TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (the polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

ART. 1. To choose one selectman for a period of three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, two Auditors, one Trustee of Library, for three years and all such officers and agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Towns' business for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will raise \$5,000.00 for Town charges for the ensuing year.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for Class V highways and raise money for same, the Town to raise \$488.67 and the State to contribute \$3,257.77.

ART. 4. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class V highways and bridges and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.

ART. 5. To see if Town will raise \$6,500.00 for summer and winter maintenance of highways and bridges.

ART. 6. To see if Town will raise \$250.00 for burning

and bulldozing Town Dump.

ART. 7. To see if Town will appropriate \$1,500.00 for general expense of Highway Dept.

ART. 8. To see if Town will raise \$400.00 for cutting brush.

ART. 9. To see if Town will raise \$550.00 for upkeep of cemeteries.

ART. 10. To see if Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for Capital Reserve Fund.

ART. 11. To see if Town will vote the sum of \$500.00 for Street Lighting and Town Buildings.

ART. 12. To see if Town will vote to raise \$150.00 for blister rust control.

ART. 13. To see if Town will vote to authorize Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during the year.

ART. 14. To see if Town will raise \$2,000.00 for old age assistance.

ART. 15. To see if Town will vote to raise \$550.00 for Insurance.

ART. 16. To see if Town will cooperate with Town of Cornish for resurvey of line from Clark Gate just outside of Park Fence to terminus of joint marker where the four Towns come together near what is called Head Station and raise money for same.

ART. 17. To see if Town will vote to trade in old dump truck towards new four wheel drive truck suitable for plowing and general work and appropriate money for same.

ART. 18. To see if Town will vote to put a price on the lots surveyed and marked at Croydon Flat Cemetery.

ART. 19. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Croydon, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the second day of March, 1960, at 7:30 o'clock P. M. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the District will vote to close the so-called Village School and send the elementary students to Newport—effective in September, 1960.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to send pupils in Grade 4 to Newport—effective in September 1960—and raise and appropriate \$950.00 for said purpose.

Article 9. To see if the District will authorize the appropriation of a sum to be raised by borrowing or otherwise, for the purpose of making repairs, improvements, additions and renovations to the so-called Village School Building.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officials and Agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to author-

ize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Article 11. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to appoint a Building Committee to work with the Board on any project authorized by the vote under Article Nine of this Warrant.

Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Croydon:

Enrollment

Mrs. Doris Farrington is again teaching Grades 1-4 at the Village School with an enrollment of thirty pupils divided as follows:

Grade 1	8
Grade 2	10
Grade 3	5
Grade 4	7

To teach thirty pupils adequately in four different grades is really an impossibility as well as an imposition upon any teacher. The 1959 Annual Meeting removed the funds from the Budget to send Grade 4 pupils to Newport.

Had the Village School been run this year with Grades 1-3 and 23 pupils, the teacher would have had a fairer chance to do a thorough job with three grades in the room.

Teachers

A check of past records reveals that there have been nine different teachers at the Village School since 1947.

Although we are fortunate to have the services of Mrs. Farrington this year, there is no certainty that she will teach indefinitely in Croydon. In past year's when you have not been able to hire local teachers, the stay of the teachers was short and too often the quality of their work was poor. When there are no local people available, it is just about impossible to get a good teacher to teach in your present school.

You should give serious thought to this teacher problem as you consider putting thousands of dollars into a school building more than one hundred and thirty years old.

School Plant

Last year, the Warrant contained Articles to close the school and also to make extensive repairs. No action was taken on either proposal. Consequently, the act of provid-

ing suitable, up-to-date school facilities still exists—as it has for many years.

Again this year, three different proposals are in the Warrant for consideration:

1. Close the school.
2. Send Grade 4 pupils to Newport. (Of course, this means an added expense—for the cost of running the school for Grades 1-3 is about the same as running it for Grades 1-4).
3. Make repairs and improvements to the present building which was built before 1832.

Helping Teacher

The Helping Teacher continues to serve the educational needs of the school in many ways. Mr. Soucy has taken additional work during the year to fully qualify himself for giving individual intelligence tests to pupils.

Conclusion

As we enter the “soaring sixties”, we need to keep constantly in mind that educational methods and practices are changing very rapidly in a fast-moving, complex world. It is impossible to stand still. Schools—either move forward with the times—or fall backward. The young people we are training today need the best foundation we can give them. Your cooperation and interest is urgently needed to help with this vital job.
