#### TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- (L.S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity in the County of Sullivan qualified to vote in town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Unity on Tuesday, the tenth day of March at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects for the ensuing year:
  - 1. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear the reports of the selectmen and other town officers and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 3. To choose a member of the Board of Selectmen for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.
  - 5. To choose a library trustee for the ensuing three years.
- 6. To choose all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay librarians' salaries and library tax.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay old age assistance and town poor charges.
- 9. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to pay other town charges.
- 10. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to raise to pay the just debts of the town.
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highways and bridges including snow removal and determine the price to pay for labor and trucks.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for construction of Class II roads known as Second New Hampshire turnpike and raise and appropriate the sum of \$478.50 for said purposes the State will allot \$2,500.00.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 for fire fighting equipment.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,246.00 to pay County Farm snow bill.
- 16. To vote by ballot to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by town through tax collector's deeds.
- 17. To see if the town will vote a discount on taxes paid on or before June 1st and September 1st, 1942.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to accept a Right of Way leading from the East Unity to Unity Center highway to the home of Orrin C. Barton, the said Right of Way to become a pay the just debts of the town.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
