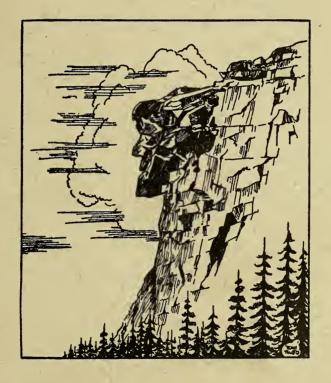

Town Meeting Warrant

(As known January 19, 1954)

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$75.00 for Civilian Defense expenses.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Pine Blister Rust reserve fund.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used for Rag Weed control.
- Article 6. To see what action the town will vote to take to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to dispose of the land situated in the town of Bethlehem which was purchased for the purpose of a town dump.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for Vital Statistics, the Littleton Hospital and expenses of the Health Department.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to be added to the Equipment reserve fund.

- Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of highways and bridges, snow removal, oiling of its roads, and for Town Road Aid.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,260.00 for the lighting of streets for the ensuing year.
- Article 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expense of the highway department.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for sidewalk upkeep and repair.
- Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library and salary of its Librarian.
- Article 15. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- Article 16. To see what action the town will vote to take with regard to proper observance of Memorial Day and to raise and appropriate the necessary funds for same.
- Article 17. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of its cemeteries.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40.00 for a band concert.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for the White Mountains Region Association.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for maintenance of the Information Booth at the Town Building.

- Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for legal expenses.
- Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to defray the town's share of Employee's Social Security.
- Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following: \$2,500 to pay the amount maturing on the Town Building and Water Works bonds; \$1,000 on outstanding Bridge Construction notes; \$1,000 on outstanding Fire Equipment and Garage notes; \$1,000 on outstanding Gale Reservoir Construction notes; \$1,200 on outstanding Mittersill Road Construction notes; also the sum of \$1,239.84 to pay the interest on said indebtedness and on temporary loans.
- Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,700.00 for payment of the Grafton County Tax.
- Article 25. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.
- Article 26. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Of this amount Franconia's share is \$679.38, Landaff \$126.17, Benton \$80.33, Easton \$62.98, Lincoln \$1,298.47, Lisbon Special \$1,195.02, Lisbon Town \$332.05, Lyman \$150.13, Sugar Hill \$205.47, and the State's share is \$2,275. Physical examinations were started in September. All pupils were eligible. Thirty-six signed up and were examined by the school physician, Dr. Ralph Parker. Visual examinations were done on all pupils and hearing tests on some of the grades.

Three tonsillectomies were done at the Littleton Hospital in May.

Ten children were immunized at the Well-Child Clinic held in Franconia in May.

Registration day was held in June for the incoming first graders. The response was poor. I am hoping that the parents will come to realize the importance of registration day and will strive to do better in the future.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Franconia School District:

I herewith submit my eleventh annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment of your school last year was 134, with 39 pupils in Grades IX through XII and 95 in Grades I through VIII. The average membership was 121.0 and the percent of attendance was 95.6. There were 43 tuition pupils—20 of whom are in the high school and 23 in the elementary grades.

This year the total enrollment is 122, with 36 in Grades IX through XII and 86 in Grades I through VIII. There are 39 tuition pupils enrolled at the present time; 9 high school and 12 elementary pupils are from Lisbon Town; 6 high school and 8 elementary pupils are from Easton and 4 high school pupils are from Sugar Hill.

As I write, we have just experienced several days of extremely cold weather. The teachers say that the newly installed heating plant functions perfectly and the building is warm and comfortable. This is one of the best improvements in recent years.

The school building was examined by Foster and Bamford, an architectural and engineering firm of Concord, New Hampshire. Their recommendations were accepted and their staff completed the work which not only maintained the condition of the building, but improved it as well. In addition the condition of the second floor was checked by removing a section of sub-floor boards and was found to be satisfactory and did not require repair.

The Hot Lunch Program is continuing under the very capable supervision of Mrs. Harry Shores. The numbers have grown until this year over 85 boys and girls are taking advantage of the excellent lunches provided by Mrs. Shores and her assistants. The Program is supported by Federal Funds and private con-

tributions and by the Greenleaf Civics Club which sponsors it.

The longer I work with School Board Members the more I admire their unselfish efforts to better the education of your children. Each Board Member donates many hours as a service to your community. I hope that every parent gives the Board a vote of confidence and a note of appreciation.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the teachers, School Board and Franconia Community for their help in building a better school. The future of your school is dependent on its success in fulfilling the needs of the children in this area.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

The following comprises the third annual report of my administration as Principal of Dow Academy.

