You are hereby notified to meet at the Cogswell High School Auditorium in said Henniker on Tuesday, the 9th of March next, at nine of the clock on the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Town meeting will be recessed for School meeting.

Polls open at 9:00 A. M. and close at 6:00 P. M.

The articles in the Warrant will be taken up at 10:00 A. M.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear and act upon the reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, and other Committees.
- 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges, and purchase of machinery.
- 5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Public Health, and raise money for the same.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate to defray the expense of observing Memorial Day.

- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for the support of the Tucker Free Library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Fire Department.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintaining hydrant service for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lighting for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to prevent the spread of white blister.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction of Class V Roads.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Merrimack Valley Region Association.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take relative to maintaining a Town Dump, raise money for same, or take other action relative thereto.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Concord Hospital.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for building a Town highway garage.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to allow Davis-Woodman Post No. 78, of the American Legion, to use the Town Hall for quarters and other activities.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to reconstruct the Engine House, Town Offices, and vault.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for civil defense.
- 22. To see what action the Town will take relative to the reassessment of taxable properties, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to name a section of road, beginning at Route 9 near the Paper Mill, and extending to the former Westboro Corner schoolhouse, in memory of Eugene V. Call.
- 24. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to have the tax inventory printed in the Town report.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following roads, subject to gates or bars, with the provision that they be kept passable for forest fire trucks, the State having reclassified them as class 6, and this mileage being no longer considered when State funds are allotted to the Town.
- A. A section of road from the Colleague Pond road to the Warner line.
- B. A section of road from the Frank Goss place to the Bradford line.
- C. A section of road from the Rand road to the Hillsboro line.
- D. A section of road from the residence of Mrs. Dorothy Queen to the Weare line.
- E. A section of road from the Frank Durgin place to the Hopkinton line.

- F. A section of road from Quaker Street to the Bear Hill road.
- 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

- Article 4a. Voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for the repair of highways and bridges, and that such sums of money as may be received from the rental of highway equipment shall be added to this appropriation.
- Article 11. Selectmen authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 13. Selectmen authorized to reinsure the Town's trucks and equipment.
- Article 20. Voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00, and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 more, the second amount mentioned to be taken from the James R. Straw Income Fund, so-called, for the purpose of installing

town offices and a fireproof room or vault for the safe keeping of town records in the Tucker Free Library building; and that the Selectmen and the Trustees of the Tucker Free Library are hereby authorized to have the necessary work done, and are hereby authorized to use the money hereinbefore mentioned for this purpose; but may not spend more than this amount without first obtaining a further vote of the town.

- Article 21. Selectmen authorized to appoint the Road agent, effective as of March Meeting, 1954.
- Article 22. Voted that we raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to defray costs of investigation of Town Sewer System by Town Planning Board.
- Article 23. Selectmen authorized to sell the timber on the Carter lot and the land by public bids.
- Article 25. Selectmen authorized, with approval of Budget Committee, to issue bonds or long term notes for future T.R.A., if they deem it advisable so to do.
- Article 26. Voted that the Town establish a Planning Board, to be composed of the members of the Town Budget Committee, who shall make a study of the Towns development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development.
- Article 27. Voted that the duly elected Town Auditors also act as auditors of the Cemetery funds, with the approval of the Cemetery Association.
- Article 28. Selectmen authorized to sell any separate piece of real estate which has been acquired by the Town by Tax Sale; by advertising the same for a period of at least fourteen days before the day of sale, by posting a clear description of the

property offered for sale, together with the time and place of sale, in the post office and two other public places in town, and that said sale be made by public auction.





PEOPLE PLAY A VITAL PART IN OUR FOREST FIRE PROBLEMS

A review of the 1953 fire season proves the vital part people play in the never ending battle to prevent forest fires.

In this fire district there were 133 fires in 26 of the district's 30 towns; 409 acres were burned over and it cost \$9,499.97 to extinguish them. This figure was reduced somewhat through payment of fire costs by persons responsible for illegal fires, fires which escaped from control and fires caused by their carelessness. Costs were abnormally high this year due to protracted periods of dry weather which increased the difficulty of extinguishing fires.

