THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown. in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Town of Stewartstown, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid. 1.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget,

and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:

- (a) Town Officers' Salaries.(b) Town Officers' Expenses.
- (c) Election and Registration.
- (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
 (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
- (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
- (g) Health Department.(h) Town Dump.
- (i) Vital Statistics.
- (j) General Expense of Highway Department.
- (k) Civil Defense.
- (1) Interest on Temporary Loans.
- (m) Interest on Bonds.
- (n) County Tax.
- (o) Payment on Bonds.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.

- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town wil vote to raise one thousand four hundred and fifty dollars (1,450.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$88.42 to the White Mountain Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize Select-

men to extend the Diamond Pond Road from the State road to the spring lot and appropriate money for same.

- To see if the Town will vote to allow the Collector 14. of Taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and to fix the amount thereof.
- To see if the Town will vote to buy 25 chairs for 15. the town hall and raise money for same.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Select-

men to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-Partisan ballot.

17. To choose by Non-Partisan ballot the following

Town Officers:

- (a) Town Clerk.
- (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
- (c) Town Treasurer.
- (d) Three Road Agents.(e) One or more Auditors.
- (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
- (g) One or more Sextons.(h) Overseer of Poor.
- (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.

(i) One Librarry Trustee for three years ensuing.

To transact any other business that 18. may be legally brought before this meeting.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the

district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to sell the South Hill School Building.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

Foreword

As time goes on with little apparent change in the tense political situation of the world, our attention is focused more and more upon our war potential as compared with that of the countries with a different philosophy of life. If this comparison were to be made from the standpoint of population alone, there would be grave cause for alarm. Our hope for security must lie then in an educational program in our schools of such a nature that the effectiveness of American manpower will be increased beyond that of any other nation. This means that the qualitative capabilities of our young people must be developed to the degree that they will later as adults more than compensate for any quantitative shortage in this respect.

Acknowledgement of this added responsibility of helping boys and girls to develop a competency which will stand them in good stead in case of an emergency, to the many already being carried by our schools, means that educational theory must go beyond the recognition of the importance of the problems, needs, and interests of the learner. It must help our youth to use the method of intelligence rather than of emotions when they come to grips with the many and varied social problems at different maturity levels. Assistance will need to be given in the clarification of value alternatives and in the understanding and practicing the democratic way of life. In addition it will be necessary to set up learning experiences of a type which will best meet these needs, problems and tensions of young people; which will best illuminate for them the social realities of our times; and which will help them most to think through their basic convictions.

In order to provide learning situations conducive to the development of an understanding and appreciation of the experiences had, to the extent that effective and appropriate action may result, two fundamental laws of learning are of significance. First, that material is remembered in proportion as it is meaningful, and second, that learning will last in proportion as it is made significant to the learner. With these two laws in mind, the indications are that the best learning will take place and be remembered the longest when motivation is strong, the purpose clear, and its use thoughtful. And that this learning will be effective only when concepts are used which make it possible to generalize and to standardize,---so that meanings are general because they are applicable in a variety of instances in spite of their differences-and yet they are constant, uniform, and self-identical in what they refer to and are standardized known points of reference.

Teachers

It means much during this continued period of acute teacher shortage to have all of our veteran teachers continue to work with us. Principal Velma H. Gray, Junie S. Aldrich, and Cleora M. Richardson teach Grades 7-8, 4-6, and 1-3 respectively at the West Stewartstown School. Doris J. Chappell teaches Grades 5-8 at the Cedar Brook School, and Harriet O. Plante teaches Grades 1-4 at the Hollow School.

School Nurse

With the shortage of nurses just as serious as that of teachers, it means much also to have our veteran nurse, Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, continue to look after the health of the school children in this supervisory union. Concrete evidence increasingly indicates that the degree of success attained in academic school work, as in physical work, is determined to a very considerable extent by the overall health status maintained by the pupil.

Notes on the Budget

The Budget of the School Board for 1953-54 is \$37,559.00 as compared to \$38,763.00 raised and appropriated by the district to operate the schools for the current year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$5,000 which leaves a requested appropriation of \$32,559.00 to be raised by taxes by the town in comparison to \$34,739.00 for this year. Although provision has been made in the budget for increases in some instances, decreases made in others plus an anticipated increase in the estimated income has made it possible to ask for a smaller appropriation than that of last year. Detailed information in the budget breakdown is printed on subsequent pages in this report.

Buildings and Equipment

The policy of providing and maintaining facilities and equipment which will be conducive to effective learning and teaching has been continued during the past year. The insulation of the ceiling at the Hollow School has helped, as it did at the Cedar Brook School. to both conserve fuel and to make the classroom more comfortable. At the West Stewartstown School the room now occupied by Grades 1-3 and the boy's base-ment were painted. This means that all the classrooms and both basements in the building have received interior decoration within the past four years. Additional work done at this same building included repair of the concrete steps leading to the front entrance, replacement of the old eaves through with a new one, and the laying of a new floor on the north side porch. From time to time, also, necessary minor repairs are made to all three buildings presently being used.

The provision of metal folding chairs at the West Stewartstown School has been of great help when working with musical groups and in the presentation of school programs. The district appreciates greatly

the generosity of Nathan A. Ancell and William J. Morrissey for furnishing a large number of these chairs as well as for their presentation to the school and the local church jointly a moving picture projector and a film strip projector. With these machines it makes it possible to use the excellent audio-visual materials which are now available.

Playgrounds and the second second

With the completion of the grading and improvements of an area immediately joining the south side of the Hollow School lot, which was given to the district through the generosity of Leonard E. Owen, playground facilities are provided which help greatly to alleviate the former traffic hazard at this school. The district can well be proud of the playground facilities and equipment at each of its schools which are conducive to greater safety, better organization and more effective supervision.

Enrollment and Attendance

Little change has taken place in the enrollment of pupils in our schools since last year, as there are 97 enrolled at the present time in contrast to 98 a year ago. A breakdown of the former figure shows that there are 59 at the West Stewartstown School, and 19 each at the Hollow and Cedar Brook Schools. The average percentage of attendance for the past year at these schools in the same order listed was 96.16, 90.12, and 93.47 while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the same period was .63, .33, and .94

Tuition Pupils

The number of tuition pupils enrolled in secondary schools outside the district is 42 whereas last year there were 43 attending at this time. Of the former number 25 are at Canaan High School and 17 are at Colebrook Academy.

One elementary school pupil is attending the school for the deaf at Brattleboro, Vermont. And 7 elementary pupils are attending the West Stewartstown School from the Hall Stream Section in Pittsburg.

Legislation

With a new Governor and Legislature, and with possible changes being made in both the formula and adjusted valuation of real estate plus steadily increasing enrollments, the amount of state financial aid to education to be distributed to the individual school districts for the next two years is very uncertain.

Conclusion

Again I wish to express my sincere and deep appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help and cooperation received in our work together to keep standards high in our schools.
