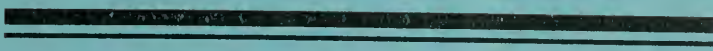

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Allenstown in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in the Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Fire Station in said Allenstown on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear and act upon the report of the Town Budget Committee.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to give a one percent discount on all 1949 property taxes paid on or before August 15, 1949.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$168.00 (1/100th of one percent of the town's valuation based on the 1948 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advan-

tages and resources of the town in cooperation with the 37 other communities in this region.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars for continuing the control of white pine blister rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State aid.

8. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

9. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the lands and buildings within the town, to equalize valuations in accordance with the law, and to appropriate money for this purpose.

10. To see if the Town will vote to confirm the action of the Trustees of Trust Funds in accepting the following named fund in trust. Gift of Victoria O. Rainville of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, the income to be used for the care of the Victoria O. Rainville lot in the St. John Baptist Cemetery.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Hundred Forty-Five (\$645.00) Dollars for the purpose of purchasing a snow plow.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to grade and gravel Sunset Avenue, beginning at Main Street and continuing as far as the appropriation will allow.

13. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00)

Dollars to grade and gravel Hamel Street, from School Street to Cross Street.

14. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to grade and gravel Theodore Street, from School Street to Cross Street.

15. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars to continue the sewer on Granite Street from the residence of Walter Martel easterly 150 feet to the lot owned by Leonel Duclos.

16. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (Dollars) for the maintenance of the Ferry Street Ball grounds for 1949.

17. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to install and maintain two hydrants on River Road, one between the house now being built by Louis I. Gagne and the residence of Pearl Bachard and the other in the vicinity of the residence of Harold Auger; and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

18. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred (Dollars) for the purpose of constructing a sewer on Reynolds Avenue, from the outlet of the Town Park to Whitten Street.

19. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.-00) Dollars to help defray the expense of installing a water main on River Road from Anderson's corner, so called, to Aregis' house, providing the Pembroke Water Works will install the same.

20. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for the purpose of spraying and careing for the town's trees.

21. To hear the reports of auditors, agents, committees or officers heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Allenstown which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the town. This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets — Dec. 31, 1947-Dec. 31, 1948. (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1947 and December 31, 1948, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Surplus increased by \$548.66 during the year 1948.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-1)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-1, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits B and C)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948, are presented in Exhibits B and C. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit C), a net revenue surplus of \$744.72, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$83.62, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$828.34.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit D)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit D. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1948, is indicated in Exhibit D-1.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and pay-rolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts

were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Road Agent's Payrolls:

A town check for the total amount of each highway payroll is given to the road agent, who in turn cashes the check and pays the various employees. No signatures of employees appear on the payrolls. Each employee should sign the payroll before it is turned over to the selectmen by the road agent to be filled with the voucher issued in payment thereof. This procedure is required as evidence that all highway employees have received the sums as indicated on the payrolls.

It is also required by law that the road agent furnish a surety bond.

Trustees of Trust Funds:

It was noted that the trustees of trust funds were apparently not performing the functions of their office and all records and bank books were found to be in the custody of the chairman of the Board of Selectmen. The bank books were taken to the bank during the course of the audit for the purpose of having the entries of interest brought up to date.

It is recommended that the trustees perform the duties for which they are elected to office, including the keeping of proper records and rendering reports as required.

Conclusion:

The accounts of all town officers which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting procedure,

with exceptions as herein noted, conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Allenstown for their assistance during the course of the audit.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobile, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS
for Allenstown, N. H.

To the School Board of Allenstown:

It is a pleasure to present to the School Board my second annual report of the educational activities of the Town of Allenstown, New Hampshire.

May I express my thanks and appreciation to the School Board, Selectmen, Treasurer, Janitor, Teachers, Pupils and all other individuals and organizations that helped to improve the Allenstown Grammar School and meet the challenge of modern education with courage and fortitude under present domestic and world conditions.

There was a radical change made in the teaching situation during the past year in that another teacher was added for the intermediate grades. This reduced the number of grades for the primary teacher. This change was an added help to everyone concerned in-as-much as it gave each teacher more time for individual instruction and greater flexibility in dealing not only with the intellectual growth of each and every child, but also with the physical, emotional, and social growth which are just as essential to the education of the whole child.