Eighty-eight percent of the 113 fires were man-caused and could have been prevented. They tell a story which needs to be carefully studied. Some people were careless in disposing of smoking material and camp fires; others burned without the required warden permit - disregarding weather, forest conditions and the normal safeguards recognized and considered by the warden in issuing permits. Other fires resulted from children playing with matches, carelessly handled fireworks, faulty railroad and truck equipment, etc.

These fires cost a lot to extinguish, most of which could have been avoided - this affects taxes; local business was interrupted by men leaving their jobs to extinguish the fires; trees that might otherwise have built houses, repaired bridges and supplied raw materials for local industries were destroyed; seedling growth the future timber crop was wiped out.

This picture can, however, be reversed if people who offend could be impressed with the importance of observing the simple but essential common sense safeguards that will prevent forest fires. They are:

- Care in disposing of lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches in and near woodlands.
- 2. Care in selecting camp fire sites and completely extinguishing them.

3. Consultation with the local forest fire warden before burning to secure the required permit.

People play a vital part in our forest fire problem.

It is EVERYONE'S job to HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES.

Our work for this year is very much like previous years. SCHOOL WARRANT

The State of New Mampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Henniker qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Cogswell School auditorium in said district on the ninth day of March, 1954 at two o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To chose all necessary School Officers for the ensuing year. Polls open at 9:00 A. M. and close at 6:00 P. M.
- 2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and take any action relating thereto.
- 3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 4. To see if the district will make a supplemental appropriation of \$640.28 for the current 1953-54 year for alterations in the high school basement, and ratify the actions of the School Board in disbursing trust fund monies for that purpose.
- 5. To see what sum of money the district will appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund and other sources: the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes.

We have had a considerable change in our teaching staff this year due to an unusual chain of events over which we had no control. We had expected that there would be two changes in the staff and these were taken care of early in the spring. Mr. John Kontinos was employed as Shop teacher and Nicholas Kontinos was hired as sixth grade teacher because we felt that a man would be a valuable addition to our program in the elementary school. Then the proverbial roof caved in on us.

Mrs. Hayward was forced to change her plans and Mrs. Maria Ferwerda took her place as Mathematics teacher. Mrs. Kenney resigned at the last moment but we were able to secure Miss Rice who had some teaching experience and a fine experience as a County Extension Worker. At about the same time, Nicholas Kontinos, who was supposed to be exempt from military service, was drafted into the armed forces in August. Mr. Bennet was secured to take his place. After school started Evelyn Norton became ill and asked for a leave of absence. Mrs. Roberta Greenly was employed for the remainder of the year.

The enrollment in the first grade this fall was unusually large so Mrs. Nina Buxton was employed as a helping teacher. In December, Mrs. Hadley asked for a leave of absence and Mrs. Buxton will finish out the year.

The shop program has been greatly improved through the fine cooperation of the Cogswell Fund Trustees. The boys' locker room has been changed and the space formerly used for lockers has been added to the shop room. This space was badly needed and will aid us to improve our shop program. We have hopes that an increasing number of boys will elect the Shop Course. It is a very valuable course for all boys as the Home Economics Course would be for all girls.

We have been striving to make continued improvements in our school program. The High School Principals of the Union have been meeting with me once a month for the past two years, sharing our experiences and pointing out ways that would help us do a better job. At some of these meetings we have had the classroom teachers with us. One meeting the Shop teachers met with us, another time the Commercial teachers, and still another meeting the Social Studies teachers. The Principals and teachers have given of their time whole heartedly and I think the results have been good.

The elementary Principals have had two meetings this year. At the first meeting we discussed our problems and needs. Our second meeting was held jointly with the first grade teachers of the Union. Our next meeting will be with the second grade teachers of the district. Mrs. Beane and I have also made arrangements to hold meetings twice a month with the Henniker elementary teachers to work out better coordination and improvement in our program.

