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

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Swanzey in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Swanzey on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To elect two members to the State Constitutional Convention.

4. To elect delegates to the National Conventions of parties eligible to be voted for.

5. Polls will be open at 10:00 a. m. Voting to be under the rules of biennial elections.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary for the year of 1948 in anticipation of taxes provided by law.

7. To see if the Town will vote to acquire by purchase from the Public Service Company of New Hampshire with any funds available the title to the land in the bed of Wilson Pond, so-called and the Pond No. 2 northerly of the road from Swanzey Factory to South Keene and including the dams at the outlet of each said ponds and all rights pertaining thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$730.45 the State to give \$2,921.81 for T.R.A. roads, so-called.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for Memorial Day, or take any action thereon.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,700.00 for Old Age Assistance, or take any action thereon.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for Town Poor, or take any action thereon.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$9.000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$6,000.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department, or take any action thereon.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,900.00 for the District Nurse Association, or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for Old Home Day, or take any action thereon.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the Stratton Free Library, or take any action thereon.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the Mt. Caesar Union Library, or take any action thereon.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the Swanzey Community House Library, or take any action thereon.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$700.00 for the maintenance of the Police Department, or take any action thereon.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$350.00 for the upkeep of the cemeteries, or take any action thereon.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for parks and playgrounds, or take action thereon.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$620.00 (31 hydrants at \$20.00 each) the same to be paid to the North Swanzey Water and Fire precinct for hydrant service in that part of the Town of Swanzey.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 to defray interest charges during the ensuing year.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

25. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine blister rust control, to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department.

26. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money to purchase a truck for the Highway Department.

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to purchase a new truck and equipment for the East Swanzey Fire Department.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to re-surface and oil Forest Avenue in West Swanzey.

29. To see if the Town will vote to repair or replace the heating equipment and water pump at Whitcomb Hall in West Swanzey and to provide adequate fuel and janitor service for the said Whitcomb hall and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for that purpose.

30. To see if the Town will vote to install 2 Electric lights on Pine Street, 1 on Grove Street, 1 on Park Street, 1 on Maple Street, North Swanzey.

31. To see if the Town will vote to install 1 Electric light on Spring Street, in West Swanzey.

32. To see if the Town will vote to install 2 Street lights on Cobble Hill Road, in West Swanzey.

33. To see if the Town will vote to install 1 street light between Main Street and the Granger apartment house, in West Swanzey.

34. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street lights, or take any action thereon.

35. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 to clean up the old cemetery, so-called, on Homestead Ave., in West Swanzey.

36. To hear the report of the Planning Board and take any action thereon.

37. To see if the Town will vote to amend the zoning map dated September 8, 1947 by including as a Residence District the following property: All of the land within FIVE HUNDRED feet Northerly and Southerly of the center line of Young Court and extending Easterly from the East line of the highway known as the Troy Road for a depth of ONE THOU-SAND feet.

38. To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 5 of the Zoning Ordinance so that said section shall read as follows:

Section 5

1. Every new dwellng house erected and every existing building proposed to be altered or utilized for a dwelling house in a Residence District, a Business District or in a General District on the roads specified in Section 4, within THREE HUN-DRED feet from the center line of any such General District highway, shall have a minimum ground floor area of SIX HUNDRED square feet, outside dimensions, for each family unit. Plans for such new dwelling houses or such existing buildings as are proposed to be altered or utilized for dwelling houses, shall be submitted to the Board of Adjustment before the beginning of the work on utilization as a dwelling house, and no new dwelling shall be erected nor shall any existing building for a dwelling house except with the approval in writing of the Board of Adjustment.

Every new building of every sort thereafter erected and every existing building hereafter moved or enlarged in a Residence District, a Business District or in a General District on the roads specified in Section 4 within THREE HUNDRED feet from the center line of any such General District highway shall be set back from the front property line, not less than THIRTY feet, or such distance as shall conform to the line of existing property, whichever distance shall be the lesser; and the side of any such building facing the front property line shall be paralleled thereto. All new buildings and every existing building hereafter moved or enlarged shall be set back at least TEN feet from the side and rear property lines.

39. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$11,767.99 for the Samuel A. Read Fund. The income of said fund to be used annually in the support of the Community House at East Swanzey, N. H. Should said Community House cease to exist or to function, the income to be used by the District or Public Nursing Association of Swanzey, by whatever name it may be known.

40. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$300.00 for the Edward A. and William H. Nelson fund for the care of their lot in Swanzey Center Cemetery.

