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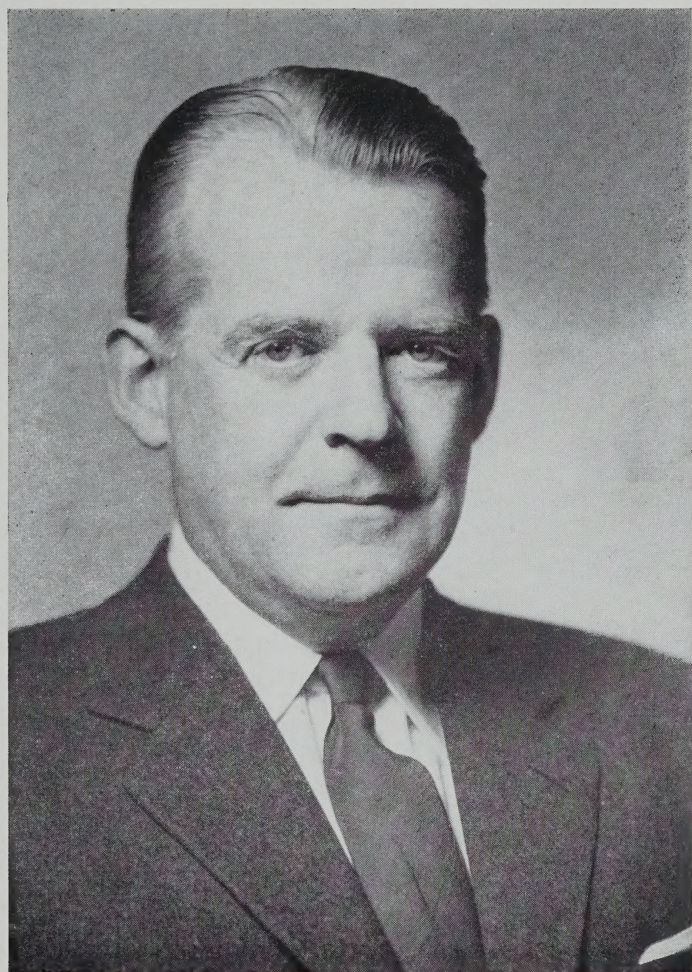
BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

NORRIS COTTON, Republican, of Lebanon, N. H., born Warren, New Hampshire, May 11, 1900; educated Phillips Exeter Academy, Wesleyan University, George Washington University Law School; lawyer, firm of Cotton, Tesreau & Stebbins, Lebanon, N. H.; married in 1927 to Ruth Isaacs, of Union City, Tenn.; secretary to United States Senator George H. Moses, 1924-28; prosecuting attorney for Grafton County, 1933-39; justice, Municipal Court of Lebanon, 1939-43; clerk of New Hampshire State Senate, 1927-29; member of New Hampshire House of Representatives, 1923, 1943 and 1945; chairman, Judiciary Committee and majority leader, 1943; speaker of the House, 1945; delegate, Republican National Convention, 1944; elected to the Eightieth Congress on November 5, 1946; re-elected to the Eighty-First, Eighty-Second, and Eighty-Third Congresses; member of the Committee on Appropriations; elected to the United States Senate, November 2, 1954, to complete the term of the late Senator Charles W. Tobey ending January 3, 1957; member of the Committee on Public Works and Government Operations; sub-committee on Reorganization, including Hoover Plans, Republican Policy Committee; member of bi-partisan Commission on Government Security.



BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

LANE DWINELL, Republican, of Lebanon, N. H., born in Newport, Vermont, November 14, 1906; began education in Newport but moved at an early age with his family to Lebanon, N. H. Graduated from Lebanon High School, Dartmouth College and Amos Tuck School of Business Administration. Holds an honorary degree from Suffolk University. Married in 1932 to Elizabeth Cushman of Lebanon. Financial analyst for General Motors Corporation, 1929-1935. Became associated in 1936 with Carter and Churchill Company, sports wear manufacturers at Lebanon, and since 1941 has been the active head of this Granite State business. Record of his contribution to the business, industrial and public service life of the state is as follows: Director of the New England Council, National Bank of Lebanon, Lebanon Realty Company, New Hampshire Business Development Corp., and This is New Hampshire, Inc. Trustee of Daniel Webster Home for Children. Special justice, Lebanon Municipal Court. Chairman, Lebanon Budget Committee, 1939-1944. President of N. H. Manufacturers Association, 1946-1947. Member of the New Hampshire Constitutional Convention, 1948. Chairman, Interim Fiscal Committee, 1949 General Court. Chairman, Ways and Means Committee, 1949 House of Representatives. Member of N. H. State Board of Education, 1949-1952. Speaker, New Hampshire House of Representatives, 1951-1952. Vice chairman, Republican State Committee of N. H., 1952-1953. Delegate to Republican National Convention in 1952. President, New Hampshire State Senate, 1953-1954. November 2, 1954, elected governor of New Hampshire.

