TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Kingston Town Hall in said Kingston on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town and School Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$457.00 and the State will contribute \$3,046.65 for the Class V Highways, under the Provisions of the T. R. A.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$1,000.00 to repair and surface Hooke Ave., West Shore Park, Country Pond.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$500.00 to surface and Tar the new road constructed at Cooper's Grove.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to direct the Board of Selectmen to annually publish in their annual report, with that of the other town officers, commonly called the Town Report, an itemized list of all property tax assessments for the year made by them listing the name of the taxpayer, a brief description of the property taxed, valuation of the property and the amount of tax.

- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind all regulations adopted under Article 16 of the Warrant for the town meeting of 1955 and Article 3 of the Warrant for the special town meeting of April 7, 1959 and vote in place thereof the following regulations for the acceptance of new streets:
- 1. A petition signed by all landowners along the street shall be required and an article placed in the town warrant for acceptance.
- 2. A minimum of 36 feet for right of way shall be deeded to the town.
- 3. The land owner or owners shall build a road bed 20 feet in width. The road bed shall consist of all gravel, drainage, grading and compaction necessary to provide a finished surface 20 feet in width.
- 4. The extent of the acceptance to be limited to snow removal only for a two year period. Any major road repairs required during this period to be performed by the landowners or owners.
- 5. Upon completion of the two year period, full acceptance of the street will be assumed by the town unless objection to same is entered by the Selectmen or Road Agent.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to amend the regulation adopted under Article 2 Section A of Article 10 of the warrant for the town meeting of March 8, 1954, by striking out said section and inserting the following:
 - A. Every building lot shall have a minimum frontage of 100 feet and shall contain a minimum area of 14,000 square feet.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$100.00 to purchase and erect street signs on town roads.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$200.00 for Kingston Civil Defense.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$500.00 to widen the curve by Sprague Hill on North Danville Rd.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$500.00 to widen the curve by Hendersons, on Great Pond Rd.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 to purchase a safe for the tax collector.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 to widen and grade the road starting at William Wing's on Rt. 125 and ending at the Thorn Rd., so-called.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the permanent construction of Dolliver Lane, so-called, for a distance of 448 feet from Rt. 125.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Auditor's Report and the Town Report as printed.

Article 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 2. March 11, 1959. Meeting called to order at eight o'clock by the Moderator. Prayer by Rev. Terry Thomason. Moderator read correction in Town Report on Page 11. 'Town Road Aid, \$403.60,' should be 'Social Security \$225.00.' Voted to raise the sum of \$170,120.84 to defray town expenses.

Article 3. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$460.13 and the State will contribute \$3,067.53 for Class 5 Highways under the Provisions of the T.R.A.

Article 4. Voted that the town raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$500.00 for further repair and surfacing of Merrill Ave., formerly known as West Shore Park Road at Country Pond.

Article 5. Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the permanent construction of Cooper's Grove road, so called.

Article 6. Voted not to accept 8th Street leading to Half Moon Pond.

Article 7. Voted to accept the road known as Dolliver Lane for a distance of 448 feet from Route 125 subject to established town regulations.

Article 8. Voted that the town raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the permanent construction of Dolliver Lane for a distance of 448 feet from Route 125.

Article 9. Voted that the town accept Hooke Ave. at West Shore Park, Country Pond, as a town road.

Article 10. This Article not carried. (Kingston Beach)

Article 11. Motion that Article 11 be amended to add "All installation and control of the system should be subject to the approval of the Fire Wards prior to any acceptance, expenditure of these funds raised under this article." Move to adopt Article 11 as amended was defeated.

Article 12. Voted that all purchases made by the Town in excess of \$500 be made under the competitive bid system. The bid to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

Article 13. Voted that this Article pass as read with the following amendment by Richard Senter that the words "not exceeding \$50,000.00 be deleted from the motion.

Article 14. Voted to accept the Auditor's Report and Town Report with the correction as given in Article 2.

Article 15. Motion by D. Tompkins in regard to Mass. non-resident tax was ruled out of order by the Moderator. Voted to adjourn and have Special Meeting with Supplemental Warrant to be issued covering this motion and other articles as posted. Voted to adjourn at 9:50 P.M.

