#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Municipal Court Expenses.
  - (e) Town Hall and other Bldgs.
  - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.(g) Health Department.

  - (h) Town Dump.
  - (i) Vital Statistics.
  - (i) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (k) Interest on Temporary loans.
  - (1) Interest on bonds.
  - (m) County Tax.
  - (n) Payment on bonds.
  - (o) Civil Defense.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.

- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise one thousand three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$1,375.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town road maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Judge's salary of the Municipal Court of Stewartstown, and make appropriation for the same.
- 11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the West Stewartstown Fire Precinct and make appropriation for the same.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the old south hill road leading from the cedar brook school to the Benjamin Danforth place.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the deadwater road leading from the bare rock road to the end of the town road.
- 14. To nominate and elect two members to serve three years on the Municipal Budget Committee.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.

To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen 16. to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-partisan ballot.

To choose by Non-partisan ballot the following Town Officers:

- (a) Town Clerk.
- (b) Selectmen for the three years ensuing.
- (c) Town Treasurer.
- (d) Three Road Agents.
- (e) One or more Auditors.
- (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
- (g) One or more Sextons.(h) Overseer of poor.
- (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
- (j) One library trustee for three ensuing.

To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Stewartstown qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 6th day of March, 1954, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see whether the district will vote to transport high school pupils and to see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for same.
- 10. To see if the district will adopt the provisions of the Non-Partisan Ballot System for School Districts in accordance with Revised Laws, Chapter 34, as inserted by Chapter 22, Sections 112-122, Laws 1943, for the election of district officers beginning with the annual meeting of 1955.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown:

## Foreword

In all probably we are hearing more criticisms today of what our schools are or are not doing than has been heard for a long time. Of grave concern to many parents, educators, and laymen is what they believe to be the failure of the public schools in such responsibilities as teaching the three R's, maintaining discipline, and in using meaningful report cards. For the most part the attention in these criticisms seems to be focused upon the immediate situation, rather than upon the overall long range product of our schools, namely, how well these same pupils, who apparently are believed to be missing so much, fit into our rapid moving society at a later date when they become adults. Undoubtedly, a number of cases can be readily pointed out in most communities where the attainments are not particularly outstanding. The crux of the matter, however, seems to lie in the answer to the question of whether the failure of the individual to have made more of himself is due to his not having received sufficient drill work and his not being disciplined while in school or is it due perhaps, also, to influences received in the home and community during these important formative years.

Whatever may be our convictions about this very difficult and yet vitally important question, all of us - school people, parents, and laymen, for we are all in this work together of educating our children — may well take seriously the criticisms being made of our present day educational programs. Certainly, if we are to go along with the generally accepted adage, and observance of actions seems to indicate that we should, -- that everything which goes into the mind comes out in life some way, some time, somewhere — in other words, the conscious mind of today is the subconscious mind of tomorrow - then we might well carefully examine the subject matter, and the procedure used in teaching it, in our schools with the primary purpose of doing everything possible to make the content and method most helpful and meaningful to the boys and girls in later years as well as in the immediate present.

### Teachers

Two new teachers have joined the teaching corps this year. Alma B. Chappell, a veteran teacher who received her training at Plymouth Teacher's College, is teaching Grades 1-4 at the Hollow School. Francis F. Murphy, a graduate of St. Anslem's College in Manchester, teaches Grades 5-8 at the Cedar Brook School.

The School District is unusually fortunate, when there is every indication that the continued acute teacher shortage of our entire country is growing worse instead of better, to have all of our veteran teachers return to work with us again this year at the West Stewartstown School. Principal Velma H. Gray teaches 6-8; Junie S. Aldrich teaches 3-5; and Cleora M. Richardson teaches Grades 1-2.

#### School Nurse - Health

With the purchase of a new Maico Audiometer by the supervisory union, it is now possible for Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, our school nurse, to test hearing at any time and to conduct follow-up work when necessary. The addition of this valuable machine, to that of the Massachusetts Eye Testing Equipment already in hand, provides greater opportunity to help pupils more efficiently maintain that good health so essential to a happy and successful overall school life.

Much important work is done, too, at Dr. Hammond F. Dickson's Dental Clinic, held once a week throughout the school year, for many pupils who would find it otherwise difficult to receive needed dental care. A pre-school clinic conducted in the spring, also, makes it possible to determine the general health status of children planning to enter the First Grade the following fall in time to receive medical attention, when needed before the opening of school.

#### Notes on the Budget

The School Board's Budget for 1954-55 is \$36,824.00 in comparison to the \$37,559.00 raised and appropriated by the district to operate the schools this year. This amount is reduced by an estimated income of \$4,700.00, which leaves a balance of \$32,124.00 to be raised by taxes by the town as compared to \$32,559.00 for this year. In spite of provision in the budget for increases in some instances, decreases made in others have made it possible to submit a somewhat smaller budget than that of last year. A breakdown of the budget in detail is printed on subsequent pages in this report.

# Buildings - Playgrounds - Equipment ·

In recognition of the importance of providing adequate facilities that the teaching and learning activities in our schools may be as effective as possible, considerable repair and maintenance work has been done during the past summer. The appearance of the West Stewartstown School Building was improved greatly by painting its exterior. The interior decorating, which was begun several years ago, was completed, also, with the painting of the front halls and stairwells. Other work at this building included the installation of a sink on the second floor for use in preparing paints and washing in the Art Classes, and replacement of the stack pipe between the boiler and chimney.

As a result of extensive repairs the Hollow School is now in excellent condition. The clapboards on the west gable end were replaced with new ones from the eaves to the ground, and the building was made very much more attractive by painting it externally. The classroom was made much lighter by applying a coat of flat white paint to the ceiling, and more comfortable by insulating the walls on the north and west sides with celotex board. Since the Cedar Brook School has received constant attention during the past few years, repair work there was confined to installing a new outside door and the replacement of the woodshed floor with new boarding.

With the completion of the fencing of the playground at the Hollow School, all three of the district's schools now have areas where the children can play free from traffic hazards. This means much from the standpoint of safety, organization and supervision.

For the most part such items of equipment as have been purchased during the past year have been small. It might be mentioned, however, that the purchase of a liquid duplicator for use at the West Stewartstown School has helped materially in preparing school work when several copies are needed.

#### **Enrollment and Attendance**

For the first time in four years the number of pupils enrolled in our schools shows an increase over the previous year, as we now have 110 pupils in contrast to 97 a year ago. A breakdown of this enrollment shows that there are 64 at the West Stewartstown School, 27 at the Hollow School and 19 at the Cedar Brook School. The average percentage of attendance at these schools during the past year in the same order as listed was 97.44, 92.19, and 93.86 while the average number of tardinesses per pupil for the same period was .52, .00, and .30.

#### **Tuition Pupils**

In contrast to the increase in the enrollment of pupils within the district this year, the number enrolled in schools outside is the smallest that it has been for four years. A count of these pupils at the time of this writing shows a total of 38 whereas last year at this time there were 42. Of this number 17 are at Colebrook Academy, 19 at Canaan High School, and one at the Austine School. In addition to these secondary pupils, one elementary pupil is attending the Kidderville School in Colebrook.

A total of 6 tuition pupils are enrolled in the West Stewartstown School from the Pittsburg School District.

#### Conclusion

As I have said several times previously, I wish to thank the members of the School Board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help and cooperation received in our work together to provide good schools. It is only with the assistance of you all that high standards can be achieved and maintained.