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING

MARCH 13, 1956

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Grafton, SS:

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects, said meeting to be held open until six o'clock in the afternoon:

Article

1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to adopt their recommendations as printed.
2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.
4. To see whether the Town will vote to establish a Town Aeronautical Fund, in accordance with Chapter 423 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated as amended. The monies in said Fund shall be kept in a separate account and not intermingled with other funds of the Town, or act thereon.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed \$90,000.00 for improvements to the facilities at the Lebanon Airport and the acquisition of any real property that may be necessary; and whether the Town will vote to authorize the issue of serial notes or

bonds for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued, including their sale, interest rate, the time and place of payment of Principal, in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act, Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated as amended by Chapter 329, Laws of 1955; said sum to be deposited in the Town Aeronautical Fund and to be expended for the payment of said improvements in a proportion of not more than fifteen per cent (15%) of the total sum available for said improvements, through expenditures by the Town, gifts, and grants of State and Federal funds, or act thereon.

6. To see if the Town will vote to revoke its election heretofore made to have its officers and employees become eligible to participate in the State Employees Retirement System, such election to be effective with respect to officers and employees who shall enter the service of the town on or after July 1, 1956, and with respect to officers and employees in the service of the town on June 30, 1956, who are inactive members of the State Employees Retirement System, or act thereon.

7. On petition of ten or more legal voters to see if the Town will vote to adopt Curfew Regulations as provided by Sections 8 through 13 of Chapter 441 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, as follows: or act thereon

Curfew Regulations

“1. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of sixteen years to be upon any public street, or in any public place, after the hour of nine o'clock in the evening, unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or other suitable person.

“2. The whistle at the Lebanon Fire Station and the whistle at the West Lebanon Fire Station shall be blown at the appointed time, and

shall be called the curfew signal, after which all children under sixteen years of age shall be required to be off the street, except they are in company of a parent, guardian, or other suitable adult person.

“3. **Penalty, Custodian.** Any parent, guardian or other person having the control of any minor under the age of sixteen years who shall permit any such minor to be upon any public street or in any public place in the Town of Lebanon, in violation of these regulations shall be fined not more than five dollars, or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both.

“4. **Penalty, Minors.** For the first violation of these regulations by any such child, it shall be taken to its home by the officers and the parents or guardians shall be notified of the penalty for any subsequent violation.

“5. **Second Offense.** Upon any subsequent violation by any such child, said parents or guardians shall be subject to the provisions of Section 3.”

8. On petition of ten or more legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to repair the River Road, so called, leading from the State Highway near the bridge over Stony Brook, easterly to the State Highway near the viaduct over the railroad and river in Mascoma, or act thereon.
9. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
10. To choose a Town Clerk, a Tax Collector, Overseer of the Poor, Treasurer, a Highway Agent, and a Chief of Police for the ensuing year.
11. To choose two Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.

12. To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.
13. To choose four members to act on the Budget Committee for the ensuing three years.
14. To choose one member to act on the Budget Committee for the ensuing year.
15. To bring in your ballots for six delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
16. To bring in your ballots for ten Republican delegates-at-large and their alternates, and two Republican district delegates and their alternates, or eight Democrat delegates-at-large and their alternates, and two Democrat district delegates and their alternates for Presidential Conventions.
17. To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Lebanon for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library Trustees and Library Treasurer, Lebanon and West Lebanon Cemetery Associations and the Municipal court.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets

December 31, 1954 — December 31, 1955: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1954, and December 31, 1955, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$3,212.82 in 1955,

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$22,535.30, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$17,648.66, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,886.64.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1955, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1955, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls, as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus decreased in 1955 from \$74,397.98 to \$44,450.42, as shown by the following statement:

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

The following contagious diseases were reported to me during 1955: 117 Chicken Pox, 329 Measles, 30 Mumps, three German Measles, 16 Infectious Hepatitis, three Scarlet Fever, two Whooping Cough and two Streptococcus Infection. There were no cases of Polio in the town.

A successful free chest X-Ray survey was held during the fall and resulted in direct assistance to many Lebanon residents.

Again, I would like to thank the doctors, nurses, town officials and citizens for their cooperation during the various clinics and also for their help in reporting promptly any communicable diseases or unsanitary conditions.

DETAILS OF MILK INSPECTION

The main stage of this work is the taking of samples from all supplies. We get to the plant before the farmers arrive with their milk. As they come in, we agitate the milk with a milk agitator, then with a steam sterilized dip we remove one-half pint which is sealed, packed in ice and shipped to the laboratory for examination. The lab report is sent back, examined by me and put on file. Now if this report isn't satisfactory, a repeat sample is taken. If that, too, is unsatisfactory, an effort is made at the farm to find the trouble. We have a good idea what to look for at the farm from our reports. Certain factors will point to improper cooling, other factors point to milk stone on utensils, others point directly to the cow, which usually means mastitis.

