TOWN MEETING WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Littleton, in Said State, Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall and Police Court Room, in the Town Building, on the 11th day of March next, being the second Tuesday of March, at eight o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for the term of three years, a Town Treasurer, a Collector of Taxes, an Overseer of the Poor, an Agent to prosecute violations of the liquor law, three members of the Board of Trustees of the Public Library, each for the term of three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds, a Constable and two Road Agents.

ARTICLE 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the laying out, construction and repairing of highways and bridges, for town building maintenance, for election and registration expenses, for Memorial Day, for Municipal Court expenses, for the Police Department, for the Health Department, for vital statistics, for the Community House, for advertising purposes, for miscellaneous expenses, for street lighting, for band concerts, for cemeteries, for damages and legal expenses, for protection of the premises on the Ammonoosuc River from flood and other water damage, for White Pine Blister, for payment of the town debt and interest, for the Community Nurse, for the Skating Rink, and for all other town charges. ARTICLE 3. To see what action the town will take for the purpose of securing State Aid for construction of highways in this Town under the provisions of an act to provide State Aid and for expenditure of other public monies in the construction of highways throughout the State in accordance with Chapter 17 of the Laws of New Hampshire for 1935, or any amendments thereto, or an allotment for expenditure of funds upon its Town highways.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will authorize its Board of Selectmen to borrow monies, from time to time, for current indebtedness of the Town for the ensuing year, in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the year 1945, and to be paid therefrom.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association 1/100th of one percent of the Town valuation, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and otherwise calling attention to the resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the White Mountains Region.

ARTICLE 9. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 10. To choose any other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year and to choose or elect any agents or committees which may be necessary to carry into effect any vote that may be passed under this warrant.

ARTICLE 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Division of Municipal Accounting State Tax Commission Concord, New Hampshire

Board of Selectmen Littleton, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Littleton covering the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the board of selectmen, treasurer, tax collector, town clerk, trustees of trust funds, municipal court, overseer of the poor, road agents, library treasurer and park commission. The accounts of the Water and Electric Light Department and the Littleton Village District were also audited and separate reports are being made for each of these divisions.

Financial Statements

Comparative Balance Sheets—Dec. 31, 1945-Dec. 31, 1946: (Exh. A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1945 and December 31, 1946, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein a net change in the financial condition of the town a mounting to \$12,318.99, took place during the year which started with a Net Debt of \$6,596.11 and closed with a Surplus of \$5,722.88.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits B & C)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, are presented in Exhibits B and C. As indicated by the budget summary a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,837.76, less a net excess of actual over estimated revenues of \$1,742.96, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$1,094.80.

Reconciliation of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit D)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Exhibit D, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1946, is indicated in Exhibit F.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depositary banks.

Tax Accounts

The tax warrants for the levies of 1946 and previous years and the tax sale accounts were examined. Summaries indicating the activity in these accounts during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, are presented in Exhibits G, H, I, J and K.

Town Clerk

The financial accounts and records of the Town Clerk were examined and audited. All funds received by the Clerk on account of the issuance of motor vehicle permits, dog licenses and from miscellaneous sources were properly accounted for through remittances to the Treasurer or cash on hand. It was noted however that the Clerk's cash on hand as of December 31, 1946, amounted to \$2,112.67, which was subsequently remitted to the Treasurer in January 1947. It is again pointed out that all collections and funds received should be turned over to the Treasurer at the close of the fiscal year in order that such receipts may be included in the Treasurer's accounts for the same year. Failure to do this causes confusion in the accounting. (Exhibit L)

General Comments

It is recommended that a closer check be kept on . the actual town balance from time to time in order to avoid bank overdrafts. The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Littleton for their assistance during the course of the audit.

To the Board of Trustees of the Littleton Public Library, the Annual Report of the Librarian is Herewith Submitted:

The most important problem facing the library at the beginning of 1947 is how to maintain adequate service on a budget set up before the war. The decreased buying power of the dollar affects libraries as much as it does any individual or business. The increased cost of running the library makes itself felt in many places, in equipment, office and library supplies, maintenance and labor. The price of books, the library's stock in trade, has risen 25% in the last two years. This means that for the money that used to buy 100 books, only 75 can now be had. Obviously, the library cannot offer the public the same choice and service on the old book allowance. In addition, the bindings and paper used for these books have been of a poorer, less durable quality. The books wear out more quickly and rebinding is more often necessary. Binding costs have also increased. The only solution to the problem of these pyramiding expenses is an increased book budget.

