 30, School 1); also Salk—under 5 yrs., 21 started, 19 had second shots, 10 third shots; 5-9 yrs.—7 started, 4 had second shots, 1 received third shot; 10-14 yrs.—1 had second shot; 15-19 yrs.—3 had second shot; and Pregnant Mothers—3 had second shot.

Salk Vaccine Clinics were held in January and November as follows: 4, first shots; 9, second shots; 8, third shots; 405, fourth shots, making a total of 426 injections. In October and December, 2 Adult Clinics were held, sponsored by the local school board, and a total of 144 injections were administered.

A course in Home Nursing was conducted in the school in the Spring.

Several preschool children have attended the Orthopedic and Pediatric Clinics held in Littleton and Berlin, sponsored by the N. H. State Dept. of Health.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Citizens of Whitefield, and I would like to thank them for their cooperation.

Car Accidents

There were 46 accidents investigated by Whitefield police during the year—this includes major and minor mishaps. We received a Certificate of Achievement for Accident Prevention Activities and completing the year

There were six juvenile cases brought before the court this past year. Several juveniles who we felt did not warrant court action were placed in custody of their parents. We do not feel that there is a serious juvenile problem in Whitefield—we on the police force know all the children by their first names and receive splendid cooperation from them.

Police Station

The station was remodeled, making the office about double the size it was originally. It has been completely repainted, this work being done by the officers themselves. This project was done at no cost to the taxpayers, the funds coming from the Police Association. We are very proud of the appearance of the station, and would like to extend an invitation to anyone interested to drop in and look it over.

Warnings

It is still the policy of this department to issue a warning whenever possible. We are aware that many people are in our town for the first time. We try to help them every time that we can. This applies to the local people as well. Hundreds of warnings were issued during the past year.

Parking

We would like to see the parking lot at the rear of Hutchins Pharmacy or another suitable place developed and used by the shop owners and their help to leave more space for customer parking.

We would like to express our appreciation to the

Selectmen and the townspeople for their cooperation. Also our thanks to the State Police and other agencies for their help. We want to assure the citizens that we try to cover the town as thoroughly as possible and that our radio hookup with the fire and water departments, as well as the State Police, enables us to give you faster and more efficient service.

PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note: 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners; 10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple:

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles—use your ash tray.
5. Don't burn at home—Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