- 41. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 for the Ephriam and Ray BeDorr fund for the care of their lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

42. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 for the Nelson A. Collier fund for the care of his lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

43. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 to be added to the Howard and Harvey Fund, now in existence for the care of their lots in Oak Hill Cemetery.

The Swanzey Planning Board, acting as a zoning commission under the authority given to it by law, hereby reports that on August 19, 1947 it filed a Preliminary Report relative to the zoning of the Town, that upon that Preliminary Report, it has conducted a public hearing and that as a result of its investigations, discussions and the public hearing, it now recommends the adoption by the Town of the Attached zoning regulations and the adoption by the Town of the boundaries of the various districts as shown on the attached map of the Town.

ZONING ORDINANCE

To promote the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the community by regulating and restricting the use and construction of buildings and premises in the Town of Swanzey and for said purposes dividing the Town into districts, the following ordinance is hereby enacted by the voters of said Town of Swanzey pursuant to the authority conferred by the Revised Laws of the State of New Hampshire.

SECTION 1

Establishment of Districts

For the purposes of this ordinance, the Town of Swanzey

is divided into three districts as shown on the Zoning Map dated September 8, 1947 and filed with the Selectmen:

- A. Residence Districts.
- B. Business Districts.
- C. General Districts.

SECTION 2

Residence District Uses

In the residence districts, no building or premises shall be erected, altered or used and no land shall be used for any purpose except:

1. Dwellings, including lodging, rooming or boarding houses, apartment or tenement houses and accommodations for tourists and overnight guests.

2. Churches, public buildings or clubs.

3. Farms and truck or home gardens, excluding any use injurious, noxious or offensive to the neighborhood but including the sale of produce raised on the premises.

4. Such accessory uses as are customary in connection with the foregoing uses and are incidental thereto but not including any business. Accessory uses may include the practice of a profession within the premises in which the practitioner resides and also dressmaking, millinery and similar home occupations not conducted as a regular business.

No land in this district shall be used for a dump or for storage of abandoned vehicles or parts thereof, junk, scrap paper, rags or discarded material of any kind, nor used in a manner that is disorderly, unsightly, noxious or detrimental to the public or prejudicial to the general welfare.

No land in this district shall be used for a so-called gravel bank nor shall any part of the topsoil or subsoil be removed from any part of premises in this district except in connection with construction undertaken upon such premises.

No signs shall be permitted except the following: Town and State highway directional and regulatory signs, historic signs and those signs used to advertise the profession or goods dealt in by owner or occupant of property on which placed. No sign or group of signs shall exceed twenty square feet, outside dimensions, and none shall be placed so as to obstruct the view on the highway.

SECTION 3

Business District Uses

In the business district, no building or premises shall be erected, altered or used and no land shall be used for any purposes except:

1. Any purpose or accessory use authorized in the residence district.

3. Restaurant or other eating place.

3. Wholesale or retail stores, sales stores for trade, or shops for custom work or the making of articles to be sold at retail on the premises.

4. Business or professional offices, banks and the conduct of similar professional or business enterprises.

5. Commercial amusement places including theatres, bowling alleys, skating rinks, billiard rooms, dance halls and places of similar indoor recreation.

6. Garages for the storage or repair of cars; gasoline and oil filling stations.

7. Such industrial or manufacturing uses as are not injurious, noxious, offensive or otherwise objectionable or hazardous to the community for any cause, for which the Board of Adjustment, upon petition, issues approval in writing. In the event of such a use being permitted, no building or structure shall be built of a height more than three stories or floors, not to exceed forty feet, except in such cases as may be approved by the Board of Adjustment and no building shall be built or erected for any purpose closer than twenty feet from the sides of the lot nor closer than thirty feet from the property line adjoining the street.

8. Such accessory uses as are customary in connection with the foregoing uses and are incidental thereto. Accessory uses shall not include the deposit or placing outside of any building any waste, refuse or ashes, or the storage of any gasoline or oil. No land in this district shall be used for a dump or for storage of abandoned vehicles or parts thereof, junk, scrap paper, rags or discarded material of any kind, nor used in a manner that is disorderly, unsightly, noxious or detrimental to the public or prejudicial to the general welfare.

No land in this district shall be used for a so-called gravel bank nor shall any part of the topsoil or subsoil be removed from any part of premises in this district except in connection with construction undertaken upon such premises.

SECTION 4

General District Uses

In a general district, there shall be no restriction on the use of any building erected or altered thereon nor on the use of the land except that on such parts of the following highways as fall within a general district:

The highway from North Swanzey to Richmond through Swanzey Center,

The state highway known as the Troy Road,

The highway through East Swanzey from the Richmond Road to the Troy Road,

The highway in North Swanzey running from the Troy Road to South Keene,

The highway known as Goodale Avenue,

The highway known as the Lake Road running from the Richmond Road to the back road from West Swanzey to Westport,

The highway known as the back road to Westport running from West Swanzey to Westport.

