THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Winchester in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Winchester on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects; the polls not to close at an earlier hour than six of the clock in the afternoon.

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To receive reports of the selectmen, town treasurer, and other town officers including agents and committees and act thereon.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,700.00 for Town Officers' Salaries.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for Town Officers' Expenses.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for Election and Registration Expenses.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Municipal Court Expenses.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,600.00 for Expenses of Town Hall.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00 for Police Department.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,150.00 for Fire Department.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for Expenses of Forest Fires.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 to provide for white pine Blister Rust control in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 for the Health Department.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 for the purpose of aiding the Winchester District Nursing Association.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$125.00 for Vital Statistics.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Sewer Maintenance.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$13,800.00 for Summer Maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Highways and Bridges.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,786.00 for Street Lighting.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00 for General Expenses of Highway Department.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$891.63 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$3,566.51.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the Winchester Public Library.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$600.00 for Town Poor.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,400.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 for Memorial Day and Veterans' Associations.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for Aid to Soldiers and their Families.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$75.00 for Care of Common.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to provide Playground facilities and supervision and instruction therefor for the young people of the town, and to authorize the Moderator and Budget Committee to appoint a committee of five members to administer this project.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 for Cemeteries.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for Town Planning Board Expenses.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$220.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in co-operation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for 1946.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$170.00 for the payment of Interest on Temporary Loans in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$7,500.00 for the purpose of extending the fire hydrant system from Chapel Street to Lawrence Street including the installation of three hydrants and connection with the Tannery hydrant system.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for the purchase of New Equipment for the Highway Department.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 for the purpose of collecting rubbish and garbage in Winchester and Ashuelot.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to authorize the purchase of a motorized sidewalk snowplow, raise money therefor or take any action in relation thereto.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to pay for a holiday in tribute and welcoming home our Veterans of World War II; and that our Moderator appoint a committee of five (who will serve without pay) to have full charge and set the date.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to appoint an Airport Committee of three citizens, authorized to consult with representatives of the Federal and State Governments in all matters pertaining to the selection and approval of a suitable airport site in accordance with the requirements for eligibility to receive such Federal or State funds as may become available for such purposes.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to grant free use of the Town Hall, subject to the approval of the selectmen, to the Veterans of Foreign Wars of America and to its auxiliary organizations; this vote to be in effect until rescinded by vote of the town.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to increase the number of members of the Town Planning Board from five to seven.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$625.00 for the purpose of constructing a fire escape from the balcony of the Town Hall.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to require that all purchases of equipment or materials, or contracts entered into by the town in an amount exceeding \$100.00, shall be by competitive bidding, provided that the Selectmen, by unanimous vote may waive provisions for such bidding. In case the selectmen so vote, a copy of such action shall be recorded in their office with a statement of the reasons therefor, and such record shall be open to public inspection.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for General Sidewalk Construction.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to discontinue as open highways and make subject to gates and bars, the following roads:

1. The road No. 83, from the Andrew Curtis place to the Warwick Road, Route No. 78.

2. That part of the Brook Road No. 69 not now discontinued, from a point 10 feet northerly from Albert Clark's driveway to the present gate and bars on Road No. 95.

3. The road No. 96 known as the Rixford Road from a point at the driveway which now leads to the Fred Field's place, to the old Schoolhouse on the Putnam Road No. 61.

4. Road No. 66 from the junction with Road No. 62 to the Old Swanzey Road No. 64.

5. Road No. 97 from the intersection with Route 119, to the Richmond line.

6. The Pudding Hill Road No. 98 from a point 10 feet from Luman Nelson's upper driveway to the Richmond line.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote that the rules and regulations governing the use and maintenance of the Cemeteries and the election of the sexton or sextons in Winchester be amended so that the sexton or sextons shall be appointed by the Cemetery Committee.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to authorize the construction of a Town Water System, and direct the Selectmen to secure Federal Funds for planning such a project.

Art. 49 To see if the town will vote to appoint such committees or agents as may be necessary to take charge of the construction of such waterworks, or to authorize the Selectmen to appoint such agents or committees.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$250,000.00 to provide a suitable Water System in the town, and to authorize the Selectmen, with the co-operation of the Town Treasurer, to borrow said sum to construct such system, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 72 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, and amendments thereto, and to issue therefor the notes or bonds of account bearing such rates of interest, and having such maturities as they may be able to negotiate.

