

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Meredith qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the eleventh day of March, 1930, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, two Auditors, Collector of Taxes, Police Officer, Traffic Officer, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for two years, two Library Trustees for three years, and Prosecuting Agent.

2. To choose all other necessary town officers.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges and specify how the same shall be laid out.

4. To see what sums of money the town will raise toward the maintenance of highways under state aid.

5. To see what sums of money the town will raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid, or set aside a permanent improvement fund of \$1,917.75.

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7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 toward the completion of the Meredith-New Hampton road, so called.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to build a cement sidewalk on the northerly side of Winnipesaukee Street. (By petition.)

9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for sidewalks.

10. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town charges.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward eradicating the White Pine Blister Rust, the State Forester requesting the sum of \$400.00.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray the expenses of Memorial Day, and specify how the same shall be expended.

13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise toward defraying the expenses of the Town Library.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the support of Firemen, and the protection of property in Meredith Village Fire District.

15. To see how much money the town will vote to raise toward the support of the District Nurse.

16. To see what action the town will take toward completing the Park on Winnipesaukee Street.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for the benefit of the Laconia Hospital. (By request.)

18. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day observance.

19. To see what sum of money the town will raise for permanent improvement on the Meredith Neck road.

20. To see what action will be taken regarding leasing the Town Hall for a term of three years, not to exceed three days per week, allowing lessee adequate business future to assure an investment in Talking Picture device. (By request.)

21. To see what action will be taken regarding fixing up and improving interior and exterior of Town Hall, and installing heating plant. (By request.)

22. To see what action the town will take relative to renting or leasing the Town Hall.

And to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Ten patients were taken to Laconia Hospital.

Meredith has had an epidemic of scarlet fever and whooping cough which was well cleared up by the end of December.

Two health talks have been given to the lower grades and a talk on preventing the spreading of contagious disease, to the High School.

A health program was given during chapel exercises May 1, the first part being a Health Play, presented by members of the 7th grade. This was followed by two reels of moving pictures that brought out clearly the great importance of proper diet and posture for growing children.

September 3rd a Child Health Conference was held at the Grange Hall. Thirteen children were weighed,

measured, and given a complete physical examination by Dr. Harmon. Four of the children were physically perfect. The Conference was sponsored by the District Nursing Association, Rotary Club, the Woman's Progress Club, Winnipesaukee Grange, and the local Board of Health. The District Nurse was assisted by Miss Marion Garland of Laconia. Miss Jennings, the field nurse of the state district was in charge of the Conference.

A short talk on first aid and demonstrations in bandaging was given at a Woman's Club meeting.

During the last part of September all school children were weighed and measured and a full physical examination was given by Dr. Harmon.

Miss Garland and the District Nurse visited the homes of all who were 10 percent or more underweight, and advised the parents to send the underweight children to the Tuberculosis and Underweight Clinic to be held at the Lang street school, October 25. At this clinic, Dr. Kerr examined 25 and found three in need of further attention. Miss Cameron made her visits at Meredith.

Three school children have been to Laconia Hospital to have tonsils and adenoids removed.

The underweight children at school are given a pint of milk a day. The following defects have been found:

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Meredith:

The following comparisons and tables are strong evidence that your schools were successful in 1928-29.

The schools were in session more half days, the percentage of attendance was higher, and the costs were lower than the average for the state.

The pupils were happy and contented in the schools. The teachers were well qualified and enthusiastic in their work. Parents and citizens in general were cordially cooperative.

We try to give the pupils some of the worthwhile discoveries of the past, to put them in step with present progress and give them some tools with which to attact the problem of the future.

Thus stated the matter seems simple, but the content and method of procedure in each of the items are full of debatable questions.

This we do know, indifference at home or hasty criticism of teachers or schools in the presence of pupils are very harmful.

Parents, who strongly and steadily support the school authorities until a full investigation proves them wrong will not only increase their own peace of mind, but add much to the general effectiveness of the schools.