The highway known as Winchester Street running through West Swanzey from the Keene line to the Winchester line;

The highway from Winchester Street to Swanzey Center over Sawyers Crossing;

The highway known as the Matthews Road;

The highway known as the back road from Swanzey Center to West Swanzey;

The highway known as the Base Hill Road,

The highway known as Hale Hill Road in East Swanzey,

The highway known as Winch Hill Road from the Lake Road to the Richmond line, including Mill Hill and Pebble Hill Roads.

The highway from West Swanzey to Swanzey Lake over Christian Hill,

The highway known as Cobble Hill Road from the residence district through the property of Arthur Rixford,

The highway known as West Street in West Swanzey from the residence district through the property of Baird,

The highway known as the Warmac Road,

The highway known as the Oliver Hill Road from the Richmond Road to the property of Albert Dusey.

The highway known as Talbot Hill Road from Richmond Road to Road along east side of Swanzey Lake,

1. No land shall be used to the depth of five hundred feet from the center line of any such public highway for a dump or for the storage of abandoned vehicles or parts thereof, junk, scrap paper, rags or discarded material of any kind.

2. No land shall be used to the depth of three hundred feet from the center line of any such public highway for a sc-called gravel bank nor shall any part of the topsoil or subsoil be removed from any such premises except in connection with construction undertaken upon the premises.

SECTION 5

1. Every dwelling house erected in a Residence District, a Business District or in a General District on the roads specified in Section 4 within three hundred feet from the center line of any such General District highway shall have a minimum ground floor area of six hundred square feet, outside dimensions, for each family unit.

Plans for such dwelling houses shall be submitted to the Board of Adjustment before the beginning of the work and no such dwelling shall be erected except with the approval in writing of the Board of Adjustment.

Every new building of every sort hereafter erected in a Residence District, a Business District or in a General District on the roads specified in Section 4 within three hundred feet from the center line of any such General District highway shall be set back from the front property line not less than thirty feet, or such distance as shall conform to the line of existing buildings on adjacent property; and the side of any building facing the front property line shall be parallel thereto. All new buildings shall be set back at least ten feet from the side and rear property lines.

2. All chimneys, in any District, shall be constructed of stone or brick to the ground; each shall be lined with tile and extend at least two feet above the roof to which it belongs and shall have a clean-out opening at the base. All entrances to chimneys shall be of fire-proof construction. Chimneys shall not be used to support beams or timbers in any manner. No smoke pipe shall be installed so as to be within twelve inches of any combustible floor or ceiling, unless amply protected with non-combustible material. No smoke pipe shall be installed which passes into or through partitions or walls of combustible materials, except when guarded by a double collar of metal with air space of at least five inches or by at least five inches of brick or other non-combustible material between the pipe and the combustible material.

3. New Development.

The owner of any plot of ground intended for development or subdivision into building lots shall file with the Planning Board a plan or map of the proposed subdivision and shall obtain the approval of the Planning Board thereon before proceeding with the development or sale of lots in said subdivision.

It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to inspect the site of such proposed subdivision and to require such roadway and other areas for common use as will eventually be acceptable by the Town, and to approve the same when satisfied that such proposed plans are in harmony with and conducive to the general welfare of the Town and the neighborhood but in no sense shall this approval be deemed an acceptance by the Town of the street or streets.

SECTION 6 Non-Conforming Uses

Any lawful use of land or of a building or part thereof at the time of the adoption of this ordinance may be continued, although such use does not conform to the provisions of this ordinance. Any building occupied by a non-conforming use may be structurally altered or the use of such building changed to any other use not more detrimental to the character of the district in which it is located. Should any non-conforming building occupied by a non-conforming use be destroyed or damaged by fire or other casualty, in whole or in part, it may be replaced by a building to be used for the same purpose as the one destroyed, provided that such reconstructed building or new building shall not exceed in cubic contents the original building by more than twenty-five per cent.

Provided however that where or whenever an existing non-conforming use is or becomes discontinued or abandoned for a continuous period of one year, any subsequent use shall conform to the terms of this ordinance.

No present non-conforming use shall be extended or enlarged beyond the limits or area occupied by such non-conforming use on the date of the adoption of this ordinance.

