## State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the town will vote to adopt the caucus ballot system for the nomination of Town Officers according to the provisions of Chapter 56, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, permitting the voters to nominate the Town Officers they desire for election.

Article 3. Shall the Town vote to zone, and zone, the Common as bounded by Main, Park, Rallroad, and Glen Streets as a public park and playground to be used for baseball, hockey, and all outdoor sports, games, amusements and other municipal recreation purposes under the provisions of Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 31, insofar as such uses do not conflict with the provisions in the deed of said Common to the Town?

Article 4. Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town?

Article 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government.

Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection of Persons and Property.

Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for a police cruiser, equipped with radio, and for necessary maintenance of same.

Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health.

Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Summer Roads.

Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Maintenance—Winter Roads.

Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.

Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid.

Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Public Welfare.

- Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- Article 16. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to celebrate the return of war veterans on the 4th of July, in conjunction with the American Legion.
- Article 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Recreation.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed from the School District giving title to the Old High School for use as a recreational or educational center, said building to be administered by the Gorham Recreation Commission, with provision that it revert back to the School District in the event it were no longer used for the purpose specified.
- Article 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the operation of the Old High School as a Community Center, this sum to be added to the budget of the Recreation Commission.
- Article 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts.
- Article 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Water and Sewer Maintenance.
- Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.
- Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Skating Rinks.
- Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Unclassified Expenditures, including dog licenses and auto permits.
- Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.  $\,$
- Article 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.
- Article 27. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Interest on temporary loans.
- Article 28. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for an extension of the sidewalk on Lancaster Road.
- Article 29. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for an extension of sidewalk and paving ditch at Cascade.
- Article 30. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dredging.  $\,$
- Article 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on temporary notes in anticipation of taxes, covering period from March 12, 1957 to the Annual Meeting of 1958.
- Article 32. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the Inventory Blanks when taking the inventory.

- Article 33. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water line on Pisani Street, so-called, on Berlin Road.
- Article 34. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water line on Evans Street.
- Article 35. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for an extension of the Lancaster Road Sewer from the Lewis Reid residence to the George Thurston residence.
- Article 36. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sewer on Evans Street.
- Article 37. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to extend and raise the existing fence on the Gorham Common, Park Street side.
- Article 38. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for spraying of black flies and mosquito control.
- Article 39. To hear reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 40. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The polls shall be open from nine of the clock in the forenoon to six of the clock in the afternoon.

While the School Board is not required to file the estimated income until June 10, 1957, the following figures are submitted as being an accurate estimate at this time: Balance, \$9,000.00; Construction Aid, \$3,000.00; Tuition, \$15,750.00; Hot Lunch, \$1,800.00 and Misc. \$450.00. Total, \$30,000.00.

\*The starred items are required by law to be raised as determined by proper authorities. The district determines the salaries of the district officers. The Supervisory Union Board decides the local share of the superintendent's salary and other Union expenses. The share paid by several districts toward the superintendent's salary for 1956-57 is as follows: Dummer, \$130.00; Gorham, \$2,720.00; Jefferson, \$390.00; Milan, \$460.00; Randolph, \$130.00; Shelburne, \$170.00. The state treasurer reports the amount of per capita tax, while the Teachers' Retirement Board assesses the amount for teachers' retirement and the State Employees Retirement Association assesses the amount for the Superintendent's retirement. In those towns that are under the Social Security System the amount to be paid by the district is determined by the Federal government.