HEADMASTER'S REPORT

Meredith, N. H., Feb. 27, 1930

To the Board of Education and Citizens of Meredith:

In its general nature and make-up a semi-statistical report of this kind can vary little from year to year. The figures and data vary it is true, and in their field they tell their own story of progress or the lack of it. There is much, however, that an inventory of the physical values cannot show. Education to discharge wisely the duties of life: education that actively regards the seven cardinal principles of Secondary Education-worthy use of leisure time, good health, the command of the fundamental processes, the ability to succeed in a vocation, worthy home membership, good citizenship, and high ethical character: the success of obtaining these objectives cannot be gleaned from statistical tables nor words of description. That the year of 1929 has seen Meredith High School march forward in this particular is our sincere belief.

As to the other, the following paragraphs tell their own story, and we trust that in the sum and total of it you will see in this also substantial progress.

Registration of Pupils

The total registration of pupils at this date is 157. This is identical with that of last year, but a decrease of nine from that of two years ago.

Approval and Certificate Privilege

Meredith High School has full state approval and has the certificate privilege of the New England Entrance Certificate Board. This allows graduates to enter the majority of the New England Colleges and Universities upon a certificate by the Headmaster and without an entrance examination.

Changes in the Curriculum

Two changes have been adopted in the curriculum. French has been made optional and not compulsory in the Domestic Science Course and in the General Course. Plans have been made to introduce a course of Biology for the first time in 1930-31.

At the business session of the Alumni Meeting it was voted to have this cup awarded at the Annual Alumni Meeting instead of at the commencement exercises as has been done up to the present time.

Miscellaneous

The Domestic Arts Department is serving hot lunches during the noon hour for the sixth consecutive winter.

The list of active school organizations is similar to that of last year and includes the Athletic Association, Boys' and Girls' Basketball Teams, Baseball Team, the Student Council and The Pinnacle. A yearly calendar of activities by these organizations was arranged last September for the entire year. For the sixth year the Athletic Association is sponsering an Entertainment Course of five numbers.

In order that each of the eight periods may be the standard period of 40 minutes the school day has been lengthened 15 minutes. Because of this the afternoon session closes at 4:00 o'clock instead of 3:45.

The 20 minute organization period, which in previous years has come the first thing in the morning, now comes the last thing in the forenoon session. Part of these periods are used for an open forum discussion on subjects of close interest to the student body.

The weekly school assembly period comes every Wednesday afternoon from 3:20 to 4:00 at the Town Hall. The public is cordially invited to attend these programs.

For the first time Meredith High School has had cadet teachers from the University of New Hampshire assisting the regular teaching staff. Under the immediate direction and supervision of our own teachers these cadets have taken charge of four classes in history. In this capacity, Mr. Lloyd Dunlap was here for the fall term, and Mr. George H. Dawson for the winter term. This cooperation between our school and the University has proven both pleasant and advantageous for all concerned.

A comparatively large number of pupils has left school duties during the first half of the current year. A careful investigation and check of the causes has led to the conclusion that the great majority of the reasons are economic in character and beyond the control of the school. Through the interest and generosity of one of Meredith's citizens a public speaking contest will be held the latter part of March, 1930. A preliminary contest in which every pupil in school took part has been held, and as a result two representatives from each of the six classes have been selected for the final contest.

In the 1928-29 secondary report issued by the State Board of Education, Meredith High School is commended for a high standing in the following administrating details:

- 1. For a high percentage of attendance
- 2. For a low percentage of tardiness
- 3. For complete records and reports of class room work.
- 4. For detailed reports of the extra curriculum activities.

In conclusion we wish to emphasize a self-evident fact that a school is composed of three fundamental groups: the student body, the teaching staff, and the school officials. These three units are in turn influenced by other groups: the parents, the alumni, and the citizens of the community. The progress and success of a school is found in the ability and kind of cooperation that these various factors contribute.