Provided further that whenever any building, the use of which has been abandoned and neglected for a period of three years, has been allowed to become in such condition as to cause it to be injurious, noxious or offensive to the neighborhood, or which by reasons of such abandonment or neglect shall, in the opinion of the Board of Adjustment, constitute a dangerous hazard, it may be razed by order of the Board of Adjustment and Selectmen at the expense of the Town.

SECTION 7

Board of Adjustment

The Selectmen shall make the initial appointment of a Board of Adjustment of five members, one for a term of five years, one for a term of four years, one for a term of three years, one for a term of two years and one for a term of one year, each term to expire on the date of the annual Town Meeting, each member to serve until his successor is elected and without compensation. Thereafter upon expiration of the term of any member of said Board, his successor shall be elected at Town Meeting for the term of five years.

The Board shall have authority to allow slight variances from the specific terms of this ordinance, where it can be shown that they would result in unnecessary hardship but when an objection is raised by a majority of the families residing or owning property within a radius of five hundred feet of the property in question, the Board shall hold a public hearing to receive evidence on both sides and shall have authority to decide whether the permit shall be issued or not.

SECTION 8

Penalties

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars for each day of such violation.

SECTION 9

Enforcement

Upon any well founded information that this ordinance is being violated, the Selectmen shall, on their own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 10 Validity

The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance shall not invalidate any other section or provision hereof.

SECTION 11 Amendment

The provisions of this ordinance may be amended or changed at any regular or special Town Meeting by a majority of the voters present as provided by law.

SECTION 12

Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Swanzey qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the ninth day of March 1948, at one o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

7. To see if the District will vote to make any alterations in the report of the School Board recommending the amount of money required for the support of schools and payment of statutory obligations.

8. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to make a contract with the Union School District of Keene for high school instruction for 1948-1949 at a rate of one hundred twenty dollars (\$120) per pupil.

9. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500), an amount which was subtracted by error from the needed revenue in the 1947-1948 budget. 10. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (1,000) to pay the salary of an assistant teacher from January 5, 1948, until the close of the school year in June.

11. To see if the district will vote to consider the possibility of erecting a new school in Swanzey Center or other suitable location and appoint a committee to investigate the problem and to report its findings at the next annual meeting or any special meeting which might be called.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Swanzey:

I have the honor to submit my first annual report.

Teachers: The opening of schools in September saw three new teachers in Swanzey. At the Cutler School Mrs. Adelaide Niles, a graduate of Bellows Falls Training School. replaced Mrs. Ruby K. Ramsay in grades 3 and 4. In the same school. Mrs. Mary Bergeron, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, was elected to the vacancy in grades 5 and 6 created by the resignation of Miss Millicent Williams who is now teaching in Laconia. Mrs. Evelyn Osborn was elected as teacher of the lower grades in the East Swanzey School replacing Miss Viola Fenton who resigned. Mrs. Osborn is a graduate of Concord Training School, Concord, New Hampshire. Mrs. Florence Kellom has been teaching the upper grades of the Hopkins School since October 14, due to the prolonged illness of Mrs. Florence Nims.

Buildings and Grounds: The usual summer repairs and painting were done during the vacation period. In addition, at East Swanzey a new dry well was constructed to improve drainage from the cesspool; a new chimney was built; the furnace reinforced by a new foundation; and the interior of the school completely painted. Painting was also done on the exterior of the Wilcox School and in the interior of the Hopkins School.

The townspeople of Swanzey should give considerable thought to the possibility of constructing a new grade school building in the central part of town. A good location would be somewhere between the Wilcox and Hopkins Schools. Our present facilities are entirely inadequate and will become increasingly more so as the enrollments continue to grow. The two room buildings are becoming overcrowded and the education of Swanzey pupils will suffer as a result. It behooves the good people of Swanzey to take account of stock and make plans for their future educational plant. An eight room building situated in Swanzey Center would be a profitable investment in the education of the youth of the town. Not only would it replace the present three outmoded tworoom structures, but would alleviate to a degree some of the pressure beginning to build up in the Cutler School in West Swanzey. The immediate educational advantages in such a move are at once quite apparent.

In a school where there is but one grade to a room, the children receive more of the teacher's time in any given subject than in the case where there are four grades to a room. A modern eight room building would also have facilities for audio-visual education. It would be equipped to serve hot lunches. An auditorium for assemblies, plays, concerts, etc., is usually incorporated in a modern elementary school. If Swanzey could boast of such a school, her citizens might well feel that they were providing the best of educational opportunities for their children.

Enrichment of Living Curriculum Program: Two of our schools have participated actively in the Enrichment of Living Program associated with Keene Teachers College, which received one of the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Fellowships. The pupils of the Cutler and Hopkins Schools have taken part in the program under the direction of Mrs. Capron and Mrs. Nims. The goal of the program is the improvement of living of the community and the children in the school.

