You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the 10th day of March, 1959, at one o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To choose one or more Auditors and such other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school District Officials and Agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund and other state sources together with other income; the School board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.
- 8. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or United States.

- 9. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate Fift, Dollars (\$50.) to be used for the purchase of special equipment for Science and Math on a dollar-for-dollar matching basis with funds to be received from the Federal Government.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Citizens of Springfield:

I submit herewith the ε nnual report of the Superintendent of Schools.

ENROLLMENT

The enrollment as of January 1, 1959 was 51, divided as follows: Primary Room (Grade 1-4) 21; Upper Room (Grades 5-7) 30.

Mrs. Marian Heath is again teaching in Grades 1-4 and Mrs. Edith Fowle, a teacher with several years experience is teaching in Grades 5-7. Students in Grade 8 are attending school in New London. They have made a good adjustment to a departmentalized school. This year should prove very beneficial to them as a preparation for their work in high school.

I am pleased to report that the Springfield teachers are doing very satisfactory work and that the pupils are making good progress scholastically.

IMPROVEMENTS

Coat rooms and toilet rooms were painted. New window shades were purchased and the drive was given a sealing coat of tar. Cold patch was applied to several areas near the building in addition to some grading in the front and rear of the building.

HIGH SCHOOL TUITION

The major increase in the School Budget each year is likely to be in the item of High School Tuition. This amount is governed by the number of Springfield students attending high school and the charge per-pupil. The rate at New London and Sunapee High Schools for the last several years is as follows:

1956-57—\$300.00 per student 1957-58—\$325.00 per student 1958-59—\$367.00 per student 1959-60—\$388.00 per student

The charges for this year and next are based on the State Average Cost for High School. A District receiving tuition students cannot charge a sending District more than this amount—without a contract. The actual per-pupil cost in both schools is considerably more than the State Average figure for next year—(\$388.). Therefore, Springfield is being charged the amount these

Towns are legally ably to collect—which is less than their own per-pupil costs.

NATIONAL DEFENSE EDUCATION ACT OF 1958

Until Title III of the above Act, funds will be available on a matching basis ior the purchase of special equipment for science and mathematics. An article in the Warrant calls for the raising of a small amount to take advantage of this dollar-for-dollar matching of Federal Funds.

The needs of our time dictate that children be introduced to the ideas of science and the scientific method at an early age.

CO-OPERATIVE HIGH SCHOOL STUDY

Members of the Springfield School Board and other interested citizens have continued to participate in the study of a Co-operative High School for this area.

Since Springfield has no high school and now sends its students to other towns, the major advantage for this Town would seem to be an equity in a high school unit—and therefore an assurance that there will be a high school for Springfield students to attend in future years—plus some representation on the Co-Op School Board (each town by law is guaranteed one member on the Board). Cost estimates indicate that there should be no sizeable increase in dollars over what is now being spent on high school tuition—with a good possibility that the cost could be less than if students were sent on a straight tuition basis.

On December 6, 1958, at a Special School District Meeting, a small number of citizens voted unanimously to petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a Co-op District for Grads 9-12 provided Sunapee, New London and Andover did the same. Definite action on this proposal will be taken by all the interested Towns within the next several months.

In conclusion, I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation of the School Board, school staf $\hat{\cdot}_0$ and citizens during the past year.

REPORT OF HELPING TEACHER

Now in the fifth year of providing services throughout the five towns of this supervisory union, I wish to express my deep appreciation to all the schools and communities served for the coperation and enouragement extended to me toward the fullfillment of the objectives and responsibilities outlined below:

OBJECTIVES—Directed by the Superintendent of schools and as established by law, the work of Helping Teacher has continued toward giving assistance to teachers and pupils of Springfield, and acting as consultant, aiming toward (1) improving the educational growth and development of children; (2) solving problems of pupil retardation and maladjustment; and (3) bringing resources and special material to the classroom.

The following are some of services and responsibilities I have been happy to share:

- 1. REPORTING PUPIL PROGRESS—The revision of the report cards for both primary and upper grades has made a more practical and positive way of reporting progress in scholarship and citizenship.
- 2. TESTING PROGRAM—As in other years, this program includes the achievement tests in grades 1-7; mental ability tests in grades 1, 4, & 7; and individual or small group tests as needs arise. These tests are of value in grouping of youngsters according to needs, and provide valuable information for parent-teacher conferences.
- 3. CLASSROOM VISITS—These visits make it possible to share the physical, emotional, and educational atmosphere of the classroom. Whenever necessary, follow-up conferences with teachers are held to exchange ideas, determine pupil needs, and promote instructional improvement.
- 4. RESOURCES & MATERIALS—As an outgrowth of conferences with teachers, special aids, including books, references, filmstrips, and other educational materials are provided. This year a more complete record of pupils is being kept in individual guidance folders, as is being done in all other schools of this supervisory union.

I am happy to work with the Springfield teachers and feel that they are doing an excellent job in meeting the needs of the pupils. With several grades in a room, there is bound to be a wide range of individual differences within each grade. The teachers are to be commended for their constant efforts in meeting these varied needs, and in their devotion toward meeting the curriculum requirements of each grade.