I might add that we are still concerned with teaching the fundamentals; arithmetic and the communicative skills of reading, writing, and spelling. We also think that good health and character development is also fundamental and we do not want to neglect these either.

I am sure that the Henniker teachers are willing to spend freely of their time and effort to provide a better education for the children of Henniker.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It is a privilege to present the Town of Henniker with the initial Principal's report for the year 1952-53. A number of interesting improvements have been made in our school in the areas of curriculum, administration and maintenance.

Our guidance program that has been set up gives each student an opportunity to confer with the principal on any problem relating to his school life. In the Junior High School we use the California Short Form Test of Mental Maturity and in the High School we use a battery of University of New Hampshire tests, as a basis towards trying to better understand some of the individual differences of our students. It is felt that as a result of the interest, time and effort spent in offering this guidance to our student body, we have improved the teaching — learning environment in the class room by offering specific areas of study to the student body; areas based on need. This is especially true in the math, science, shop and home economics areas.

The improvements in opportunities now include general math., general science, shop 9-12, social studies 10, world problems, typing I and typing II with a unit of shorthand offered in typing II.

In addition to the above we offer a challenging program of studies to the Junior High School. It includes math., science, health, English, shop, geography and history.

Included as part of our life in school our student body participates in the following "activities."

Basketball, baseball, (Senior and Junior Varsity) Cheerleading, (Senior and Junior Varsity) Intramurals, High School play, Yearbook, Music, Class socials and a dynamic Student Council.

SHOP

We have enlarged our shop area and improved the shop program by offering the area of study as a general shop program to include wood-working, drafting, auto mechanics and electricity. New drafting tools and jigsaw was added to the shop tools.

HOME ECONOMICS

The home economics area has become very popular in the last two years. We included a new stove and refrigerator and a new source of dynamic reference books for our girl students.

We find that as of this date there are approximately 53% of the student body taking home economics and shop, two necessary areas for student experience.

DROP OUTS

For the year 1951-1952 we had a total drop out rate of approximately 8%. Five of these students left school, not because of lack of educational opportunities but to seek employment. Three percent transferred to another school because of family conditions. For the Year 1952-1953 we had a total drop out rate of 3%. One per cent left school for work at home and 2 students transferred to another school because the family moved. We at Henniker can be proud of the improvement shown here,

AUDIO-VISUAL

A library is in the process of being set up in the old projection room. With the help and cooperation of the Extension Division at the Concord State Library we have begun to make some progress. We have attempted to improve the teaching-learning opportunities by adding the following aids to our curriculum.

Some new text books and references, a 35mm strip film projector, donated by the PTA, a portable screen that can be used in a lighted room with excellent results, also donated by the PTA, a tape recorder donated by the class of 1952, a record player donated by the music club and a new Bell and Howell projector, contributed by the Cogswell Memorial fund of Manchester and the PTA. Also a small collection of strip films. In addition to the above, we include the available aids at the University of New Hampshire library and the State Extension library.

HIGHER LEARNING

We are pleased to once again inform the community that we are continually attempting to fit our students toward a better way of life. Listed below is a brief summary of what our graduate students are doing:

A fair evaluation of our school can be made by the success of our students after graduation.

STAFF

Our staff is continually challenged towards improving their professional attitudes both in and out of school. Courses have been taken through the Extension Department at Concord, Boston University, University of New Hampshire, and Columbia Teachers College. Some are looking forward to further study. Their cooperative spirit and understanding is the main reason for our improvement mentioned above.

It has been not only a privilege but a real challenge to serve the community of Henniker in helping to achieve better opportunities and "real truths", through out the year. It is important that I emphasize that none of the above would have been possible without the intelligent understanding of our Superintendent of Schools, Mr. William C. Sterling. His leadership has been very challenging to the students and staff at Henniker High. Important also is our interest and conscientious school board committee. Through their enthusiasm to work with the administration and our Superintendent of schools we have brought to you the above improvements.

We know that we have only begun to scratch the surface in our problems of education but we will continue to attempt to grow and keep in mind that the children are important and that