FACULTY

The Staff has been changed by four additions. Miss Jean Dwyer of Pine Point, Maine, teaches English and French. Mrs. Yvonne Gardner of Littleton, New Hampshire teaches the commercial studies. Mr. Ernest Morin of Turners Falls, Massachusetts teaches shop, math., and science. Mrs. Roger Stewart of Lincoln, New Hampshire taught home economics until Christmas vacation. At the present time there is no home economics for the girls of grades seven and eight.

The faculty is a fine group of teachers who are trying their best to give your children an adequate education.

CURRICULUM

Shop offered to the boys of the Freshman and Sophomore Classes is providing an extremely practical and interesting course. We hope to move our shop into the small building next to the gym before another year has past. This building will afford us more room and better conveniences for our expanding program. We are planning to include courses for Juniors and Seniors in the next school year. Practical electricity and auto mechanics are under serious consideration. The cooperation of the community in setting up and enhancing the above program is of great value to our goal.

This year we are offering two correspondence courses. One of the courses is Latin I and the other is Art I. Both of these are of value to the students and they help us in offering a varied curriculum to students whose interests are beyond the limitations of a small school. Because of the need for class time we are unable to offer an activity period this year. Class

time lost because of our ski program is made up on the other days of the week.

Physical education has been offered to grades three through eight on a limited basis. It is curtailed during the ski season but will be resumed after the close of the season.

ACTIVITIES

The ski program set-up is the same as last year and shows promise of even greater success. Mr. Cole is supervising the program and will continue to do an excellent job. He is also in charge of the Junior and Senior Ski Team.

The band is continuing to show improvement under the direction of Mr. McLure. This year we have purchased a new tuba. This was financed with the help of the Trustees and the P. T. A.

The Glee Club is on a credit marking basis under the direction of Mrs. Sinclair. They have already joined with the band in one concert and another one or two are being planned.

Miss Dwyer has charge of the dramatics. One play has been successfully presented and another is planned for the spring.

The Rifle Club is under the direction of Mr. Cole and a range has been constructed for use in the gym during the winter season.

ATHLETICS

We rejoined the Ammonoosuc Basketball League this year. The boys showed great interest and developed rapidly. The future looks good for basketball. Many of our team members are young and will improve constantly. The girls also played well and have the nucleus of excellent teams in the near future. Both teams were very capably coached by Merton Shores.

HEALTH

Again this year we had physicals for grades four, eight and eleven. Other children were also given the opportunity to have complete physical examinations.

The School Doctor, Ralph A. Parker, and the School Nurse, Miss Irma Simeneau, urge you parents to have your children take advantage of this program. A healthy child is a better student. Miss Simeneau has also conducted eye and ear tests. These tests and examinations are of value in locating any defects a child may have, and they are also of great value in assuring you that your children are being periodically checked.

GUIDANCE

Many of the students have taken the Kuder Preference Tests and the tests given through the New Hampshire University Testing Service. These, plus other tests—both for the elementary and secondary students, have definite purposes. Some are used to guide pupils into occupations; others are used to find areas in which pupils are weak; still others are used to help guide pupils into the right courses; and others are of use as measuring devices to find out how well the pupil has progressed with regard to others of his age and grade throughout the nation. I. Q. Tests are also administered to help us determine where your child stands in natural ability to learn. All of these tests are of value to the teachers and help us to understand the pupils.

SCHOOL LUNCH

Our deep appreciation is extended to Mrs. Lena Shores and the Greenleaf Civics Club for the School Lunch Program for the children. This program extending from November into April is of inestimable value to the health of our pupils.

ADMINISTRATION

Mid-term reports have been sent home to the parents of all the students in the grades seven through twelve. The purpose of them is to keep the parents informed of the progress of their children. Our appreciation is extended to the Trustees for the donation of money to purchase a new projector and new books for our library. The new heating plant is a definite health factor. There is no dust or ash and, even more important, every part of the school is adequately heated—even at forty degrees below zero.

The floor and structural changes have made the building a safer, healthier, and more attractive workshop for all. Our Custodian, Merton Shores, is continuing to do a superior job in many ways. His presence is felt by all.

It has been a pleasure to work with the fine Staff, your cooperative Superintendent, and your conscientious School Board. All are working for the best interest of the children.
