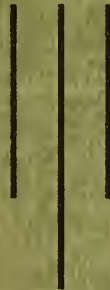

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Kingston Town Hall in said Kingston, N. H. on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town and School Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money not to exceed _____ in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year for taxes collected during the year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$443.91 and the State will contribute \$2,959.39 for the Class V Highways, under the provisions of the T.R.A.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$3,400.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Rock Rimmon; such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to author-

ize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Kingston.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to improve Hook Ave., West Shore Park, Country Pond.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$500.00 to surface and Tar the new road constructed at Cooper's Grove.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to rescind all regulations adopted under Article 16 of the Warrant for the town meeting of 1955 and Article 3 of the Warrant for the special town meeting of April 7, 1959 and vote in place thereof the following regulations for the acceptance of new streets:

1. A petition signed by all landowners along the street shall be required and an article placed in the town warrant for acceptance.

2. A minimum of 36 feet for right of way shall be deeded to the town.

3. The land owner or owners shall build a road bed 20 feet in width. The road bed shall consist of all gravel, drainage, grading and compaction necessary to provide a finished surface 20 feet in width.

4. The extent of the acceptance to be limited to snow removal only for a two year period. Any major road repairs required during this period to be performed by the landowners or owners.

5. Upon completion of the two year period, full acceptance of the street will be assumed by the town un-

less objection to same is entered by the Selectmen or Road Agent.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to amend the regulation adopted under Article 2 Section A of Article 10 of the warrant for the town meeting of March 8, 1954, by striking out said section and inserting the following:

- A. Every building lot shall have a minimum frontage of 100 feet and shall contain a minimum area of 14,000 square feet.

Article 10. To see if Town will vote to raise \$500.00 for improvement of Great Pond Road.

Article 11. To see if Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax dedeed property at public auction.

Article 12. To see if Town will vote to raise \$800.00 for improvement of the Hunt Road.

Article 13. By petition of Roger Nason and 13 others, to see if the town will vote to close the old part of Great Pond Road, that was discontinued when the road was straightened, that is, the old road that goes down over the wooden bridge located just beyond Lester Nason's house.

Article 14. By petition of Ralph Bake and 10 others, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to resurface and tarvia a portion of Ronnie Lane, so-called. Beginning at the Cemetery Lane midway between Main St. and the Plains Cemetery and continuing to the end of the newly constructed road, a distance of 300 feet, in accordance with established regulations.

Article 15. On petition of William S. Rent and ten others, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate

the sum of \$500.00 to regrade and tar Little River Road
Extention left unfinished two years ago.

Article 16. To see if the Town of Kingston will transfer ownership of the Town Hall to the Kingston School District, for use as a school. If use as a school is discontinued, ownership shall revert to the Town of Kingston.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Auditor's Report and the Town Report as printed.

Article 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 2. Meeting called to order by Moderator. Prayer was given by Rev. Robert Robb. Moderator read the result of balloting under Article 1.

Motion made and seconded to raise \$192,322.58 to defray Town expenses. Amendment by Richard Senter to include this amount of net debt to be added to original amount (\$2,346.30). Amended was not carried. Yes 52 No 82. Original motion was carried.

Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year from the taxes collected during the year.

Article 3. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$457.00 and the State will contribute \$3,046.65 for Class 5 Highways, under the Provisions of the T.R.A.

Article 4. Voted not to accept this Article.

Article 5. Voted not to accept this Article.

Article 6. Voted not to accept this Article.

Article 7. Voted as in Article with amendment that gravel be eight inches in depth.

Article 8. Motion made to reject Article 8 and be voted on a year hence. Motion was withdrawn. Voted that Article be accepted as read.

Article 9. Voted to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100.00 to purchase and erect signs on Town Roads.

Article 10. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200.00 for Kingston Civil Defense.

Article 11. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$500.00 to widen the curve by Sprague Hill on North Danville Road.

Article 12. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$500.00 to widen the curve by Hendersons on Great Pond Road.

Article 13. Voted that the Town raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 to purchase a safe for the Tax Collector.

Article 14. Motion made and seconded to raise a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 to widen and grade the road starting at Wm. Wing's on Rt. 107 and ending at the Thorn Road so called was not carried.

Article 15. Voted to raise and appropriate \$350.00 for the Permanent construction of Dolliver Lane, so called, for a distance of 448 feet from Route 125.