If the state inspector comes to town and takes samples, as he frequently does, then his lab report also comes to me and goes on file as if it were my own. Also, I am supposed to see that all stores, restaurants, etc., pay their milk license.

The following is a report of the activities carried on in your town by the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau of Public Health Nursing for the year 1955.

In the months of May and October, the first and second grade children had the opportunity of having the Salk Polio Vaccine at a clinic held at Hanover Street School. About 300 Lebanon children took advantage and had the vaccine. This program was sponsored by the National Polio Foundation and conducted by the N. H. Department of Health, with the cooperation of the Local Health Officer, School Officials, Local Physicians, Local School and District Nurses, Local Nurses who assisted at the clinic and March of Dimes Chairman and her assistants. My sincere thanks to all who generously gave of their time and support to make this program a success. My thanks also to the press and radio for excellent publicity, the organizations who contributed toward Hoodsies for the children, the school bus drivers and most grateful thanks to school officials for use of the school building. The school nurses and local Health Officer need special thanks for assisting with organization.

Home visits have also been made in the community on special cases referred to the Public Health Nurse and arrangements have been made for children to attend the Crippled Children's Clinic at Hanover, as necessary.

REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION

1955 Report

In the past two years, the Lebanon Recreation Commission has gone a long way in fulfilling their aim of providing more and better recreation facilities and recreation programs for the children of Lebanon and West Lebanon.

Our playgrounds are now well supplied with good equipment. Other needed and necessary equipment and supplies may be added from time to time as needs arise.

The 1955 program of coordinated pool and playground activities proved to be a very good one. Each playground had some 200 children registered for program activities and the pool enjoyed one of its greatest years, with daily attendance reaching over 700 children on several occasions.

One of the outstanding special programs which the Recreation Commission has provided, under the leadership of Mrs. Betty Taber, has been the Hallowe'en parties for all children from kindergarten through high school ages. Entertainment, parties and **treats** were provided for more than 1700 children this year and **TRICK OR TREAT** has almost completely disappeared from Lebanon.

This winter, for the first time in many years, the Lebanon children have had the use of the Ski Tow which has been operated through the recreation department. Also, the department provided considerable help in making our ski facilities suitable to hold the New England High School Championships here in Lebanon this winter.

Many improvements and new facilities are being planned by the Recreation Commission and work on these projects will be completed just as fast as budget appropriations can be obtained for these needed facilities. Included in these plans are tennis courts, hockey rink, skating rinks, picnic areas and camping facilities for family groups.

The Recreation Department wishes to acknowledge and thank the Rotary Club for the planting of young trees around the park. We are very grateful to Mrs. Ethel Loomis who donated the trees in memory of her late husband, Mr. George C. Loomis, a former selectman of Lebanon.

The Recreation Department is also grateful to the School Department, Water Department, Fire Department and the Town Highway Department and all other departments, clubs and agencies that have given their complete cooperation toward making our programs a success and the work of our department much easier.

Gentlemen:

At its annual meeting last March, your town voted funds for White Pine Blister Rust Control to be spent in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Commission. Final returns to this department indicated that 91 towns and cities did likewise.

Following our yearly custom, we have prepared, and is attached herewith, a statement briefly summarizing control measures performed in your town during the season of 1955, as well as a record of town and cooperative expenditures; these being made up of state and federal aid expended in eradication and mapping. In view of the fact that the details of control work vary from town to town, it is not possible to report all in a brief account. However, the district leader in charge of the project in your town will be pleased to supply these details upon request. His name and address appear below.

An outstanding fact relating to white pine is that while it occupies only about 27 per cent of the state's woodlands, it annually produces 70 per cent or more of the lumber cut. This is due largely to the fact that it is a prolific forest species, often increasing 500 to 1000 board feet per acre annually. It responds quickly to good forestry practices such as thinning, weeding out of inferior species, and improvement cuttings, as many a New Hampshire farm woodland owner has proved. Operations conducted upon these well managed woodlots have supplied low cost lumber for the repair of farm buildings or construction of additional ones. Apart from this, often substantial cash incomes have been realized through the sale of surplus logs, lumber, pulp and fuel wood.

The present blister rust program is concerned with the infection which, here and there, has developed among the younger stands of pines. For some years, the cutting

of white pine has been sizeable, the average annual production exceeding 200 million board feet. Inspection of a large percentage of logged-off areas has disclosed the following situation: (1) Excellent natural re-seeding with the young trees free from the Rust, and (2) in others, due to soil disturbances brought about by logging, a re-growth of wild Ribes, resulting in starting new centers of infection. Therefore, one of the major phases of control work, at present, is to give as prompt and adequate protection as funds permit to these young stands of white pine, upon which we must depend for future crops of lumber.

In conclusion, the commission wishes to express its appreciation for the splendid cooperation received in the past from your town on this project. It is our hope that within a few years the entire state control area will be on a maintenance basis, thus reducing entirely, or very materially, the requirement of town financing.