The Apthorp School has undertaken a school library project. Books for outside reading will be housed in a separate room at the school. The teachers there would like to borrow from us a larger number of books than ever, to be kept for a longer period than the previous classroom collections. Books on the reading level of the first three grades are most urgently needed, and we should like to be able to lend them. Unfortunately, our collection for the primary grades is not extensive enough to afford such large loans. The school's need is real, and ways and means of providing these books should be considered. Again, it is money that is lacking. Last year 343 books were lent to the school; their total circulation was 2,261, a figure that certainly would justify increased effort to supply more books.

The library building is in need of cleaning and repair. It was hoped that this work could be begun in 1946, but due to the shortage of labor and money, most of the renovation has had to be postponed. Temporary measures have been taken to stop leaks in the stackroom roof but further repairs are imperative.

A complete revision of borrowers' registrations was made at the end of 1946. Inactive registrations of more than three years' standing were cancelled. Many of these borrowers will re-register during 1947 and by the end of the year a more accurate record of library users will be available.

Gifts of money and 57 books were received and much appreciated. Mrs. W. E. Wallace presented a book in memory of Arthur B. Knight II, and the friends and neighbors of Walter A. Lang added one as a memorial to him.

A museum for objects pertaining to the history of Littleton was started in the small upstairs room of the library. The committee has received a number of interesting things and will be pleased to have more.

The librarian attended the annual meeting of the New England Library Association at Swampscott, Massachusetts, in October, an inspiring and helpful conference.

I would like to thank the Board of Trustees and the patrons of the library for their interest and help during the year.

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Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and Citizens of Littleton:

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report relative to your schools.

The past year has again brought several changes in faculty membership. We were fortunate in retaining the valuable services of sixteen of our experienced teachers. Nine new members were engaged.

Mr. Horace Burrington, a graduate of Massachusetts State College, with graduate study at Columbia University, and experience in the armed services, is teacher of science and mathematics.

Miss Joyce Cleland, a graduate of Bates College last June, is teacher of French, English, girls' physical education, and girls' basketball.

Mr. Arthur Harrison, a graduate of Tufts College with graduate study at Ohio State University, and experience in the armed services, is social studies teacher, boys' physical director, and athletic coach.

Miss Helen Pearce, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, with three years teaching experience in Glenfield, New York, is junior high teacher of English, science, and geography.

Miss Anne Blanchard, a graduate of Boston University, with several years of experience as private teacher and director, and four years public teaching experience in Brooks and Westbrook, Maine, is music teacher and supervisor. Miss Ruth Holmes, a graduate of Lyndon Normal School, with three years teaching experience at Readsboro, Vermont, is teaching Grades 1 and 2 at the Apthorp School.

Miss Norma Nichols, a graduate of Keene Teachers' College, with eight years teaching experience at Hampton Falls, Stratham, and Claremont, is teacher of Grades 2 and 3 at the Apthorp School.

Miss Marguerite Carroll, a graduate of Lyndon Normal School, with ten years teaching experience at Concord and St. Johnsbury, Vermont, is third grade teacher at the Kilburn School.

Mrs. Ann Cookman, a graduate of Keene Teachers' College, with nine years teaching experience at Mt. Holly, Vermont, Hartford, Vermont and Gilsum, is sixth grade teacher at the Kilburn School.

The enrollment last year as well be seen by the table at the end of this report was 663. This year a total of 637 have registered to date as compared with 644 at the corresponding time a year ago.

In addition to the ordinary repairs and maintenance of buildings and equipment, the major improvements to school property this past year have been replacements of many worn window shades and the tarvia treatment of the Kilburn playground. The cooperation of Mr. Beattie Richardson and the State Highway Department in the playground work was most helpful and was greatly appreciated.