Art. 51. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

On March 11th, 1924 at the annual town meeting held in Winchester, N. H., on motion of James H. Bliss, it was voted to accept the gift as described in article 27 of the warrant as posted and a rising vote of thanks was extended to G. W. Peirce for the gift as herein described.

SUMMER PLAYGROUND REPORT

To the Town of Winchester, I hereby submit my report of the summer playground project for the year 1945.

The project for which \$1,000 was appropriated at the town meeting last year was very successful. It was a worthwhile endeavor and once again proved that an organized and supervised program could hold the interest of around one hundred and fifty boys and girls during the summer months.

The program started June 25 and was held for ten weeks. The boys attended the morning session and the girls the afternoon. A new group was added this year consisting of a morning session for the little ones between four and nine years of age.

During the program, a total of 148 children were registered 51 of whom were boys, 47 girls and 50 boys and girls in the younger group. The average daily attendance of the three groups combined was 55, which was an increase over last year.

The Community Center was used every day by the smaller children under the direction of Miss Kathryn Grupe. For most of their recreation, the two older groups met on Thayer High School grounds sometimes, however, at the center especially on rainy days for inside activities.

The boys and girls had opportunity to take part and receive instructions in many activities such as: Soft ball, volley ball, basketball, tennis, high jumping and pole vaulting, racing, swimming, boxing and baseball.

Several baseball games were played with out of town teams such as Orange and Athol. A tennis tournament was started for the boys.

Several outings for the day were made by both groups to Vilas Pool in Alstead, Cass pond in Richmond and Forest Lake.

Miss Betty Byrne, who succeeded Miss Betty Beers as assistant director in charge of the older girls, did a remarkable job as did Miss Kathryn Grupe who deserves much credit for the way in which she handled the smaller children.

The last week of the program was devoted to contests in the various sports events for both boys and girls. Prizes were given for those who played in these events. On the last day, outings were held at both grounds. Refreshments were served and a softball game was played between two picked teams.

Much credit should be given to the boys for the splendid work and cooperation of the baseball diamond and tennis court keeping them in number one condition throughout the summer.

The program did its usual good work in helping to build the minds and bodies of our youth and in giving them good clean outdoor sports. Good sportsmanship and fair play were keynotes in all activities. A great deal of enthusiasm was shown throughout the summer by all youngsters attending.

Much appreciation is expressed to the townspeople for their interest shown in working for the program, such as actual work on the grounds and the lending of cars and trucks for transportation of the children on their outings and the use of swimming beaches.

During eight weeks of lunches last winter, 3,885 complete meals were served; 5,231 half-pints of milk were served; with Type A milk 3,885, for Type C (milk only) 1,772.

The volunteers of Winchester Women's Club and others, made it possible for this project to earn new equipment for the remodeled lunchroom.

The hot lunch project for this school year started on November 26, 1945. Mrs. Geniss Coffin is the lunchroom manager. She is assisted by Mrs. Paul Willard.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools and the members of the School Board of the Town of Winchester:

I hereby submit my report of the nursing work done during 1945.

There were a total of 688 visits made to and for the interest of the schools, 6 classroom visits for inspections, and 747 individual inspections. Fifty-six students were excluded from school due to communicable diseases or for prophylactic measures. Four hundred sixty-five students received vision tests. As a result, twenty-four students were found to have visual defects. Eleven students were seen by eye specialists. Nine were fitted to glasses. One received an operation of the eye, and one is under treatment for the strengthening of the eye muscle. Early treatment and care of your eyes will prevent blindness. Your eyes are delicate and important organs. Do not abuse them!

Four hundred and twenty-five students were weighed and measured at the beginning of the school year. All children gained in weight and growth at a normal ratio.

Seven students were accompanied home from school due to illness. Five children were accompanied to a doctor's office due to illness before being taken home.

Two students were accompanied to the T. B. Clinic for chest X-ray. Ten classroom health talks were given at all schools at the beginning of the year. They have given much satisfaction. Subjects stressed were personal hygiene, nutrition, and the prevention of communicable diseases. It is gratifying to see the response and genuine interest for better health standards. First aid was given to 24 students during the year for minor cuts and bruises.