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in said Kingston on Tuesday, April 7th to act upon the following:

- Article 1. That the Assessors and the Tax Collector be required to assess a levy upon the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or the Tax Commission of Massachusetts amounting to 60 per cent plus 6 per cent interest compounded semi-annually, of the personal income taxes obtained or withheld from the wages of N. H. residents employed in Mass. Obtaining, if necessary, the assistance of the Attorney General of the State of N. H. to make such levy, monies obtained from aforesaid levy shall be returned to the towns in which the taxpayers reside, to reduce the property taxes in their town.
- Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of raising the road on Great Pond Park Road.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following regulations for the acceptance of new streets.
- 1. That the property owner or owners will be responsible for the construction of the entire road with the exception of the bituminous surface treatment. The term "construction of the entire road", being all gravel, drainage, grading and compaction necessary to provide a finished surface with a twenty foot (20) minimum width.
- 2. The extent of the acceptance to be limited to snow removal only, for a two year period. Any major road

repairs required during this period to be performed by the property owner or owners.

3. Upon completion of the two year period, full acceptance of the street will be assumed by the town, unless objection to same is entered by the Selectmen and Road Agent.

SPECIAL MEETING, APRIL 7, 1959

Meeting was called to order by the Moderator, at eight o'clock and the Warrant read.

Article 1. Voted that this Article pass as read with the following Amendment as introduced by Leonard Sanborn, the amendment as follows:

Whereas the non-resident income tax collected by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts from many residents of N. H. (and other states) places an unfair burden on the persons so taxed and

Whereas the persons taxed have no voice in either the imposition of the tax or the use of the revenue derived therefrom and

Whereas the Governor of N. H. and the elected representatives of the State in the United States Congress are known to be opposed to all non-resident state income taxes in principle and to be working for the outlawing of such taxes by amendment to the Constitution of the United States, therefore

Be it resolved that the voters of the Town of Kingston assembled at this duly authorized special meeting are opposed in principle to the imposition of non-resident state income taxes and hereby call upon the officials and representatives of the State to do everything in their power to forward the adoption of a Constitutional amendment rendering such taxes unconstitutional.

Be it resolved further that a copy of this resolution duly signed by the Selectmen, be forwarded to the Governor of N. H., both U.S. Senators from N. H., and the member of the House of Representatives from this district. Article 2. There being less than one half of the legal voters present this Article could not be acted upon.

Article 3. Voted that this Article pass as read. (Acceptance of new streets.)

Voted to adjourn.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

Television no longer appears to be a major competitor with reading. Instead, good television is found to be a stimulus to reading.

At present our greatest problem seems to be to furnish enough books for the readers, especially the young people. This, in spite of the fact that we borrow nearly three hundred books from the bookmobile, each time it visits the library (every ten weeks), to supplement our collection.

The juvenile circulation last year was well over three thousand (3173) and our books are showing the result of use—in other words, are fast wearing out. The total circulation was 8097, a substantial increase over last year.

Money received from fines was used toward replacing worn out classics and improving the high school collection.

Approximately seventy books were borrowed, by special request, from the state library during the year.

New lights were installed in the spring, adding to the charm and dignity of the reading room.

Three special exhibits, consisting of arts and crafts, interior decorating, and travel, were set up by Miss Marjory Stroud, of the New Hampshire state library, during 1959.

National Library Week, April 12-18, was observed with exhibits furnished by members of the Kingston Garden Club, consisting of arrangements of fresh flowers, driftwood, house plants, shells and dried arrangements.

Again, as in the past, the urns were filled by the Club and were a most attractive addition to the exterior.

Work is being done on the card catalogue in order to bring it up to date. New title cards have been typed by Mrs. Andrew Christie.

In October the library received a copy of "Van Nostrand's Scientific Encyclopia" from the state library as a bonus due to the fact that the librarian and/trustees had attended all of the district meetings during the year.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

The work of the Police Department has been, to a great extent, preventative work such as the continuous supervision of traffic through town on weekends and holidays and in another field, the continuous visits and inspections of the large number of unoccupied dwellings and camps in Kingston during the different seasons.