Article 16. Voted to accept Auditor's Report and Town Report as printed.

Article 17. A resolution was passed to include Article 7 on ballot next year. A flag which was flown over the Capitol and given to the Town by Senator Styles Bridges, through William Bartlett, Sr., was accepted with thanks by the Selectmen. Also a flag from the Kingston Grange was accepted with thanks by the Town. Voted to adjourn.

This has been a record year with an increase in circulation of 20%, this being mostly in the juvenile department.

1574 books were borrowed from the Bookmobile and 57 by special request from the State Library.

A special effort was made during the year to replace worn and purchase duplicate copies of many of the classics.

The trustees recently purchased a set of the Americana Encyclopedias, 1960 edition.

New lights have been installed in the children's corner of the reading room.

A new powder room was added this year, converted from a closet formerly used for magazine storage.

The second observance of National Library Week was held April 12 through the 18th. There were exhibited many displays of various antiques and items of early Kingston by local residents.

The Kingston Garden Club gave a beautiful Christmas wreath, for the door of the library, during the holiday season.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

This department's work has consisted mostly of preventative measures, mainly periodic road checks, of which we had five in 1960, Holiday and weekend traffic, and during the off-seasons, regular inspections of summer homes, camps and unoccupied dwellings.

During 1960 we assigned Police Officers each Sunday at church to insure the safety of Sunday School pupils and their parents going to and coming from church. One officer each week and when possible, two were used.

Also during 1960, a regular night patrol was initiated (every night), and it stays out for one to two hours each night depending on conditions. The officer on this nightly patrol rides over seldom used roads, checks stores, garages, camping areas and checks registrations of autos that may seem to be an unusual area or acting strangely. This patrol has been made usually by the Chief or Officer Collins in a radio equipped car or, if by one of the special officers, in his car with a portable radio. This being very late at night.

The results of this night activity have been very encouraging, as our B&E complaints have been greatly reduced, also minor motor vehicle complaints are less.

Members of the Police Department have appeared in court fourteen times with complaints in 1960.

Three for operating while intoxicated.

One for attempting to bribe a Police Officer.

Two for operating after revocation of license.

One for driving to endanger.

One for driving too close.

Three for excessive speed.

One for drunkenness.

Two miscellaneous.

Four trips have been made to Registry of Motor Vehicles, Concord in 1960.

Two trips to Concord State Hospital.

Our road checks normally run three to four hours duration. In that period we check 150-175 autos, as a result an average of 20 to 25 will be found to have defective equipment or some other form of motor vehicle violations.

There were twenty four automobile accidents during 1960 handled by this department, five less than in 1959. Eleven persons were hospitalized or reported injuries, nine fewer than in 1959.

The Registry of Motor Vehicles found cause to suspend the licenses of five persons. Two for driving after drinking and three for actions that took place in Kingston on Halloween night.

The Auxiliary Police and CD unit members have been very co-operative, as usual, in handling traffic on holidays and carnival week, checking camps, helping in investigations, etc. They were called on several times to assist in locating escapees from the house of correction, also assisted the Conservation Department on deer checks.

One major break in 1960. On the night of August 5, Al's Gun Shop was broken into. Over twenty firearms were stolen, plus large amounts of ammunition, belts, knives and other hunting equipment. With the combined efforts of our department along with the

Sheriffs department and Haverhill, Mass. Police, the stolen guns were recovered, and two men arrested in Haverhill. This took three days investigation. Five to seven years was assessed one of them, seven to twelve for the other. These sentences for armed robbery and stolen cars in Massachusetts.

The Police Department is one of the most important, yet too often neglected organizations of our community, handicapped by an appropriation that is not quite adequate to give the people the full protection they deserve and expect. However, our men are more than glad to be of any assistance, in any way possible, at any time, day or night.

For the third straight year, this department has been presented with a certificate from the Motor Vehicle department in recognition of the exemplary cooperation and support given to the New Hampshire Motor Vehicle Department by the Kingston Police Department, for contributing in great measure to the safety accomplishments in the State of New Hampshire.

During 1960, the Kingston Fire Department responded to a total of 59 calls: Out of town, 4; in town, 22; rescue wagon, 33.