Parents are steadily aware of the danger that diseased tonsils and adenoids can cause to the child. As a result of this,

11 children were taken to the Elliot Community Hospital during the month of July for operations. All of these children have definitely improved in their general health and also show a much better attendance at school.

One hundred seventy-nine follow-up visits were made to the homes of children who, for some reason or other, were absent from school two or more days. These visits are made at the request of the Superintendent of Schools or the teachers. This group takes in only children under 16 years of age. Follow-up visits are also made to the homes of children in high school when and if a parent should know about the child's physical defect.

At the beginning of the school term, the annual physical examinations of all school children were conducted by Dr. Louvane A. Fox, who examined 188 students at Thayer High School, and Dr. Ludwig H. Mendelsohn, who examined 237 students at the Center and Ashuelot Schools. Notices to parents were immediately sent home to inform the family of any defect that was found at the time of examination.

During the month of February, 210 children received hearing tests at their respective schools. Retests were given at the Community Center. At the conclusion, the final tests showed seven children had a loss of hearing in one or both ears. Knowledge of the cause is known in the case of several children. Mastoid operations, scarlet fever, diseased tonsils, ruptured ear drums, and hard wax in the ears are some of the causes of loss of hearing. Therefore, when your child comes home with a notice of defective hearing, do not treat it lightly. See your doctor.

The District Nursing Association sponsored the annual Dental Clinic at the Community House from March 3 to April 11. Dr. Harvey Grimes treated 104 children. Good teeth make for good looks. The body takes care of the building of the teeth, but it is up to you to provide the proper materials required and arrange for the up-keep. .

Every child should have a well-balanced diet, plenty of rest, and, of course, recreation. A daily diet should contain

milk, butter, cream, whole wheat, cereals, eggs, green and yellow vegetables, fruit, meat or fish, enriched bread. Do not forget that water daily is important.

A great deal was said and heard about physical fitness during the war for both the armed forces and the civilian population. Dr. Eugene Fisk has had more to do with periodic health examinations than perhaps any other one physician. He says, "Who knows what we are facing as a nation during the year to come? One thing we do know is that there is a struggle for existence, and that a nation that is physically sound at the core is the nation that will hand down its civilization to the centuries." Why not start right with our children and make them sound for the nation?

At this time, I wish to express my thanks for the financial assistance from the local branch of the Salvation Army for important corrective work. This organization has always stood ready to aid those in need. Appreciation is also expressed to Mrs. Adalieta Eaton for her help throughout the year.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the Superintendent of Schools, members of the School Board, and teachers as each person has helped much to assist me in the protection and promotion of better health in our community. Your cooperation is appreciated.

The fall term of 1945 opened with three new members on the high school faculty. Mrs. Nettie Dunbar resigned as junior high Social Science teacher and was succeeded by Miss Lucille Boodey of East Barrington, New Hampshire, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire. Mrs. Jennie Bennett of this town, a graduate of New Hampshire University, succeeded Miss Ansi Angelo as teacher of English. Mrs. Bennett had been serving as sixth grade teacher at the Center School. Late in the summer, Miss Virginia Gamester resigned as instructor of French and Latin to accept a better position in Springfield, Vermont. Miss Lillian Cohen of Lynn, Massachusetts, a graduate of Radcliffe, took over the work in this department. At the end of the fall term the school suffered another loss in the resignation of Miss Alma Southard who had served faithfully as teacher of Home Economics for a period of more than seventeen years. Miss Southard accepted a position in Old Lyme,

Connecticut, at a very substantial increase in salary. Her place was later taken by Miss Dorothy Morel of Epping, New Hampshire, a graduate of Keene Teachers College and a former member of the WAVES.

He have been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. Edward Dale of this town to serve as director of music. Boys' and girls' choruses and orchestra are having regular rehearsals.

The woodworking course offered to freshmen last year is now offered to the first two years and doubtless will be extended to cover the four years if machines and other equipment can be secured.

The building used for plane spotting during the war has been turned over for the use of the school athletic teams. It is small but it affords a much needed storage place for equipment.

Various school organizations have contributed money toward the purchase of a movie projector. Funds now on hand will make it possible to purchase the projector as soon as machines are available. This will be a most valuable addition to our educational equipment. Much credit is due the organizations making this purchase possible.

