To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Strafford Elementary School in said Strafford on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at two of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

PLEASE NOTE: Articles 2-21 will be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare including Old Age Assistance and Soldiers Aid.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 and the State will allocate \$4,000.0 for Class II construction on Strafford-Dover Road. This amount is Town's share to complete the contract that was awarded last Fall.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 and the State will allocate \$9,000.00 for Class II construction on Strafford-Dover Road.

- 7. To see if the Town will accept Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$915.76 and the State will contribute \$6,105.08.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise the hourly rate of pay for highway workers to \$1.50 per hour.
- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$760.00 for the purchase of a rock rake for use in the highway department.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to start replacement of snow fence.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take to make a better approach from Second Crown Point Road to 202A and raise and appropriate any money for same.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money to buy some new fire hose.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$140.94 for the Lakes Region Association.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for observance of Memorial Day.
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the control of the white pine blister disease.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Civilian Defense.
- 17. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for street lighting.

- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 toward the expense of re-appraisal of the Town.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to pay to Austin-Cate Academy the \$4,000.00 Rev. Daniel Austin Legacy to Austin Academy, which was accepted by the Town March 11, 1884 to be held in trust for benefit of said institution, and if so voted, raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00. (This article requested by Trustees of Austin-Cate Academy)
- 20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 21. To see if the Town will grant any discount on property taxes paid in full within thirty days of date of issue of tax collector's warrant.

REPORT OF ROAD AGENT

I would like to take this opportunity to acquaint all the citizens of Strafford with problems of maintaining the roads of the town and give them some idea of where the money goes. Our roads fall into five different classes, first black roads, town owned and State Aid, dirt roads, well traveled, little used but necessary to maintain, and last the almost impassable but still town roads. We have approximately 50 miles of road.

The town black roads were all badly in need of resurfacing. It look a great deal of cold patch and hot top to get them ready for tar. All black roads in Bow Lake and on Parker Mountain have been resurfaced. Mr. Storer had donated \$400—toward the cost of resurfacing the Parker Mt. roads. In all eight miles of black road were resurfaced this year. This work used a great deal of our budget but it had to be done or we would have had no black roads. We hope to resurface the crown point roads this year and then all black roads will have been resurfaced. A program should be set up so that one third of the roads are resurfaced each year.

The state aid roads require winter maintenance only. The state maintains them from April 1st until Nov. 1st. They are the towns responsibility the rest of the year. This year with the opportunity to obtain bulk salt from Portsmouth we have resorted to the use of salt on the black roads during storms. The large number of ice storms will make our salt bill higher than normal but I don't know what we would have done without it.

Some of our much traveled dirt roads are in good shape and need only periodic grading, others need a great deal of work. I recommend that a program be started to repair these roads out of the road appropriations. One of the biggest problems is the large amount of ledge and large stones on the sides that prevent the water from running in the ditches and make snow plowing very difficult. I also recommend the use of reclaimed oil on the steep hills be tried, it has proven very successful in other towns and in the one case where it was used at a taxpayer's expense, in this town. I would also recommend that the town purchase a rock rake to be used with the grader. This will make a better road surface, speed grading and eliminate the tiresome work of picking rocks by hand.

A program should also be set up to spend a small sum each year on the little roads to keep them safe and passable. The

almost impassable should be made passable for forest fire prevention if for no other reason. We should not think of closing roads except where the cost to make them passable is prohibitive then they should be closed as the town is liable or post same as passable at your own risk. Town Road Aid is based on road mileage in the town and any deduction in mileage could result in decreased state funds.

The snow fence used in this town is almost useless and the cost of putting it up runs much higher than is should as nearly every piece has to be repaired which is almost an impossible task as the wire is all rusted and breaks just by handling it. Snow fence is of vital importance in this town and saves a great deal of money on plowing therefore I believe we should start a program where we spend a sum each year to replace all the fence.

