

TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE,

ROCKINGHAM, S. S.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote
in town affairs:

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in
said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten
o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year
ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money
as may be necessary for the support of schools, for the main-
tenance of the poor, for the laying out and repairing of high-
ways, and building and repairing bridges, and for other
necessary charges arising in said town.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise
and appropriate for the use of Upton Post No. 45, Depart-
ment of New Hampshire, Grand Army of the Republic, to
defray the expenses of Memorial Day.

4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors or committees
heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the town will vote to establish and main-
tain an electric light at or near the corner of Franklin, Rol-
lins Street and Warren Avenue.

6. To see if the town will vote to construct a concrete sidewalk from the corner of the street near the residence of Frank A. Ford along Franklin Street to the corner of Warren Avenue.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of observing Old Home Week.

8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to prepare a local highway map of the town as provided in Chapter 133, Laws of 1903, and to raise such money as may be necessary therefor.

9. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint one or more highway agents to take charge of the highways for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 79 of the Public Statutes relating to sidewalks and sewers.

11. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of the Police Justice from one hundred dollars per annum to two hundred dollars per annum.

12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for any articles embraced in this warrant

By the foregoing report it will be noticed that your board have expended \$23,165 for Macadam road improvements and \$10,000 in addition to that bequeathed by the late Benjamin Adams for the new Memorial hall, making a total of \$33,615 for which no money was raised by taxation. Naturally the debt would have been increased by the above amount ; but instead the debt was increased only \$27,013.19, or \$6,601.81 less. This is equivalent to a reduction of the debt.

The amount of flannel distributed the past year was 1500 yards to 150 persons.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH.

The board has received but few complaints from the unsanitary condition of buildings this year.

Disturbances between neighbors cannot be settled by the board, but when any unsanitary condition is found to exist, we shall endeavor to correct the same.

The chief duty of the board has been in looking after the contagious diseases which have appeared in town from time to time.

There have been no cases of diphtheria, three cases of scarlet fever, two of typhoid, and several of measles. The people failing to report the latter as too insignificant makes it impossible to have a correct report. Although the law is emphatic on the importance of reporting measles as any other disease, and the penalty is as severe for failing to do so, as is shown by the following law :

“When any householder knows or has reason to believe that any person within his family or household has either of the following diseases, viz: cholera, smallpox, typhus fever, yeller fever, diphtheria, membranous croup, scarlet fever, typhoid fever or measles, he shall within 24 hours give notice to the local board of health, unless a physician has been called, in which case the physician will give the notice and by so doing relieve the householder of all responsibility in the case.”

“Any person or corporation failing to comply with the above shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$200, or be imprisoned not more than six months or both.”

Any person can readily see that they are liable to the penalty as set forth above by failing to report any of the diseases aforementioned, and it is only the leniency of the Board that has saved several from being brought up for their carelessness.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

In compliance with the law the School Board respectfully presents its annual report with a statement of the receipts and expenditures for the financial year ending February 13, 1904.

Although we were handicapped somewhat on assuming our duties by the reluctance of our worthy predecessor to hand over the much needed school supplies, yet our affairs soon assumed a normal condition and we set about doing what seemed to be for the best interests of the schools.

It soon became apparent on account of the large influx of new scholars that one of the unfurnished rooms in the East Side school should be furnished, which was done and a competent teacher placed in charge.

We have been obliged to hire money for the payment of old bills unsettled by the preceding Board and Building Committee.

A substantial steam heating plant has been placed in the West Side school at an expense of six hundred and twenty-five dollars. This was recommended by the preceding board and found advisable by us. We now consider the East and West Side school houses in a good comfortable condition.

The school house in District No. 7 had to be newly shingled and required considerable inside repairs.

The average attendance has been excellent excepting perhaps two weeks during the heavy storms of February, which suggests to us that it might possibly be better to shorten the winter term and lengthen the others.

The Truant Officer reports 527 scholars.

We have tried to furnish the best possible teachers that could be procured for the money paid, and hope that results will verify our endeavors. Your committee therefore presents the citizens and voters of the Town School District the following accounts :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Schoolhouse in said District, on Saturday, the 12th day of March, 1904, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the Board of Education for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the report of the Board of Education and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To hear the report of the Treasurer, Auditor, or other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise by taxation and appropriate to pay the debt and interest thereon incurred in building the Schoolhouse and to pay the insurance on the building.
8. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise by taxation and appropriate for Educational purposes.
9. To see whether the District will vote to purchase The New Imperial Encyclopedia and Dictionary for the use of the School as a reference book and raise and appropriate money to purchase the same.
10. To see whether the District is satisfied with the expense of heating and caring for the building,—the amount being more than one-fifth of the total school money,—and if not satisfied to see what action it will take and what money it will

raise and appropriate to carry the same into effect.