The graduating class again carried through an excellent program thus maintaining the high standard of recent years.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of the Winchester School District:

I herewith submit my first annual report as superintendent of schools.

Finances

The budget submitted for the school year 1946-1947 is \$4,503.00 higher than the budget submitted in March, 1945. At the present writing, exact information in regard to state aid for 1946-1947 is not available. The State Board of Education advises us that the state aid fund of \$400,000 will be cut approximately \$150,000 and that each town will need to take its proportionate reduction. On the basis of this information, the School Board has estimated that Winchester School District will receive approximately \$4,000 in state aid.

The \$400,000 state aid fund was reduced \$90,000 last year. At the school district meeting in March, 1945, it was estimated that the district would receive \$5,700 from the state. Inasmuch as we received only \$4,603.75, approximately \$1,100 of the expenditures for the current year came from the cash on hand as of June 30, 1945. Fortunately, the district carried a balance sufficient to meet the drop in state aid.

Inasmuch as the Winchester School District has for several years received approximately \$6,000 in state aid, it should be realized that part of the increased burden on the town is a result of the drop in revenue from the state equalization fund.

The largest increase in estimated expenditures is in the item for teachers' salaries. This increase is in agreement with current trends in teachers' salaries. The attention on the whole nation has been focused upon the low salary status of teachers. The article in the October issue of *READER'S DIGEST* entitled, "Teacher's Pay—A National Disgrace," is one of the many public expressions of concern in regard to this matter.

In many instances the salary increases in the war years have been barely sufficient to meet the withholding tax deductions now paid by teachers. This means that the "take home" pay of many of our teachers is little more than it was prior to the war. It is interesting to note that for the year January 1, 1945, to January 1, 1946, the Winchester School District paid \$3,739.73 to the federal government for taxes withheld from teachers' salaries. This is, of course, a teacher obligation but it gives some idea of the increased burden on teachers, most of whom never paid an income tax prior to 1942.

An analysis of the teacher changes for the five-year period from 1941 to 1945 reveals thirty resignations. Seven of the teachers employed in 1941 are employed during the current year. This shows that the remaining nine positions were filled by thirty people over a period of five years. If we consider that there were forty-five position years filled by thirty people, the average life of a teacher in these positions appears to be approximately one and one-half years. A high rate of turnover is to be expected with non-resident teachers especially in these war years. The salary schedule is not high enough to keep a non-resident teacher in our system for more than one or two years. The Winchester schools must necessarily suffer. This rapid turnover has a definite effect on the educational development of the pupils.

In presenting these facts to the Town Planning Board, the Superintendent was unfortunately misquoted, as having said that increased salaries were necessary to "attract more efficient instructors." There was no intent to belittle the splendid work of our present staff.

It should be noted that the district now has a new statutory requirement in the item of the teachers' retirement fund. The new retirement law assesses the district for four per cent of the salaries of all teachers who are members of the State Teachers' Retirement Association. The teacher must also pay four per cent from her own salary. We now have seven teachers who are members of the New Hampshire Teachers' Retirement Association.

The total assessment required to balance the School Board's budget (\$44,849) is 11.2 per cent higher than the amount raised by local taxation (\$40,346) last year.

Buildings and Equipment

The new lunchroom at the Center School for which a special appropriation was made in 1945 has now been completed. This lunchroom has been equipped with sinks, an electric stove, new service counter and benches. The tables which were in use last year are still being used. The necessary plumbing, heating and wiring have now been completed. In spite of the recently installed heating system in the lunchroom, the janitor has experienced some difficulty in keeping the room warm. The district should consider the installation of a propeller fan-type unit heater which would cause a forced circulation of warm air in the lunchroom.

The hot lunch project is now self sufficient. Each child is charged sixty-three cents per week for a balanced meal. Plans are now being made to purchase an electric refrigerator out of profits of the hot lunch project. Mrs. Geniss Coffin has been employed as lunchroom manager this year. Her assistant is Mrs. Paul Willard. Your attention is called to the financial report of Mrs. S. G. Johnson on the lunch project for 1945.