Plans for the beautification of both schools were formulated by the pupils under expert guidance. These plans were then carried out and both schools as a result became much more attractive. What is perhaps much more important is the fact that the pupils have developed a pride in their schools and consequently their citizenship traits have been vastly improved.

Instructional Activities: There has been perhaps less emphasis placed upon the tool subjects in our schools during the past fifteen or twenty years than there should have been. The curricula has expanded to an extent not known in a former generation. Progressive education has been in the forefront and too aften this has been at the expense of the fundamental tool subjects. However, the pendulum has at last begun to swing back and renewed attention is being given to the fundamentals.

Arithmetic tests have been given to all pupils in Union No. 25, in grades 3-8 to ascertain how we compare with other sections of the country. Some results were good, others not so gratifying. At least the pupils and teachers are arithmetic conscious and an immediate improvement should be the result.

Spelling, reading, and handwriting will be attacked in much the same way. It is highly essential that our pupils go forth from our schools able to figure, spell, read and write respectably and effectively.

Health: In his address to the teachers of New Hampshire at the annual convention at Manchester, Superintendent of Schools Alexander Stoddard of Philadelphia reiterated over and over again the importance of a health program.

The annual physical examination of every pupil in the school system is carried on each fall by the school physician. Follow-up work throughout the year is done by the school nurse. More thorough inspection in most school systems is recommended by the health division of the State Department of Education.

A recommended purchase would be an individual audiometer with which to test the hearing of the children. The old watch test, or even the more improved group audiometer test are not as reliable as the individual audiometer. It might be possible to buy one instrument for Union No. 25 and have all four towns contribute to the expense.

Guidance: Keene High School has a full time guidance director. Since the Swanzey High School pupils usually go to Keene, it seemed desirable to synchronize our program as much as possible with that of Keene. To that end we have purchased guidance folders which will enable us to provide data on Swanzey pupils which will be as complete as that for Keene grammar school pupils. The accumulated material will accompany each pupil as he goes to high school and will be a great aid to the counselors. Swanzey pupils as a result will be helped to bridge the transition between grammar school and high school.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation to the teachers, pupils, and parents, to the School Board, and to the patrons of our schools for their cooperation.


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FOREST FIRE PROBLEM SERIOUS

The year 1947 was one of the worst periods of drouth and forest fire occurence in eastern United States history. Lack of water ruined crops lowered water levels and dried up brooks everywhere. Three months of deficient rainfall and abnormally high temperatures resulted in many fires which were mostly well controlled and kept within bounds. Only the high winds beginning on October 23rd caused a few fires to escape beyond immediate control. These few fires resulted in burning some 15,000 acres and the loss of 63 or more buildings in four New Hampshire towns.

All October fires were costly. They burned deeply in the ground and required day and night patrol of large crews of men until the rains came late in October. Towns which escaped from serious fires might easily have been in the midst of the most serious conflagration we had.

Governor Dale closed the woods effective at midnight of October 15th. With the blow-up of October 23rd, a second proclamation closed all back roads and authorized towns to inaugurate patrol. The effect of this was to cut down subsequent fires for the rest of the dry period.

Local fire warden forces performed an admirable job to hold the more than 200 fires that occurred during this October period. Many men were taxed to the utmost as the emergency continued. To them and all those who did their work, the people of New Hampshire owe a debt of gratitude. The state forest fire control agency based on local town wardens and town crews wherever adequately equipped rose to the occasion and met the test in whatever town their services were needed.

It is now time to take stock everywhere of our fire fighting facilities for the season ahead and to make them adequate where necessary. To this end town fire plans and training programs for wardens, deputies and other key men in each district are being arranged or in progress. If equipment and tools are insufficient to properly equip the available man power in each community with the right tools for the job, they should be provided for at once. The yearly addition of fire tools to the town supply will generally need to be built up. The state sells tools to the towns and shares one-half their cost. Good equipment is important and can help greatly to keep both damage and fire costs at a minimum.

For many years we have requested our wardens not to issue burning permits except on rainy days. This regulation will be in effect again this year as it is one of the best means of assuring such fires from getting out of control. Nine out of every ten fires can be prevented, 98 percent of all fires being due to human carelessness. Be sure to get a permit for any fire in or near woodland when the ground is free from snow. Be sure your fires are always out before you leave them. Help us in getting the travelling public to keep from throwing out lighted matches or cigarettes. Be careful of all fires in or near woodland.