Mr. Anthony Katsiaticas of Nashua and Keene was engaged as principal and teacher of grades 6, 7 and 8. Mrs. Mary Mulligan of Concord and Plymouth is teaching in grades 3, 4, and 5. Mrs. Rebecca D. Williams of Concord and Plymouth has been free to give her whole attention to grades 1 and 2 and a spirit of wholesomeness, cooperation, loyalty, and educational development has been forthcoming.

You are to be congratulated for your excellent teaching personnel and the real spirit and desire to raise and develop a standard of living with each other in an environment of

comradeship and responsibility. May the good work continue and may you find a way to retain the present teaching staff.

The Department of Education has made a change in the census of the children of the State. All pupils from the age of one day to and including 15 years have been enumerated this year. This gives the department, the districts, the parents, and others data for the next five years in the growth of the schools. There will be some variation due to a fluctuation of population, but the picture is clearer for the 5-year period in figuring costs and probable needs of the Schools of New Hampshire. For your information and that of the citizens of the town the following data is submitted for your study.

Let us go a step further and look at the following table which shows the United States Census Bureau's Forecast of Future Enrollment by Grades in Millions from 1947 to 1960. This is significant from the standpoint of both State and National Legislatures, building programs, school costs, and the general enrollment problems from Grade One through Grade 12 of the High School.

It is interesting to note in studying Table II that (1) from 1947 to 1960, with the peak enrollment in 1958, that there is a gain of nearly 10 million children in the schools of the country — 24,500,000 to 34,200,000; (2) peak enrollments begin in Grade 1 in 1954 and 1955 and continue for each grade each succeeding year until 1960 when the peak comes in Grades 6, 7, and 8; (3) the relative growth in Grade one is lower comparatively during the 10-year period than the High School growth; (4) the peak of the entire enrollment (Grand Total) is reached in 1958 although it is reached for elementary schools in 1957 and not until 1960 in the high schools.

Many points of interest can be found in a study of this table especially in comparison with probable costs of instruction, current costs, building needs, total overall costs, and costs within the schools themselves including curriculum charges, methods of teaching, equipment needs, and general school trends.

There are a few items which should be brought to your attention for next year. With your permission I should like to submit them.

(1) Your teaching staff is one of the best in this Union. May it continue to function for the education of your children and be encouraged in its desires.

(2) Books and Supplies need to be replaced in some of the classes, but on the whole these budget items, at least at the present time, will very nearly meet rising costs for next year.

(3) Provision must be made for increasing tuition costs. It is estimated that high school tuition will be close to \$170.00 as over \$158.74 during 1948-1949.

(4) School lunches are more and more becoming a part of the regular educational development. However, a new refrigerator is necessary for the preservation of food. It is strongly urged that this recommendation be given close attention.

(5) Your school nurse is entitled to live and enjoy life just the same as your teachers and children. Her expenses and living conditions have advanced along with those of everyone else. It is, therefore, essential for you to make adequate provision for her expenses and salary increase.

(6) Again I would like to emphasize the fact that Allenstown lacks playground equipment for its youth; it is an essential part of educational growth.

(7) Consolidation is a sensible and important phase of your public school growth. The time is coming when this factor in the educational development of the Town of Allenstown must have serious attention due to rising costs per pupil as well as advantages to your children.

(8) Art is essential to a richer and better life. There are many youngsters who, in the approach and study of art, would open channels not heretofore enjoyed and grow accordingly. Perhaps it is possible to take this step during the next school year.

(9) With the increased enrollment in Pembroke Grammar School, the next school year may bring such a condition as to work a hardship on the boys and girls of Allenstown in Woodworking and Home Economics. If for any reason our youngsters are unable to take this work next year due to unavailable room space in Pembroke, a serious situation would exist. Some provision should be made for this condition and I urge its close consideration.

Again I wish to thank the School Board for its confidence and appreciation of my endeavors in attempting to make the life of its youth much happier and enjoyable as a necessary corollary to the educational growth and development of the town.