It is hoped that the district will be able to sponsor hot lunch programs at Thayer High School and Ashuelot. We are, however, handicapped at Thayer School by the lack of adequate space and equipment. The continual use of the Home Economics room would prohibit its use as a lunchroom. It is so small that such an idea is somewhat impractical in any event. The room formerly used for Agriculture could possibly be used. It also seems impractical to use this room because of its extremely small floor space. The space is available at Ashuelot but no equipment.

It will be noted that an item of \$500 has been included in the budget for new equipment. In addition to this, it will be noted that \$700 has been entered for minor repairs and expenses. Plans are now being made for the installation of hot water and a new sink in the home economics laboratory at

Thayer High School. In this day of modern plumbing, it seems rather primitive to ask a home economics teacher to handle a cooking class without the aid of hot water. Inasmuch as there is, at present, one wood stove and one oil stove, there are not over six cooking surfaces available for the use of the students. As it is often necessary to use one or two of these surfaces for heating hot water, the facilities available for teaching Home Economics are extremely limited. There are, at present, twenty-two girls in the seventh grade and twenty-seven girls in the eighth grade. It is impossible to properly manage and instruct classes of this size with the equipment available. Inasmuch as the home economics laboratory has to be used for a classroom as well as a laboratory, it is difficult to make many additions to the equipment without seriously handicapping its use as a classroom. The size of the Thayer High School building does not permit the scheduling of classes elsewhere. The small size of the home economics room prohibits the adequate development of a home economics laboratory. In spite of limitations of space, plans are being made for the purchase of an electric stove and an electric refrigerator. If we meet federal standards for equipment and instruction, we can obtain federal aid for our home economics program. Out of the \$1,200 appropriated for these purposes, we must also replace three typewriters and take care of the maintenance of the three buildings in the Winchester School District. It is somewhat doubtful if the amount of money in the budget can cover all of these items.

The facilities available for shop work are somewhat limited. The present room is satisfactory, though small, for junior high school work. If the district plans to develop a four-year shop course, it will be necessary to expand into the room formerly used for Agriculture. Considerable more power equipment must be added if such a course is adopted. If we meet federal standards for equipment and instruction in our Shop program, we can obtain federal aid. On the present basis of distribution, such federal aid would probably amount to \$400 or \$500.

The school budget for next year includes \$1,000 for the employment of a music teacher. The present plan is to unite with Swanzey and Richmond in the employment of a full time

music teacher. The lack of space at Thayer High School is a definite handicap to the proper utilization of a music teacher. There is no place for the rehearsal of individuals or small groups other than the main room. Any musical activity carried on during the school day must necessarily interrupt the work of other classes. The main room is used continually for either classes or study hall purposes. The employment of a music teacher will also involve the purchase of some additional supplies and equipment. There is, at present, only one piano in the elementary school. The ideal would be one piano in each room. One piano on each floor is the absolute minimum. The music teacher should also be provided with a portable record player and, at least, a small library of records.

The sash and frames at Thayer High School are badly in need of a coat of paint. This should be done during the coming summer but it is doubtful if our appropriation for minor repairs and expenses is sufficient for this purpose.

Some difficulty has been experienced in heating the high school building. A propeller fan-type heater installation in the lower corridor has been suggested. Such an installation would, undoubtedly, save fuel during the winter months.

Metal insulating strips have been suggested for the windows at Thayer High School. On windy days, the windows rattle so much that it is difficult to hear either the voices of the teacher or pupils. Considerable heat must be lost because of this condition. Inquiries have been made in regard to the purchase of such metal insulating strips but no replies have yet been obtained.

Considerable trouble has been experienced with the water system at the Center School. During the fall, there was insufficient water to supply the toilets and drinking fountains. The janitor was required to continually shut off the water to save enough for flushing the toilets. For a short period of time, the teachers and pupils were instructed to use paper drinking cups because of lack of pressure at the drinking fountains. This condition has been partially remedied by the installation of new pipes. The electric pump on the water system has been repaired innumerable times during the year.

Inquiries have been made in regard to the purchase of a new pump but one is yet to be located.

The playground in the rear of the Center School should be levelled off and supplied with playground equipment. This has apparently been referred to in many earlier superintendents' reports. The expense of this project has apparently prohibited its accomplishment. The presence of water on the playground is neither healthy nor sanitary. A limited amount of grading is also necessary in front of the Center School. Water frequently accumulates in a large depression near the sidewalk. This results in many wet feet and is possibly the cause of colds and sickness.

