## TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Epping, in the County of Rockingham, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epping on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as per contract with the Portsmouth Power Co.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Decoration Day expenses.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the winding of the town clock.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of trunk line on condition that the state will contribute double the amount.

- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of state aid roads, on condition that the state contribute an equal amount.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,489.50 for state aid construction, on condition that the state contribute \$2,978.00.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to continue the construction on road leading from the residence of Willis Johnson to the Nottingham line.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to repair the road leading from the residence of Eugene Gagnon to the railroad crossing.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to repair the road leading from the Nottingham road to the residence of John Dodge.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to have installed one electric light between the residence of William J. Fieldsend and the Boston bridge road so called, and one just beyond the railroad track on the Proulx road near the residence of Louis Gagnon.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to repair Railroad Avenue from the crossing to the residence of George Gage's.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the road leading from Towl Brook to Lee line.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 in trust for the perpetual care of burial lot

of Daniel W. Cate and Samuel H. Rand located in the Prospect Cemetery.

- 18. To see if the town will vote to accept the land back of the town hall, owned by Dr. A. W. Mitchell.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Fire Department.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to remove canal bridge, and fill, with owner's consent.

### REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

I herewith submit my report as health officer for the year ending January 31, 1932.

The several complaints regarding the sink drains and privies have been made, also about the town dump. I have investigated the same and ordered changes and conditions corrected.

To all who avail themselves of the privilege of using the town dump, I would respectfully ask of them to throw rubbish as far back as possible.

The existence of our present sewerage system is a menace to our town and should be changed.

We have been practically free from contagious diseases during the past year and the general health of the community has been excellent. Much credit is due our sincere, estimable and proficient Dr. Mitchell. I have sent up to the State Laboratory the town water each month, with the following report: good except cloudy and some excess of iron. Two lots of milk were also analyzed and two of the eight were below standard.

A complaint was made to the State Board of Health regarding the keeping of hens in filthy houses, which at certain times emits bad odors.

A representative from the State Board and myself visited the premises and ordered the houses cleaned, the yard dug up and new gravel applied.

I wish to thank all citizens of the town who have assisted me in the performance of my duties and respectfully ask for a continuance of the same in the future.


