## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, N. H., in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Class V Highway and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for Old Age Assistance and Town Relief and make appropriation for the same.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$54.00 for Lakes Region Association for issuance of printed matter, etc., in cooperation with other Towns and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for Blister Rust control, the same to be set aside as a post war fund to be spent when deemed advisable by the Selectmen.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise two hundred dollars to start a new hedge around the east and south sides of Hebron Cemetery and make appropriation for the same.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