The flagpole at the Thayer High School is in need of painting and repair. The flagpole at the Center School should be removed from the top of the building. A new pole should be purchased and erected on the grounds.

The school grounds at Ashuelot were cleared of brush during the early part of the fall. This greatly improves the appearance of the school site. The lower playground should be filled in with some gravel and levelled off. There are, at present, numerous rocks which endanger the children while playing active games. The district should also plan to add some playground equipment.

The budget submitted with this report is not anywhere near sufficient to take care of the repairs and needs mentioned in this section.

Curriculum

The remarks in regard to Home Economics, Shop, and music under the heading "Buildings and Equipment" indicate the problems which face the school district in this area. There are many needs in the development of this part of our curriculum. However, the limitations of the school building will be a definite handicap to the development of these subjects.

A course in Spanish has been offered this year for the first time. There are, at present, about six students enrolled in this course.

Mr. Carl Grupe, headmaster, is making arrangements for the purchase of a 16 mm. sound projector for use in the high school. Student funds will provide for about three-fourths of the cost of this projector. The School District should plan to provide about \$100 per year for the rental of films. Student organizations will, undoubtedly, also contribute to the rental of some of the films. A recent survey of eighteen New Hampshire schools indicated that they all had visual education equipment or had it on order.

By 1955 What?

The above remarks in regard to buildings and equipment and curriculum indicate that many additional needs should be met during the next few years. The total school membership in Winchester has dropped from 536 in 1934 to 433 in 1945. The enrollment as of January 1, 1946, is 419. These figures would seem to indicate that the school population is decreasing. It should be noted, however, that the present first grades in Winchester and Ashuelot total 43. The average enrollment in each of the eight grades is approximately 40. These figures seem to indicate that there will be an upward swing in school population during the next few years. Even though the elementary school enrollment does not increase materially, the high school enrollment will, undoubtedly, increase because of the conclusion of the war. The enrollment this year is at least ten more than last year. It would appear that the high school enrollment would, within a few years, again reach a high of approximately 140. This, with the junior high school enrollment of 80 would make a total of approximately 220 pupils. This will again create an acute situation in the high school. The facilities are even now inadequate in the Home Economics and Shop areas as mentioned in another section of this report. If the expected increase in enrollment takes place, we will find it difficult to offer an adequate program with our present facilities.

The needs of the Winchester School District referred to in the above paragraph cannot all be met in one year. The following suggestions should be considered by the School Board and the citizens during the next few years.

Adoption of a salary schedule to attract and hold new teachers.

Addition of facilities in the home economics laboratory—modern sinks, hot water, refrigerator, electric stove.

Application for federal aid on salary of approved home economics instructor.

Addition of music teacher and provision of adequate space and equipment—record player, record libraries, piano, etc.

Provision of adequate facilities for handling of lunch program at the Ashuelot School.

Purchase of equipment for high school shop program.

Employment of teacher for six-year shop or agriculture program.

Provision of additional space at high school plant or in high school area to meet new needs of lunchroom, music, Home Economics, Shop, physical education, visual education, dramatics, etc.

Personnel

Mrs. Daisy Thompson, who retired in 1944, was again employed in grade one to replace Miss Martha Paul who resigned last year. In January, 1946, Mrs. Natalie B. Pattison, graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mrs. Grace I. Weeks. Mrs. Jennie Bennett, who was teacher in grade six, is now teaching English at the high school. Mrs. Eileen Little, who was a special helping teacher at the Center School last year, was elected to teach in grade six.

Mr. Edward O. Dale has been employed to teach music in the Winchester schools. Mr. Dale teaches two half days at the Center School. He also teaches two half days at the Ashuelot School and Thayer High School.

The changes in the high school staff are to be found in the Headmaster's report.

Testing Program

The Pintner General Ability tests have been administered to every child in the Winchester schools in grades one to

twelve. The intelligence quotients for every child have been entered on the pupil records. In addition to the intelligence tests, the Iowa Tests of Educational Development prepared by the Science Research Associates have been administered to all the students in grades nine to twelve. These tests indicate that our students compare favorable with those in other sections of the country. The attention of the Headmaster and teachers is now focused on certain weaknesses revealed by these tests.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the School Board, teachers, and citizens for their cooperation and support.