On Memorial Day, a service was held at the fire house to honor the deceased members of the Fire Department. At that time, a memorial stone and plaque was dedicated by the members of the association.

This past year, the department had to purchase another chassis to replace the G.M.C. which was no longer adequate. This is in line with our policy of trying to maintain up-to-date and efficient equipment but with a minimum of expense to the town.

We wish to thank all those who made donations to the department, and for the letters of appreciation.

For the benefit of new residents and as a reminder to others:

1. To report all fires or emergencies, the phone number is MI 2-5512.
2. A rescue wagon equipped with a stretcher and resuscitator is available for emergency use.
3. In accordance with the fire laws of the State of New Hampshire:
Permits to install oil burners must be obtained from the Fire Chief.

Permits to have out door fires must be obtained from the Fire Warden, William Friend.

Our department is composed entirely of volunteer firemen whose only remuneration for their time and effort is their desire to be of assistance to the community. We are most grateful for the support and co-operation we have always received from the townspeople.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL CLERK FOR THE KINGSTON SCHOOL DISTRICT

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Kingston qualified to vote in district affairs held in said Kingston in the Daniel J. Bakie School on March 5, 1960, starting at 8 p.m., the following business was transacted:

Articles 1-2-3-4 and 7 were voted on by Australian Ballot on March 8, 1960, at the Kingston Town Hall at the time of the regular election of town officials.

Article 5. A motion was made and passed that the salaries of the School Board and other School District officials be \$109.00 and the truant officer's salary be \$30.00.

Article 6. A motion was made and passed that the reports be approved as printed in the Town Report.

Article 8. A motion was made and passed that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$142,283.58 for the support of schools, for the salaries of the school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

An amendment was made and passed that each item of the 1960-1961 School Budget be discussed.

An amendment was made and not seconded that the

item of \$5,500 for the Principal's Salary be removed from the total budget.

Article 9. A motion was made and not passed (48-22) that the School District of Kingston vote with the other Districts of Supervisory Union No. 14 to provide for the services of a helping teacher as provided in R.S.A. 186:11, XXII, XXIII, XXIV; as amended 1957, R.S.A. 252:2; to commence July 1, 1960.

A motion was made and passed that the Moderator appoint a Resolution Committee to bring in a report on Tuesday concerning the service of G. Austin Kemp on the School Board.

A motion was made and passed that the meeting be recessed until 10 a.m. on Tuesday, March 8, 1960, for Australian Balloting. This meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m.

The Moderator, Leonard F. Sanborn, appointed the following Resolution Committee: Stewart V. McCormack, Gladys M. Merrick, and Maude E. Dolliver.

On Tuesday, March 8, 1960, there were a total of 631 votes cast by Australian Ballot beginning at 10:00 a.m. in the Kingston Town Hall and closing at 7 p.m. These ballots were counted on Tuesday evening. The following results were obtained:

Article 1. Leonard F. Sanborn was chosen as Moderator for the coming year. (559 votes)

Article 2. Bettie C. Ouellette was chosen as Clerk for the ensuing year. (100 votes)

Article 3. Alfred J. Alberts was chosen as a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years (216 votes; and William Friend received 215 votes)

Article 4. Edmond E. Ingalls was chosen as Treasurer for the ensuing year. (55 votes)

Article 7. Irving Johnson (56 votes) and Harry Snow (55 votes) were chosen as auditors for the School District.

The results of the balloting were read by the Moderator.

Maude Dolliver read the following Resolution to those present and a copy of same was presented to Mr. G. Austin Kemp:

“Mr. G. Austin Kemp has determined not to accept again the vote of the inhabitants of the School District which has already elected him to a chair of its School Board for ten successive terms over the past thirty years, and therefore it is moved and resolved by this meeting that:

“*Whereas:* the steady and sturdy strides of modernization and progress which have marked the whole educational program of the district through these past thirty years, eighteen years of which he served simultaneously as Chairman of the Supervisory Union Board, have been so directly dependent on the faithful, far sighted, and fundamental leadership and untiring devotion of G. Austin Kemp, and

“*Whereas:* these years have been so signally marked by his careful attention to the operation of the five earlier single room schools, the construction and dedication of the spacious and splendid new Daniel J. Bakie School in 1941 which was doubled in size in 1951 only to need still further, equal enlargement again in 1959 and

“*Whereas:* all of these and un-numbered other great improvements in the educational facilities and educa-

tional program for Kingston children have been accomplished in an atmosphere of neighborly friendship, understanding and unselfishness radiated through the dedicated leadership of G. Austin Kemp and it is now the wishes of the inhabitants of this district to properly note for the record, their appreciation for this outstanding service in their behalf.