The medical inspection report of last year showed 626 pupils were examined and the following defects noted and reported to parents: Underweight 105, defective vision 70, defective hearing 2, cardiac disease 2, deformity 3, defective teeth 57, diseased tonsils 10.

The following clinics were held: Vision, dental, orthopedic, tuberculosis and toxoid. Special physical examinations were given the members of the athletic teams.

The penny milk program is again being carried on this year. A lunch of hot cocoa or soup is served at cost during the winter to noon pupils.

Information concerning the high school is furnished in Headmaster Cummings' report. Conditions are generally good in all of our schools. Mr. Cummings, Mrs. Holman, Miss O'Neill and their associate teachers merit praise for their good work.

Developments during the past year have made sound financial planning very difficult. Prices which were high a year ago, have increased still more. Everything from office supplies, paper, and textbooks, to coal, floor wax, and soap has increased steadily in cost. Arithmetic paper, for instance, has nearly doubled in price. As another example, the penny milk program no longer finances itself and is costing \$600.00 more than anticipated.

By far the most serious problem facing school organizations today is that of securing capable, trained teachers. Turnover in the teaching profession has been devastating since 1940, as thousands of teachers have quit the profession entirely, while many others continuing in the profession moved to metropolitan positions with advantages in salary, tenure, location, or living conditions.

Replacements for these teachers are not being trained. In the elementary field in our own state the State Board of Education estimates that we lose some 200 teachers each year. In the freshman classes at Plymouth and Keene Teachers Colleges there are only 45 students preparing for elementary teaching. Much the same situation exists in the high school field. When the present supply of teachers turns over we will have grave difficulty finding replacements.

As the supply has been decreasing, more and more teachers without required training have been engaged in many sections of the state, particularly in rural or poor paying districts. These people of whom there are several hundred at the present time, have been granted temporary, emergency teaching credentials by the State Board of Education. All Littleton teachers have the qualifications required for permanent certificates. Most of them are experienced as well. We may well feel fortunate that we have been able to maintain this standard. However, in the past few years when vacancies have occurred, it has been increasingly difficult to fill them with capable and gualified teachers. A decided trend upward in teacher salaries is apparent in practically all localities. If we are to have good teachers for our children we must be able to offer salaries attractive enough to compete advantageously with other places. With the supply of teachers limited, the districts that pay best will in the long run secure and keep the best teachers.

Many people among teachers, parents and the public at large have shown much generous cooperation this past year. I am sure that the school organization appreciates their many kindnesses. Continuation of this fine attitude will assist all of us in providing the best possible schools for Littleton children.

REGISTRATION

The total registration to date is 300 which is an increase of 4 over last year. The increase is in senior high school where the enrollment is greater by 16 pupils. Of this number 12 pupils have withdrawn. The causes of these withdrawals are:

ATTENDANCE

The attendance record for the school is as follows:

These figures show an improvement over last year even though many pupils are still employed in our local stores.

THE CURRICULUM AND TIME-TABLE

No change was made in the time-table this year. Two half unit courses were added to the curriculum, namely, Business Law and Salesmanship. It is hoped that these courses will help to meet the needs of many

pupils and at the same time strengthen the commercial course.

EXTRA-CURRICULA ACTIVITIES

The program of extra-curricula activities includes football, basketball, winter sports, baseball, music both vocal and instrumental, dramatics, Spring track, publication of The Record and socials throughout the year.

GRADUATES

A follow-up of the graduates of 1946 has revealed the fact that all are gainfully employed, in the armed forces, or in post secondary institutions. Of the 46 graduates, 10 are in the armed forces and 11 in schools of higher education as follows:

VETERANS SERVICE

Littleton High School has been ready to render any service possible to veterans who have returned after receiving their discharges. Nine veterans who were former pupils were awarded diplomas in June as a result of credits allowed for technical training while in the armed forces, or for credit allowed after having satisfactorily passed the General Educational Development Tests. Since June 1946, two veterans have received diplomas and five have received High School

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Equivalence Certificates as a result of taking the G. E. D. Tests. This service is still open to any veteran who desires to make use of the same. Two veterans have returned to regular high school courses.
