SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

OF THE SELECTMEN.

The policy of road repair for the past year has been to expend with a view of obtaining results of a more permanent character. About sixty miles of road has been put in good order. Much rock and many stones have been blasted and dug out, which is a very lasting improvement. Several districts have not been reached as but one road machine was suitable for service, which machine was devoted to the most urgent needs.

About \$215 have been expended on Hill bridge and the pier, which have needed repair for some years.

Conditions were such as to prevent the construction of the state road, the appropriation for which remains in the treasury.

Badly delayed freight service prevented the timely completion of the snow rolls,—a part of the material coming from the west. The rolls are now both available for service.

The attention of every policy holder is called to the following:-

By vote at the annual meeting of the Company held January 7, 1901, policy holders wishing to remain away longer than thirty days may keep the insurance on their property good, by applying to the Secretary for a permit to leave their premises unoccupied for such time as they may specify, paying for the same five cents per month for every one hundred dollars for which they are insured.

SCHOOL REPORT.

It is a cause of congratulation that we have had thirty weeks of schooling for the year. It is the first time in our history that we have reached so large a number. This has been true of each of the nine schools which we have supported. Had we run ten schools on the same money we should have had less schooling.

Owing to local conditions we were able to provide for the children of the Morrison school, at the Bay; and those of New State, at Hill Village. The money saved helped to prolong our schools; thus, we have demonstrated again the wisdom of consolidating when practical.

The school sites, Stone Bridge, Brook, and Morrill, remain, as last year, unoccupied. The pupils of these localities have been centered at other points.

There was a break in the work of the Calef Hill school during the spring and summer term because of the illness of the teacher, but the loss was made up the following term.

Teachers have been employed as follows: M. Pearl Colby, Calef Hill, first term, Mary F. Smith, the second; Millie F. W. Wilson, Square, first term, Dr. G. C. Ward, the second; Vernie D. Clement, Hunkins, first term, Helen M. Sibley, second; Alice W. Leavitt, Meadow, both terms; Grace L. Collins, Bay; Stella M. Thomas, Gaza; Jessie F. Sheffield, Chapel; Grace M. Harris, Osgood; George W. Gilman, North Sanbornton, first term, Mary N. Redding, the second. All of these teachers but one had previously taught, and they were generally successful in their work. Better discipline in two of the schools would have given better results.

Nineteen pupils have attended secondary schools at the expense of the town; they were located as follows: Laconia, 4; Bristol, 1; Franklin, 2; Colby Academy, 1; NewHamptonLiterary Institution, 3; Tilton Seminary, 8.

As heretofore, the old district names and numbers are used to designate the schools.