"It is therefore unanimously voted by this meeting that this resolution of gratitude and honor to Mr. Kemp be spread on the records of the district and that an engrossed copy of the same be presented to him by the Moderator. March 8, 1960"

9. To see if the School District of Kingston will vote with the other Districts of Supervisory Union No. 14 to provide for the services of a Helping Teacher as provided in R.S.A. 186:11, XXII, XXIII, XXIV; as amended 1957 R.S.A. 252:2.

10. If the above vote is in the affirmative to see if the District will raise the sum of \$1,194.05 for salary and transportation, retirement and social security.

11. To see if the School District of Kingston will vote to remodel the Kingston Town Hall for school purposes, providing the voters at the Town Meeting will vote to release the Town Hall to the School District.

12. REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

During the last 10 years or so a population increase has been moving steadily north from Massachusetts up throughout southern New Hampshire. Communities close by have and are experiencing tremendous pressure because of new people moving in. Kingston is beginning to experience this same problem. To those who are not vitally effected or concerned about this movement of people within a community, it is difficult to feel this or realize it at first. For this reason I would like to call to your attention some things that have been happening within the last few years. I am certain that all of you have noticed a new house going up here and there or a family moving out and new ones moving in. Let me show you what such simple events do to our school enrollment.

According to these figures and according to the best information available we do not have any indication that this type of thing is going to stop, or that it is not going to increase more than it has in the past. This very slow increase caused you to put on an addition a few years ago. This same increase is causing a population problem within our school structure at the present time, and if this is remedied by either of the proposed alternatives presented by the Board at the present time even then it would seem that we will be again faced with a like problem in a few years. That is, five years from now we will again be looking around for additional classroom space.

The growth then has created an educational problem which only you the citizens of Kingston can solve. What you must do is ask yourself whether or not you wish to continue the type of education that you presently have. If you wish to do this then it will be necessary to vote for either one of the School Board's proposals relative to providing additional space for classrooms.

Reference is made again this year to the questions brought to your attention last year in my report to you; mainly the type of education you expect and the type you are willing to support. We still need to reduce class size to 25 or 30. We still need a program of studies. We still need a basic series in our subject areas. In addition one of the greatest needs in this Union is still help at the Union level. This is in relation to the position of Superintendent. It is unreasonable to expect anyone to fulfill all the obligations this

person should fulfill as Superintendent of Schools and properly care for all the communities that are expected to be cared for in this Union. I feel it necessary to again this year request and emphasize the need for a Helping Teacher.

In looking over our needs listed last year it is noted that some of them have been fulfilled. For example, we are rapidly progressing toward a program of minimum essentials and a program of studies. We have improved our basic series in the subject areas. We have evaluated and made changes and are now using a new report card. We have developed and have only recently put into use a permanent record system that is universal throughout the Union. There is being offered an inservice training program for teachers, insignificant as it is at the present time, we are providing courses to improve teaching ability.

In conclusion I would like to offer to you as parents and citizens a challenge. Let us all search ourselves and others to determine what type of school is most desirable, ask ourselves if our school presently fits these requirements, and if not attempt to create change so that it will.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

As a newcomer in the position of School Nurse-Teacher I was surprised and pleased at the changes that have occurred over the years. No longer is the nurse responsible only for checking heads, fingernails, etc. The entire wellbeing, physical and mental, of every child with whom she comes in contact, is of vital importance to her.

Kingston is indeed fortunate to have teachers interested in the health and health education of their pupils. Because they observe them daily, any difficulties are seen and are reported to the nurse. She can then proceed to work with these children and their parents to overcome the problems.

This past year all children received routine checkups on height, weight, hearing and vision.

A Dental Health program was carried out by the P. T. A. with about 35 children taken to the dentist. It is hoped that when this clinic is over, the work that has been started will be continued by those families who are able to do so.

A Speech Therapy Clinic was available this year to all who needed this type of help, but there were none in Kingston taking advantage of it.

I would like to thank all the people and groups who have helped with their services and financial aid.
