

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Piermont in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Piermont on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing,
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To raise and appropriate money to maintain highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise and appropriate money to maintain trun't line with state aid.
- 5. To raise and appropriate money for state road other than trunk line.
- 6. To raise and appropriate money to construct state road with state aid.
- 7. To raise and appropriate money for the support of library.
- 8. To raise and appropriate money for observance of Memorial day.
- 9. To see what action the town will take to raise and appropriate money to pay the cost of rapairing the pier under the Connecticut river bridge.
- 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate money for white pine blister control.
- 11. To see if the town will take any action to close up the road leading from river road at a point between Harry W. Swain's barn and house to the trunk line opposite north west corner of Dana Fadden's farm.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting,

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Board and Citizens of Piermont:

The general aim of Education is to train all children in those qualities of life and character which will make them good and efficient citizens in the community, state and nation.

The specific aims are, to develop in the child:

1, Ability to earn his own living.

2. Willingness to contribute to the welfare of others.

A knowledge of how to use his leisure.

4. A knowledge of how to care for his health. All the efforts put forth by those concerned must be directed toward these ends. The school that does not, in some way, approximate toward a realization of these aims, is not properly functioning as a school at the present time

During the present school year, schools have been in session in five different buildings: Village, Brook Road, Clay Hollow, Rodimon, and at No. 1. Of the six teachers, one is teaching in Piermont for the first time, The new teacher is Miss Sylvia Mullayey at Brook Road.

There were 88 different pupils enrolled during the past school year. The attendance averaged 91.6 per cent of the membership. This is an improvement over the previous year, but is below the average for the state for this period. The average for the state was 93.6. Three of the six schools had an attendance record equal to or better than the state average.

An attendance contest has been conducted this year, Each contest lasts for four weeks and thus making nine for the year. An Honor Banner is hung on the walls of the winning school. The children have shown much interest in the contest and improved school attendance has been the result.

A revised calendar has been adopted by the School Board for the year 1924-1925. This calendar will save three or four days lost because of holidays, and consequently gives that many more days of school without any additional expense. It also provides more frequent, but not too long vacations allowing a week at Thanksgiving, two weeks at Christmas and a week of vacation after every seven weeks of school for the remainder of the year.

The medical inspection and follow up work is again being done by Miss Underhill, the district nurse. Good results are being obtained from this work. We hope that a dental clinic can be held in Piermont before the

end of this school year.

The table which follows and the attendance records

are for the school year ending June 1924.

For the teachers and the School Board and myself as well. we express the common desire that a larger number of parents and friends visit the schools. If parents will come to see their children at work. What they are doing, and what they are given to do with and how their work is directed, it will give them first hand information concerning our schools.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation of the courtesy and cooperation, of the School Board, the

teachers and the community.