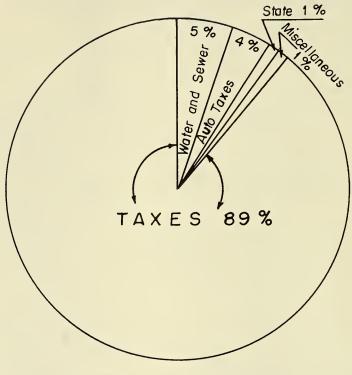

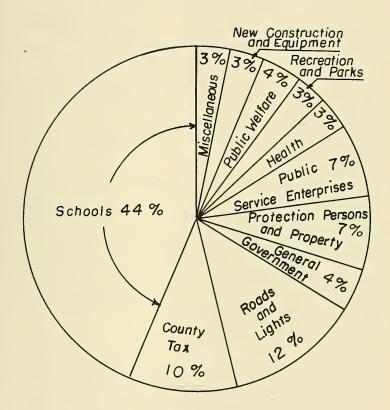

# **Report of Recreation Commission**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gorham:

The Gorham Recreation Commission in its seventh year of operation had as its Chairman, Richard Keir. Dr. Robert Kaschub resigned and Paul Doherty was appointed to take his place. Warren Tucker was also appointed to the Commission bringing its number up to the original five.

Richard LeClair was supervisor of Playgrounds with Merrily Appleton and Linda Bissett supervising the toddler's program on the Common, Mary Jane Goodloe and Sandra Gallant at the Upper Village and Carole Dalphonse and Charlene Dinardo at Cascade.

This year we had the "Libby Memorial Park" added to our recreation which enabled us to carry on our swimming program under the supervision of Richard LeClair and Mary Jane Goodloe.

Swimming instructions were given at the Swimming Pool by Life Guard Lynn Harold. Ninety-eight children took part with 25 completing successfully the Minnow Test of twenty-one stunts, and 37 completing part of the test. There were 15 five year old children also receiving instructions.

The Libby Memorial Park had as its supervisor, John Briggs, Life Guards Lynn Harold, Muriel Maw and Norman Lavigne and maintenance men were Fred Lafferty and Lloyd Towle.

## Report from the White Mountains Region Association

Thanks to the fine cooperation of the towns in our Region, the Association has been able to carry on an extremely busy program aimed, as always, toward the benefiting of the entire northern part

of New Hampshire.

To this end we have cooperated wherever it has been possible with any and all agencies that have been working along any lines that promised eventual benefit to any sort of business within our state and region borders. This is in line with the original Regional concept, that pooling of efforts can accomplish more than can be done by a lot of separate, smaller and uncoordinated efforts. Nevertheless, along with this we continue our own individual projects and plans, where these promise to be more directly productive.

Again we have distributed all over the United States nearly 100,000

pieces of promotional literature of all types-maps, lists of places to stay, picture folders, hunting-and-fishing folders, and winter-vacation brochures. We know these arouse interest and bring business because people write for them from all over the map; they also tell us later on that these folders were of definite help in causing them to decide where to spend their vacation time-AND MONEY! Your town was represented in each and every one of these folders.

Our 4-H Awards Program continues to encourage boys and girls to take part in, and do better in, this fine and worthwhile program. Through cash awards to members and clubs, we are proud to be helping these youngsters to be the constructive farm citizens of our Re-

gion in the future.

We have planned and cooperated with the planning and carrying out, as well as the publicizing of Old Home Days, Woodsman's Contest, Guides' Show, Community Festivals, Horse Shows and the like, as well as planning and setting up one of our own, the White Mountains Region Art Center. We have spent a lot of time on the road attending shows visited by hundreds of thousands of people in Boston, Hartford, and Philadelphia, and are planning more of such work.

As to results, we have again run a mail survey to find out what good we were accomplishing. From just one small sample (10% of 4000) of our mail requests, we turned up 148 parties numbering 440 people who came here. Only part of those told us how much they spent here, but that small part spent \$18,571.00!! Seems unbelievable until you realize you can't get by vacationing on much less than \$7.00 a day. Anyway, what they alone spent means that from that small group came back into this Region 21/2 times the total amount appropriated by our towns.

What this means to every taxpayer is that much money, either direct income or tax income, came here to help take the burden off the local people. The man who never sees a tourist would be paying much more on his tax bill all through this state if visitors were not paying a substantial share of the freight!! With your help, we'll con-

tinue to do our part in keeping the money coming in.
