TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (the Polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

- ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, two Auditors, three Library Trustees, one for three years, one for two years, one for one year, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and all such Officers and Agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.
- ART. 2. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class 5 Roads, and vote to raise and appropriate \$486.38 for same. The State to contribute \$3,242.50.
- ART. 4. To see if Town will accept State Aid for Class 5 Highways and Bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.
- ART. 5. To see if Town will vote to raise hourly wage rate for Town Labor.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Summer and Winter road maintenance.

- ART. 7. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for expense of Police Department.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Dump.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Expense of Highway Department.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of cemeteries.
- ART. 12. to see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capitol Reserve Fund to be used for new equipment.
- ART. 13. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights and lighting Town Buildings.
- ART. 14. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- ART. 15. To see if Town will authorize Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during year, in anticipation of taxes.
- ART. 16. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- ART. 17. To see what sum of money Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance.
- ART. 18. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate sum not exceeding \$10,000.00 for purchase of Dump Truck suitable for general work. Such sum to be raised through the use of monies now in Capitol Reserve Funds and balance to be borrowed from local Banks through a series of notes, rate of interest to be determined by said Banks. The Selectmen shall under this article be given permission to purchase said Truck under such terms and conditions as they may deem to be in the best interests of the Town.

- ART. 19. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$40.00 to promote Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- ART. 20. To see what sum of money Town will raise and appropriate for wages of Town Librarian.
- ART. 21. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Newport Hospital.
- ART. 22. To see if Town will vote to accept land donated by Dr. Muzzey adjoining School and Town Hall.
- ART. 23. To see if Town will vote to exempt from property taxes for three years, anyone desiring to build a dwelling house, the value of which is not less than \$5,000.00.
- ART. 24. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Croydon:

Enrollment

This year Mrs. Doris Farrington is teaching Grades 1-3 at the Village School with an enrollment of 26 pupils divided as follows:

Grade 1 7 Grade 2 8 Grade 3 11

Eight pupils are expected to enter Grade 1 next fall.

Building Improvements

At the last District Meeting, a sum of \$3,000 was voted for the purpose of making improvements and renovations to the Village School.

The Committee and School Board, chairmaned by Franklyn MacIntosh, are to be commended for the work that was done and the resulting improvements. The School

takes on a "New Look".

After digging at the rear of the building and not finding an adequate supply of water, a 238 foot artesian well was drilled near the front of the building providing a very adequate supply of water. By digging under the building, space was provided for the water pump. Very adequate toilet rooms were built and a drinking fountain was installed in the entry-room. This entrance area has been much enlarged and improved and makes a very suitable place for a number of school activities.

All citizens should be happy with these improvements which no doubt could have been made many years ago.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHRIE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Croydon, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the eighth day of March, 1961, at 7:30 o'clock p. m. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.

Article 6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To see what sum of Money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of School District Officials and Agents, for the payment of statutory ogligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to sell the land and buildings known as the Croydon Flat School and to convey the same to the purchaser thereof by proper deed in the name of the District.

Article 9. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,612.39 as a deficiency appropriation to cover the expenses for repairs and renovations to the

so-called East Village School in excess of the amount appropriated at the 1960 District Meeting; said funds to be made available to the School District before June 30, 1961; the School Board to issue a certificate therefor to the Selectmen of the Town.

Article 10. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 for the purpose of building an addition on the East Village School suitable for Grades IV, V, VI, such sum to be raised through the issuance of serial bonds or notes, and to authorize the School Board to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the time and place of payment thereof, under such terms and conditions as they may deem to be in the best interests of the District. (Inserted by Petition.)

Article 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
