3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange, Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce and all church organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise until rescinded.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$421.43 for the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of Advertising.

7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken at the March Town Meeting, 1961, adopting a non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting in 1963. (By Petition)

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for Band Concerts. (By Petition)

9. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen permission to take down the so called Old Brown Company Office Building and salvage all materials available.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$4500 for the purchase of a tractor and plow for sidewalk use. This amount to be amortized over a period of three years.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds and Cemetery Association.

Financial Statements

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1960-
December 31, 1961: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1960 and December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$5,073.30, from \$9,909.67 to \$14,982.97, in 1961. Inasmuch as there were no outstanding long term notes or bonds and consequently all of the liabilities were current ac-

counts, the Balance Sheet Surplus of \$14,982.97 also represented the Current Surplus of the Town.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$2,461.72, plus a

net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$2,285.57, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,747.29.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1961 is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

General Comments

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Year 1961

On September first Dr. Robert Christie of Lancaster, N. H., became Pathologist and Supervisor of our clinical laboratory. Our Medical Staff is of the opinion that this arrangement will make for better coverage because of Dr. Christie's proximity.

Several new instruments have been added to aid in our operating room procedures, including more cystoscopic instruments to widen the diagnostic facilities in that field.

We have recently purchased a Fluotec anesthesia valve for the administration of Fluothane, a new and safer anesthetic. This will be administered by Dr. Carl Yunghans who has had special training for its use.

The ladies of our Hospital Auxiliary have carried out their plans for a nurses' room which is completed and in use. We are very grateful for their continued support and their assistance when a helping hand is needed.

I wish to thank Mrs. Morrison for the gift of a Hi-Low bed and overbed table which we have placed in Room 12, and for her continued support and encouragement throughout the year.

Our office staff has adopted a new accounts receivable system, approved by the Blue Cross, and, in conjunction with this, has adopted the Uniform Accounting System for hospitals as of June 1, 1961.

My appreciation goes to all individuals, organizations and hotels which, in any way, have helped support our hospital.

I wish to thank the doctors, townspeople and hospital personnel for their support and cooperation during the year.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Morrison Hospital for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, which was made by this Division in accordance with your request. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Hospital Trustees and Hospital Office Staff. Cancelled checks, supporting vouchers and invoices were compared with entries in the books of record. Totals of receipts and expenditures were verified and all balances shown were reconciled to statements from the depository banks. Receipts were traced to sources insofar as possible and individual receipts were spot-checked against entries on duplicate deposit receipts.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Accounts Receivable:

It is noted that as of December 31, 1961, the accounts receivable amounted in total to \$66,862.15. This represents 67% of the total amount charged to patients during the year of \$99,675.80.

It is again recommended, therefore, that serious consideration be given to the improvement of collection

procedures. An examination of the individual accounts revealed that some go back into the 1950's and 1940's, which would indicate that many of them are of very doubtful value.

It is also again recommended that the Trustees and office staff go over these individual accounts receivable and write off those that are uncollectible and take measures to enforce collection of those which may still be collectible. Inclusion of such doubtful accounts in the balance sheet of the hospital distorts the financial picture of the Net Worth.

Land, Building and Equipment:

These accounts have been segregated in a "Plant Fund" and it is our understanding that appraisals of their present values are being obtained.

Inventories:

Physical inventories are now being taken and entered on the books. When book figures are adjusted to actual inventories, the charge or credit should be to the appropriate expense accounts.

Accounts Payable:

It is noted that as of December 31, 1961, the hospital owed \$19,521.32 of current accounts payable which date back many months, whereas the general fund checking account had a balance of only \$234.56. In January 1962, the Mink fund savings account was closed out and the balance transferred to a checking account to pay some of these overdue accounts.

Statement of Operations:

The Statement of Operations, Exhibit B, shows a net operating loss for the year of \$6,404.80. The figures in this statement are on an accrual basis; i.e. charges to patients are as billed rather than as collected, yet no provision is made for uncollectible accounts which would increase the loss shown.

The hospital is very fortunate in receiving substantial bequests and gifts which offset the operating loss.

Per Capita Patient Costs:

A condensed comparative statement of per capita patient costs is contained in Exhibit F. As shown therein, the average patient-day charge was \$15.09 in 1960 and \$18.68 in 1961. Average patient-day expenses were \$18.70 in 1960 and \$19.93 in 1961, resulting in net operating losses in the two years of \$3.61 and \$1.25, respectively. Other income of \$3.21 and \$2.98, respectively, resulted in a net loss of \$0.40 in 1960, and a net gain of \$1.73 per patient day in 1961.

Charges to Patients:

As shown by the Statement of Operations, Exhibit B, charges to patients, even if collected in full, do not meet operating expenses of the hospital. As a matter of fact while revenue from net charges to patients in 1961 is indicated as \$95,661.13, actual cash collections on account of current charges and old accounts receivable amounted to approximately only \$78,000.00.

Conclusion:

In view of the existing situation, it is our opinion that improvement in the financial condition of the hospital can be brought about by the adoption of the following policies:

- (1) Improvement of collection procedures.
- (2) Review of the existing rate structures with the possibility of an increase to more nearly balance income with expenses.

Failure to take such action will undoubtedly necessitate an increase in the Town subsidy to the hospital.

We extend our thanks to the officials and staff of the Morrison Hospital for their assistance during the course of the audit.

Program of the White Mountains Region Association

The White Mountains Region Association as a voluntary non-profit organization, receives support from the communities of the Region, the state and from individual members so that a program of cooperative promotion and development of northern New Hampshire may be carried on.

The Association publishes and distributes six different folders a year advertising the many advantages of the Region. It receives and carefully answers about 6,000 letters per year from people interested in a vacation in the North Country. The value of this single service cannot be over-emphasized. Recent surveys have shown that the tourists attracted by this mailing service have spent many hundreds of thousands of dollars in the Region. The Association sponsors the annual fall foliage tours, and represents the Region at national travel shows.

Through its board of directors, it is able to speak for the Region's needs at state and national hearings and at important meetings within the Region. It maintains a news release service to local newspapers to help inform the citizens of the North Country of worth-while activities and economic trends.

This winter the Association is running a cooperative ad program with the chambers of commerce in the ski areas to promote skiing in the White Mountains. It cooperates with private promotional groups, local chambers of commerce, and with the state promotional agencies. It promotes the sale of real estate through the mailing of real-estate purchase bulletins to real estate brokers. It conducts labor surveys for groups interested in industrial development, maintains an award program for the 4-H Clubs, and promotes agriculture within the Region.

In uninterrupted service since 1938, it has helped establish the White Mountains Region as a vacation center as fine as any in the world and contributed in many other ways to the economic betterment of all forty-six communities in northern New Hampshire.

AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook—yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness—our carelessness. This, we—you and I— can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations—hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you—

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.