Bridges are a very vital subject. None of the bridges on the dirt roads are in top shape and all need some work, some minor repairs, some major. I recommend the use of steel beams and treated oak plank. The initial cost is more but over the years it is much cheaper.

I realize it very difficult for the people who live on state roads to realize the many problems involved in town roads. With the increased number of autos each year, the school buses carrying our children it is very necessary to keep the roads as free of ice as possible and keep the dirt roads well sanded and all roads plowed. This costs money and Strafford is no different than any other town; it is a problem as to how far we can go with this work. In the summer we have a large number of summer people who pay taxes and have no say in how their money is spent so we have a moral obligation to them. They expect reasonably good roads and it is to the town's advantage to see that they get them. The problem is great and it is up to the taxpayers to decide how far they want to go.

I would also recommend a raise in wages paid to help on the roads. It is getting very difficult to hire men for part time work at the present rate.

I would like to thank the townspeople for their patience and help, also the slectmen for their splendid cooporation and Roland Brown for the inconvience I have caused him.

There was only one change in teacher personnel in September. Mrs. Edna Young replaced Mrs. Sarah Huckins in grades 3 and 4.

Your school continues to enjoy the enrichment of the educational program in science, social studies and music provided by WWNH-TV, channel 11. The addition of a permanent antenna has resulted in excellent reception.

The financial assistance given by the Strafford PTA has made it possible to purchase a Bell & Howell 16 mm projector which will have a multitude of uses. It can be used to supplement the existing curriculum, for assemblies and for general entertainment. This audio-visual aid is indeed an asset.

The Sen-Bow-La, Inc. has made it possible for the school to provide library facilities in the school. With the \$600 donated for this purpose, approximately 300 volumes, bookcases and reference materials are now available. Cen-Bow-La, Inc. a 4-H organization, also donated a national and state flag to the school.

To round out your educational program, your school board has provided physical education for two periods per week under the direction of Mr. William Lynbourg. These periods alternate with art instruction under the direction of Mrs. Louise Williams. I believe that the Strafford School provides one of the best educational programs in the state for a school of its size.

This year in addition to the complete testing program in general achievement and intelligence, the pupils in Mrs. Scribner's

room had a Kuder Preference Test. This test indicates the areas of interest that the pupils may have and has an inventory of ten interest areas.

Under the direction of Mrs. Thelma Caverly, there is a wholesome lunch program which is a joy to observe. The community is fortunate to have some one who can so efficiently manage this program.

In conclusion, I should like to express the appreciation of myself and the school board to all of the organizations for contributing money and time to provide the program that you have. I should like also to express my appreciation for the cooperation given me during the year as your Superintendent of Schools by the citizens, school board, teachers, and pupils of Strafford.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To Mr. Martineau, Superintendent of Schools, the School Board and the citizens of Strafford:

It gives me pleasure to present the following report of the health program at the Strafford School during the past year.

We have been fortunate in having no serious illnesses, although an outbreak of measles in 1961 rather depopulated the school for a brief time. It is gratifying to again say that the parents have been most cooperative in having treatment for cases of defective vision, dental care done, an dcases of enlarged tonsils checked by their family physicians.

As occasionally a misunderstanding may exist, especially with parents who have moved from other parts of the country, I should like to point out that according to the regulations of the State Board of Education, a school nurse is only permitted to give first aid care. We are not allowed to give internal medication to any pupil unless it is by order of the family physician.

In May there was successful Pre-school clinic with 10 children attending, the smallest in the last few years, due to a smaller first grade than usual.

The following is a brief summary of the health program: Vision Tests, 84; Hearing Tests, 2; Height and Weight, 92; Teeth and Tonsils, 92.

Of four cases of serious vision defect, all have been treated by a doctor. One child who was previously under the Sight Conservation program was re-checked and found to be somewhat improved. In 10 cases of severe dental cavities nearly all have had or will have dental care. There were 9 home visits. These do not include taking home a child with a minor upset.

May I extend my thanks to Mr. Martineau, the School Board,

all the teachers, and the parents for their cooperation.