Motor Vehicles continue to cause upsets on the highways and in our daily lives. During the past year we have held five routine road checks of all traffic on the highway to make sure that the vehicles had proper equipment and proper certificates for operation. The following penalties were invoked for automobile violalations:

- 1. Due to Responsibility for Accidents:

 Five licenses and four registrations were suspended for varying periods.
- 2. Due to improper operation of a Motor Vehicle: Four licenses suspended.
- 3. Due to cancellation of liability insurance: Two licenses suspended.
- 4. Failure to file a report of accident:

 One license and one registration suspended.
- 5. Driving while intoxicated:

 Two licenses and one registration suspended.

Besides the above there were twenty-nine automobile accidents handled by this Dept. in 1959 in which twenty persons were injured of which nine were taken to the Exeter Hospital and three to the Hale Hospital. The local Dept. also assisted the State Police with two fatalities. One stolen car was reported and recovered.

All summer homes and camps at our many lakes and

on Pow Wow River were checked periodically by this Dept. aided by members of the Auxiliary Police, resulting in a decided decrease in the number of breaks in these unoccupied dwellings, over previous years.

As usual this Dept. assisted the Sheriff's Dept. and was in turn assisted by it whenever the police business required such an arrangement.

There were five missing persons including three children reported and located during the year in Kingston. Night prowlers were reported and investigated and the annoyance abated on several occasions in West Kingston, South Kingston, Bartlett Street, and the Rockrimmon Road.

Breaks were reported in eight summer homes and two garages during the year. Some of the above are still under investigation.

At this time I wish to thank the members of the reserve squad for their cooperation with the rescue wagon at accidents and fires. Also members of the Police Department and Auxiliary unit for their effective work especially in inspecting property which took many of their days off and for handling traffic during the week of the Carnival.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL CLERK FOR THE KINGSTON SCHOOL DISTRICT

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Kingston, qualified to vote in district affairs held in said Kingston in the Town Hall on March 7, 1959, starting at 8 p.m., the following business was transacted:

Articles 1-2-3-4 and 7 were voted on by Australian Ballot on March 10, 1959, at the time of regular election of town officials.

The minutes of last year's meeting were read and approved.

Article 5. A motion was made and passed that the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and any other officer or agent of the district remain the same as last year.

Article 6. A motion was made and passed that the Auditors' report be accepted as printed.

Leslie Currier, Secretary of the Finance Board, read some recommendations for the School Board, as follows:

- 1. In accordance with the suggestion of the School Committee that a Registered Nurse be hired and that the school resign from the School Union that portion of membership.
- 2. That the Budget for School and Town expenditures be distributed to the Finance Board one week before the Finance meeting.
- 3. That the School Board include in above Budget information in an added column to show increases or decreases for comparison purposes.

The Moderator directed the Clerk to place this report on file.

A motion was made and passed that the School Board be instructed to direct the Superintendent of Schools to report on his work.

Article 8. A motion was made and passed that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$122,564.84 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 9. A motion was made and passed that all purchases made by the School District in excess of \$500.00 should be under the competitive bid system and the sale shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder.

A motion was made and passed (61-59) that next year's School District Meeting be held at the Daniel J. Bakie School.

A motion was made and passed that the meeting be recessed until 10 a.m. on March 10th for Australian Balloting. This meeting closed at 8:58 p.m.

On Tuesday, March 10, 1959, there were a total of 542 votes cast by Australian Ballot and these were counted Tuesday evening. The following results were obtained:

- 1. Leonard F. Sanborn was chosen as Moderator for the coming year. (141 votes)
- 2. Bettie C. Ouellette was chosen as Clerk for the ensuing year. (132 votes)

- 3. Richard W. Senter was chosen as a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years. (223 votes)
- 4. Edmond E. Ingalls was chosen as Treasurer for the ensuing year. (56 votes)
- 7. Irving Johnson (56 votes) and Harry Snow (53 votes) were chosen as Auditors for the School District.

The results of the balloting were read by the Moderator and a motion was made and passed that the meeting be adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Kingston:

I herewith submit my report on the status and needs of our schools:

The schools are providing an adequate education for the pupils at the present time. This I believe is due in large part to the staff. However, they have not received the help they should have, nor do they have all the aids and guides they need to better provide for the various learning experiences that should be presented in the classroom. This is not the responsibility of any one in particular but the fact is evident and therefore we should analyze it carefully.

To begin with, just what type of education do you want for your children? Are you satisfied when they will be able to read the newspapers or magazines, to keep an account of money earned and spent, to be able to write a letter; or do you desire that they might be given the type of education to be able to go to college or other school of specialization. Do you wish them mass educated, or do you hope for some specialized and individualized type of education. Do you want them trained to cope with a home and job or educated to work, think and act as an alert free citizen? Answers to these questions are important because they provide the School Board and Superintendent, as well as the staff with a framework within which to work. Where do our schools fit in relation to the previous questions? Presently I would say somewhere in between. There are things being taught in the classroom that could just as well be learned at home. This means homework and time spent at home with your children learning what material was presented at school, as well as giving the child information in conjunction with it. You the parent are a teacher as well as the person at school. There are things that should be presented in the classroom that are not presently provided. This is due to many factors, such as classrooms too large to provide individual attention, teachers not having a specified area in which to work and many more.

By now you have an idea of what my philosophy is. To state it a little more clearly, I would like to see each child prepared to cope with the complexities of twenty years hence; and to be able to sift the good from the bad, be prepared to make decisions based on past knowledge and skills and provide a worthwhile home, as well as provide civic responsibilities as called upon. It isn't necessary to review the terrific progress of the last twenty years to create a concept of what the next twenty years will be like. This is being done for you every day. Children should have a more specialized and individualized education to withstand, understand and help formulate the future.

What are some of our needs? Those that should be provided as soon as possible are:

- 1. Reduction of class size to 25 or a maximum of 30.
- 2. The development of a program of minimum essentials. This would provide criteria for promotion or non-promotion and assist in the establishment of a certain block of work for the year.
- 3. The development of a program of studies in each subject area and in each grade. This will help to unify what is taught from grade to grade as well as act as a guide for the teachers.
- 4. The development of a basic series in reading, arithmetic, science, social studies, English, spelling, etc. This will eliminate gaps in learning and provide better basic material for the pupils.
- 5. A study and re-valuation of our reporting procedure. Does this present method tell you, the parent, what you really should know? I personally do not feel that it does.

- 6. The development of an adequate permanent record system.
- 7. Adequate supervision of staff and schools. It's humanly impossible to cover this area adequately. An addition to the staff is necessary to carry on adequate and thorough assistance for the staff. I have averaged 2,000 miles a month between 8:00 A.M. and Midnight, attempting to make the rounds.

I have found it necessary to recommend a helping teacher. This person could carry on some of the office functions I am presently doing, thus permitting me to be in the schools more frequently, and as the New Hampshire R.S.A. 186:11 states "To give helpful advice, counsel, and assistance to teachers, pupils and parents . . . as a constructive means of improving the educational growth and development of children, solving pupil problems of retardation and maladjustment, adopting the program of studies to meet the needs . . . bring resources outside of the school to classroom teachers, pupils, parents and community.

The following should be studied and considered:

- 1. A class for the mentally retarded
 - 2. A better guidance program
 - 3. Classes for the academically superior
 - 4. A program for inservice training for teachers

To conclude, I will exert every effort to see that the best is provided for your children within the framework you create. It will be a pleasure to continue working for you as I have confidence that you want your child to be able to compete with any other child, regardless of the place or community in this shrinking world of ours.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

The Nurse's role in school health in recent years has undergone drastic changes. She no longer is the only one to check fingernails, teeth, etc. This is more the province of the teacher who is with the child daily. Minor cuts and bruises are also taken care of by the teacher.

Kingston is most fortunate in having teachers interested in health education and this interest is carried out to a great extent in the classrooms.

What does the School Nurse do? Occasionally I am asked this question. It is a hard one to answer as each day brings new and unusual requests. It is a specialized service with many diversified channels. A recent study at B.U. on the graduate level reveals that school nurses do 131 jobs.

This past year all children received routine checkups on height and weight, hearing and vision. In addition, patch testing and urinalysis were done on each child whose parents were interested.

The child with special problems receives the most attention, in order to bring him or her up to maximum in health, so that the highest scholastic ability for that child may be attained.

I would like to thank all people and groups who have helped make my job easier by offering their services and financial help.
